College Credits

Lancaster City School District is committed to preparing students for the next phase of their lives after high school. Local workforce development and technical training opportunities are widely known by our community, but many are unaware of the pathways available for high school students to earn college credits before graduation.

College Credit Plus (CCP) is a state program that allows students to earn college credit and high school credit simultaneously. The program offers students the opportunity to enroll in rigorous academic classes, take a wide variety of classes and prepare for college. Students can also take several general education courses that colleges require, accelerating their academic journey by starting their major courses earlier or even graduating college a year or semester early.

This program can also help students explore what they want to do in the future. For example, a student may decide to take a class or two at a local college during their intended major field while still in high school. However, after taking that course, they may realize they'd like to find a different path. CCP students can explore a variety of classes and work through what major is right for them in the future without the financial burden that it would take on them if they did that during their traditional college years. The opposite is also true. CCP can help solidify a student's declared major with confidence that it's the right choice for them, while getting a head start on their college classes. All these opportunities come at no cost to the student and the family.

Students face limitations on how many hours they can take each year (30 between college and high school), and an understanding they must pay for a course if they fail or drop it late.

Lancaster High School offers 31 CCP courses in the building from three different colleges—(Hocking College, Central Ohio Technical College, Columbus State Community College). Classes also are offered at Ohio University Lancaster. The in-house CCP classes provide a unique opportunity for students to learn how college classes work as they follow the college syllabus, but in a familiar environment.

In addition to CCP courses, students at Lancaster High School can also take Advanced Placement courses (AP). AP Courses are academically rigorous classes designed to prepare students for college level work. These courses are designed by The College Board and are implemented throughout high schools nationwide. These courses are tied to an AP exam at the end of the school year. AP courses have the potential for college credit based on the score they receive on their AP exam. While ultimately it will be up to the future college that the student attends and what the student's major is, many students receive college credit by earning a 3 or higher on their AP exam. LHS offers six AP classes currently.

Taking advantage of the array of college credit opportunities is beneficial to students and those funding college for those students. Not only can it reduce the cost of college education, but in many cases, students will be able to advance through school more quickly and with a better understanding of what their goals are post-graduation.

Scholarships

Interested in applying for scholarships? In addition to the scholarships available through your high school, The Fairfield County Foundation awards over 500 scholarships annually to Fairfield County students pursuing education after high school. LHS Construction Project:

STEADY PROGRESS TOWARDS AUGUST 2026 OPENING



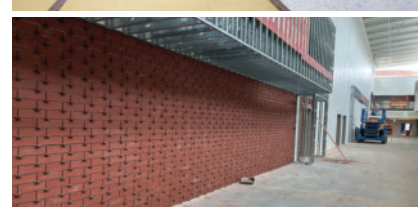
The new Lancaster High School project remains on track for its anticipated opening in August 2026. Despite facing challenging weather conditions earlier in the year, the construction team has maintained a strong pace, ensuring the project continues to move forward efficiently.

KEY DEVELOPMENTS:

- **Exterior Work:** The exterior walls are almost 100% complete, with doors now being installed to secure the building. The South (main) entrance and North (Career Technical) entrance stairways are almost 100% complete as well. Additionally, concrete walkways are being installed around the perimeter and within the open courtyard at the center of the building.
- **Interior Finishing:** Significant strides have been made in interior finishes.
- **Terrazzo flooring** has begun in various first-floor areas, with restrooms nearing completion. Corridor flooring will continue for several months.
- **Casework installation** is ongoing, starting in classroom areas and now extending to Career Technical classrooms and lab spaces.
- **Drywall** is complete in the auditorium, with crown molding and blocking set to follow.
- **In science labs,** casework and fume hood installations are complete, and final painting is being finalized, soon to be followed by marker boards and tack boards.
- **Many classrooms** in the first two academic wings have had their finish paint completed.
- **Infrastructure & Utilities:** A major milestone was achieved earlier this year with the arrival and installation of the main electrical components, allowing for permanent power installations to begin.

SPECIALIZED AREAS:

- **Fiberglass panels (windows)** are being installed along the cafeteria roofline and will soon be completed in the auxiliary gymnasium.
- **In the Career Technical areas,** drywall is being completed, along with the installation of plumbing fixtures such as sinks and eyewash stations.
- **Interior masonry work** has been completed in the locker rooms, restrooms, and mechanical areas on the east side of the building.
- **The project continues to benefit** from the dedicated efforts of Summit Construction and all contractors involved.





Drivers Ed

The Lancaster City School District is enhancing student opportunities with accessible, educator-led driving instruction available to students through Lancaster High School since April of 2024. The instruction is offered at an affordable rate, as well as a reduced rate for students who qualify through the Drive to Succeed Grant.

