Students who are enrolled in Clear Horizons are required to abide by the policies of both Clear Creek ISD and San Jacinto College. Throughout this handbook the following acronyms will be used: CCISD (Clear Creek Independent School District), SJC (San Jacinto College).

Academic Calendars

CCISD and SJC calendars are not identical. Students are responsible for attending all high school and college classes every day. Transportation will be provided every day when class is in session. If CCISD is closed, transportation to and from the zoned high schools will be provided. The Texas Education Agency requires that high school students attend school every day on the high school calendar. Clear Horizons students will be required to attend even when college classes are not in session. Please review the Clear Horizons Calendar (Appendix A) for specifics.

Academic Expectations

- College and advanced high school courses may require up to two hours of study time outside of class each week.
- All assignments should be turned in on time and complete.
- Students are expected to utilize all resources offered by Clear Horizons and SJC to ensure passing of each course.
- Monitor and participate appropriately in both Blackboard and Canvas daily.
- Communicate with SJC professors via SJC email.
- Communicate with CCISD teachers via CCISD email.
- Monitor both SJC and CCISD email accounts daily.

Academic Concerns

Students who do not meet the academic requirements for the Clear Horizons program will be referred to the Clear Horizons Faculty Committee for review. This committee reviews student data and will make recommendations to the Clear Horizons administration regarding continuation in the program. The following will be considered for review:

- Completion of 6 credits each school year
- TSIA proficiency
- SJC academic standing
- Attendance
- Discipline

Based on the committee's recommendation, the student may be administratively withdrawn from Clear Horizons or may be placed on a contract to remain at Clear Horizons for the following semester.

Academic Integrity

Clear Horizons students must adhere to both the CCISD Honor Code and the SJC Policy on classroom behavior. Students who are found cheating or plagiarizing will be subject to consequences based on these policies.

Academic Resources

Clear Horizons Resources

All Clear Horizons teachers are available upon request for tutorials two days a week during advisory. Teachers also publish at least one more hour a week during lunch or after school for tutorials. A late bus is offered on Tuesdays and Thursdays throughout the school year to assist with late transportation and allow students to stay for tutorials. Students who want to take the late bus must sign up by 1:00 PM in the front office. National Honor Society students offer tutorials for high school classes weekly. Tutorial opportunities are announced in the morning announcements and the Coyote Connection newsletter.

SJC Resources

Students who are struggling in a college course should always reach out to the instructor for help. All instructors have office hours and may be available to assist. The Student Success Center, located on the first floor of the SJC library, offers tutoring in a variety of subjects. Students can stop by and request help.

Attendance Expectations

- Attend every high school class, including Advisory, and every college class, every day.
- Arrive on time to every class.
- Attend SJC classes whenever they are in session even if it falls on a CCISD holiday. (See Clear Horizons Calendar Appendix A).

The State reporting period for attendance is Advisory at Clear Horizons. It is essential that students arrive by 8AM each day to be counted present for the day.

Students leaving early must sign out in the front office. Eleventh and Twelfth grade students may qualify for early release when college classes are not in session. Proper documentation and permission must be obtained. When returning from an absence, students should bring a parent or doctor's note with the reason for the absence noted. This note must be received within one week of the absence.

Students who miss multiple times in a SJC class may be issued an FX. This means the student fails the course because of excessive absences. An FX is equivalent to an F on the high school and college transcripts. Students who receive an FX will be referred to the Clear Horizons Faculty Committee for review. Students may be required to withdraw from Clear Horizons if an FX is issued.

Clubs and Events

Students have full access to clubs and events at both Clear Horizons and SJC.

Clear Horizons Clubs

Students should review opportunities and participate in multiple clubs. Students who wish to start a new high school club must find a teacher sponsor, create a proposal with the sponsor, complete a club application, and request approval from the Clear Horizons principal. Stay connected with clubs through Remind, morning announcements, and the Coyote Connection (weekly newsletter).

SJC Clubs

SJC Clubs are governed by the Office of Student Life. Visit with the coordinator in S11.115 (Student Center). Students who miss a high school class while participating in a SJC event must request approval from Clear Horizons administration in advance or the absence will be unexcused.

Community Service

Clear Horizons students receive up to 60 hours of college credit at no cost. To instill gratitude and payback to the community who supports our students, community service is required each year.

