Minimum Diploma Requirements:

English: 40 credits

Math: 20 credits (including Algebra 1)

Social Studies: 30 credits

Science: 30 credits (1 year of biology, 1 year of Chemistry **or** Physics, 1 year additional Science)

Fine Arts **or** Foreign Language: 10 credits

Physical Education: 20 credits

Electives: 70 credits

10 credits are earned in each class for each year of study; 5 credits for each semester classes. A minimum of 220 credits are necessary for graduation.

College preparatory classes are preceded by a (p), and recognized by both the California State University (CSU) and University of California (UC) systems. All honors courses will be identified by having an AP (Advanced Placement), H (Honors) or ENH (Enhanced) in the course title or preceded by a (+) on the transcript.

Honors courses that receive extra grade point weighting at KHS are as follows:

AP U.S Government & Politics, AP U.S. History, AP World History, AP English Lang., AP English Lit., AP Calculus AB, AP Pre-Calculus, AP Statistics, AP Computer Science A, AP Physics 1, Enhanced Physics, AP, Enhanced Chemistry, AP Biology, AP Spanish Lang., AP French Lang., AP Psychology, AP Drawing, AP Environmental Science.

Determination of GPA and rank: A= 4 B= 3 C=2 D= 1

One extra point is given for A, B or C grades in Advanced Placement/Honors/Enhanced classes when calculating GPA. A student's California State College (CSU) and University of California (UC) GPA consists of college-preparatory classes taken after freshman year. Rank is based on overall GPA, weighted for AP classes, and includes freshman year.
