COMPETENCIES AND INDICATORS

Interpersonal Communication

Communicates in spontaneous spoken, written or signed conversations on both very familiar and everyday topics, using a variety of practiced or memorized words, phrases, simple sentences, and questions.

Interpersonal Speaking (Functions)

Asks and responds in conversation to questions about familiar topics based on their own lives and interests.

Interpersonal Speaking (Accuracy)

Uses target structures and expressions, including grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation, appropriately.

Interpersonal Writing (Functions)

Asks and responds in written exchanges to questions about familiar topics based on their own lives and interests.

Interpersonal Writing (Accuracy)

Uses target structures and expressions, including grammar and vocabulary, appropriately.

Interpretive Communication

Identifies the general topic and basic information in both very familiar and everyday contexts by recognizing practiced or memorized words, phrases, and simple sentences in texts that are spoken, written, or signed.

Interpretive Reading (Functions)

Identifies main ideas, topics, and specific information in a variety of authentic written and signed materials.

Interpretive Listening (Functions)

Identifies main ideas, topics, and specific information in a variety of authentic auditory materials.

Presentational Communication

Presents information on very familiar and everyday topics using a variety of practiced or memorized words, phrases, and simple sentences through spoken, written and signed language.

Presentational Speaking (Functions)

Delivers oral or signed presentations before an audience, in the target language.

Presentational Speaking (Accuracy)

Uses target structures and expressions, including grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation, appropriately.

Presentational Writing (Functions)

Writes narrative and expository/informational compositions in the target language.

Presentational Writing (Accuracy)

Uses target structures and expressions, including grammar and vocabulary, appropriately.

Intercultural Communication

Identifies and explains how practices, products, and perspectives vary across cultures.

Investigate

Identifies and compares products and practices in cultures where the target language is spoken and the culture where the student lives.

Connections & Comparisons

Builds, reinforces, and expands knowledge of other disciplines

Connections

Makes connections between the Classics and other content areas.

Comparisons

Relates the language, culture, and history of the ancient world to the modern world.
