The Classroom/Lab

Introduction to Public Services has foundational requirements related to basic life support, CPR and first aid trauma skills, basic anatomy and physiology, and airway management. Additionally, students will learn about the Emergency Management System. The student will learn to properly assess the sick and injured related to infectious diseases and trauma. Students will learn practical skills of Basic Life Support (BLS), taking blood pressures, pulses, respiratory rates, lung sounds and the use of various adjuncts to assist in managing a compromised person's airway.
