<u>Description</u>: This course involves the study of certain literary works, vocabulary, critical analysis skills, and writing mechanics.

Grading Policy: Tests and Essays, Major Projects: 50%

Recognize vocabulary words occurring in the literary selections.

Create multi-paragraph analysis essays, and identify and use rhetorical strategies.

Write using proper capitalization, punctuation, and usage.

Write compositions based on literary works read.

Research and write compositions with documented information.