The Muskingum Ohio Valley Educational Service Center Driving School, (MOV ESC) is redefining the future of driver's education across local Ohio school districts, including Lancaster City Schools. Originating from a lack of available driving instruction courses following the Covid-19 pandemic, the MOV model includes structured and well-administered programming with a strong emphasis on equity and workforce development. This consortium-based approach increases flexibility for participating districts that will better serve students and meet the evolving needs of local communities.

As of early March, LHS had enrolled 158 students in the MOV Driver Ed program with 71 having completed the program and 87 currently enrolled. Of that number, 49 students were awarded scholarships to offset the fees. MOV is a grant-funded program with a small stipend paid by the district for coordination.

Any LHS student who has obtained their driver's permit may now register at the high school for the driver's education course. Registration forms are available in the office and should be completed before requesting to register. Congratulations to our new and well-trained drivers!

LCS Achieves Outstanding Report Cards

The State of Ohio released its yearly school report cards for the 2023/2024 school year to evaluate how school districts performed. Report cards graded districts on five criteria: achievement, progress, early literacy, gap closing, and graduation. These criteria are graded on a five-point scale. Lancaster City Schools achieved an overall score of four stars with many five-star scores awarded. Tarhe Trails Elementary received a five-grade, the highest attainable score. LCS received four stars in the progress and gap-closing categories. The district also received three-star ratings in achievement, graduation, and early literacy.

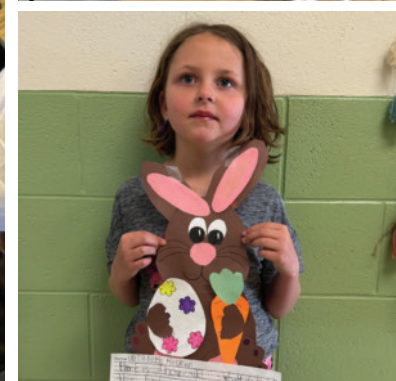

School Highlights

LANCASTER HIGH SCHOOL



It's been a busy and rewarding year at Lancaster High School! The Lady Gales Cross Country team won the Division 1 State Championship Meet capping off an undefeated season. This was the first team state championship for Lancaster High School since 1990 and the first ever women's state championship.

Lancaster High School celebrated 27 students who achieved a cumulative grade point average of 4.0 or higher in their high school careers at the Summa Cum Laude Honors Banquet. Sara Kallenberg was chosen from nearly 16,000 applicants as a National Honor Society Scholarship semifinalist.

community and the spirit of Gorsuch West!

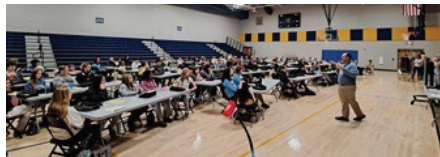
BRIDGES



This school year, the LCS Bridges program partnered with Caroline Davis, Career Tech Director and Associate Principal, to spark greater awareness, interest, and understanding of the LCS Career Tech programs. As part of this collaboration, students from the Career Tech program visited our elementary classrooms to lead hands-on activities in electrical circuits and woodworking.

Bridges students in grades 5 through 7 had the opportunity to explore Career Tech programs offered at the high school and Stanbery. This meaningful partnership provided our students with a glimpse into how their future education can align with their passions.

GENERAL SHERMAN



General Sherman has had a successful year! Over 120 students completed essays to participate in the Civics Bee sponsored by the Lancaster Fairfield County Chamber of Commerce. Nine of those students advanced to compete at the local contest.

Three students were selected as "Honored Artists" at the 45th Annual Youth Art Month and Young People's Art Exhibition. Three students participated in the All-County Band, and fifteen students participated in the All-County Choir. Eight students participated in the District Power of the Pen Contest, with six advancing to the Regional Contest. The staff at General Sherman was pleased to receive the 2024 Momentum Award, presented by the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce, for significant improvement in growth and achievement on the 2023-2024 State Report Card. Finally, staff established "The Sherman Way," challenging students to be Kind, to be Ready and to be Great. These expectations and a renewed focus on Social Emotional Learning resulted in a 15% decrease in disciplinary reports compared to the prior year.

MEDILL ELEMENTARY



Parent involvement in schools plays a crucial role in student success, and Medill Elementary exemplified this through a variety of engaging activities centered on language arts and science. Each grade level hosted a special event where students showcased their learning through presentations, giving parents a firsthand look at the curriculum and their child's academic progress. These

events not only strengthened the connection between home and school but also encouraged students to take pride in their work, knowing their efforts would be shared with their families. By actively participating in their child's education, parents at Medill helped foster a supportive and collaborative learning environment.

THOMAS EWING
