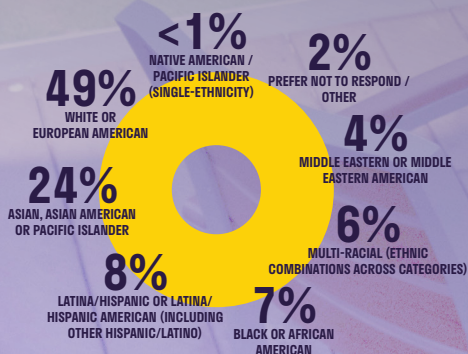

MARLBOROUGH'S SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

HONORS RESEARCH

(HUMANITIES, SCIENCE, SOCIAL SCIENCE)

In collaboration with mentors in the greater Los Angeles area, students engage in cutting-edge research and research methodologies, spending 8-10 hours per week designing and implementing an original research project that culminates with a research paper and campus-wide presentation. This program is by application only.

GLOBAL FUTURES INSTITUTE

In this three-year, application-only diploma program, GFI Scholars dive deep into futures thinking, analyzing possible and preferred tomorrows while developing the skills to anticipate risks; assess threats; and propose thoughtful, ethical paths forward. They're not just learning about the world—they are preparing to reshape it.

FRANK & EILEEN ACCELERATOR PROGRAM FOR THE LEADERS OF TOMORROW

The Accelerator Program prepares the next generation of business leaders to take their ideas to the next level. Students enter with a prototype of their product, connect with industry experts, apply key business concepts—including market analysis—culminating in a business pitch to an audience of professionals and their peers.

CAPSTONE PROGRAM

(ARTS, SOCIAL JUSTICE, ENTREPRENEURSHIP)

This program allows Seniors to choose a field of interest to deepen their knowledge through customized research and hands-on experience. Working independently, students identify an area within their specialized field to explore, engage in creative problem-solving, and develop a final project shaped entirely by their passions.

DEBATE

Marlborough's nationally-recognized Debate Team cultivates students' abilities to think critically, argue rigorously, research thoroughly, and communicate persuasively. Over the past three years, our Debate Team set all-time records in virtually every statistical category, earning 74 bids to the Tournament of Champions, with our Debate Program Head recognized as the National Debate Coaches Association Educator of the Year in 2023.

COMPETITIVE ROBOTICS

The Marlborough Robotics Program empowers students to pursue careers in STEM by engaging them in the FIRST Tech Challenge, where they collaboratively design, fabricate, and program a robot to compete with other teams around the world. Marlborough teams have won numerous awards at the Regional and World Championship levels for their engineering, robot performance, and student-led outreach.