- All Clear Horizons students must complete 20 hours each school year.
- Hours can be earned from the first day of school of the 9th grade year.
- Hours must be completed and documentation submitted by May 1st each year.
- Hours must be documented on company letterhead and/or in the form of official communication. Documentation must include the following:
 - Name of student
 - Number of hours served
 - Date of hours served
 - Name, signature, and contact information of the on-site supervisor
- All hours must be submitted on Canvas by May 1st
- A reflection essay is required each year to validate the hours for the year. Essays are written during advisory in the Spring semester and submitted on Canvas.
- Students who do not complete and turn in documented hours, along with the reflection essay, by May 1st, will not be exempt for Semester 2 Final Exams.

Conduct of Students

Students are responsible for all conduct mentioned in the CCISD Student Code of Conduct, the CCISD Student Handbook and the SJC Student Handbook. Disciplinary consequences may be incurred based on the CCISD Code of Conduct and/or SJC Student Handbook. CCISD and SJC handle each incident independently and a student may incur consequences from both CCISD and SJC for a single incident.

Costs

The Clear Horizons program is designed for students to earn a high school diploma, an associate degree and/or an industry-based certification at no cost. During the Fall and Spring semesters all costs associated with Clear Horizons Pathway courses are covered by CCISD and with generous support from the Clear Creek Educational Foundation.

Course Registration

High School - Course selection takes place for high school courses in February for the following Fall semester. The process is based on the four-year planning process with the Clear Horizons counselors. The course selection card does require a parent and student signature. The most up-to-date copies of the student's schedule will be provided before classes begin. SJC rooms and professors are not printed on the high school schedule. To obtain SJC course information students will log into their Secure Online System (SOS) account. Students are encouraged to print their SJC schedule information from the SOS.

Students are encouraged to review the SOS for any possible hold that may slow down the registration process. Holds may include overdue library fines, college residency questions, vaccinations, etc.

College - All college course registration is completed in partnership with the Office of Dual Credit and are scheduled based on four-year planning, timeline, high school course conflicts, and schedule availability. Families may not attempt to register for additional college classes at SJC while a student is in the Clear Horizons program. A reasonable college load is 12-15 credit hours per semester. Clear Horizons students take SJC courses that are face-to-face and meet during the regular high school day.

Instructor change requests are not accepted at Clear Horizons for high school or college classes.

Diploma Expectations

The following are the minimum expectations for Clear Horizons students:

- Fulfill the CCISD Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA) diploma requirements, as defined by TEA HB5.
- Complete all State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR) End of Course (EOC) test score requirements.
- Successfully complete college courses towards an associate degree and/or industry-based certification.

All Clear Horizons students work toward an Associate of Arts in General Studies. All other majors must be pre-approved by Clear Horizons Administration and the SJC Office of Dual Credit.

Diploma Expectations continued

To ensure students are on track for both the high school diploma and the associate degree, all Clear Horizons students will meet with a high school counselor at least once per year. Students can also meet with the SJC Dual Credit Educational Planners for advising sessions.

Clear Horizons students must be enrolled in Clear Horizons courses according to the sequences outlined in the Clear Horizons Pathways (See Appendix B). To ensure students are on track for both the high school and college diplomas, students should only take courses offered within our program. Students who attempt to earn credits outside of the Clear Horizons program may not be awarded credit.

Disciplinary Removal

Clear Horizons students will abide by the CCISD Student Code of Conduct and model the CCISD Core Values: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship. Should a student's behavior require placement at DAEP (Disciplinary Alternative Educational Placement), the student will be required to withdraw from Clear Horizons and enroll in their zoned high school.

Dual Credit Courses, Grades, and Credits

Dual credit is not available for every SJC course. For a student to receive dual credit, both high school and college credit, the course must be cross-walked with courses identified by TEA. The available course crosswalk can be found in Appendix D.

CCISD determines the courses for which dual credit is awarded. To receive high school credit the college course grade must be at least a C. Although a grade of D is considered passing on the college level, high school credit is not awarded. Students who earn a D in a college course that is required for high school graduation must make up the credit. Students that do not pass a college course may be ineligible for an associate degree.

SJC courses taken for dual credit will count toward the academic UIL rule, commonly known as "No Pass, No Play." Students will follow the CCISD eligibility calendar. All college courses in progress are considered passing until notification is received from the instructor. SJC courses are managed by SJC faculty. Any disputes regarding grades, course content, schedules, calendar, attendance, or other issues are to be addressed with the SJC instructor and/or the SJC Office of Dual Credit by the student. SJC faculty are unable to respond to email or phone requests from parents. Students can request assistance in communicating with SJC instructors from the Clear Horizons counselors and/or administrators.

Students with a disability (IEP or 504) should contact the SJC Disabilities Services Director through the Dual Credit Office. Students can bring a copy of the IEP or 504 for consideration of SJC.

GPA & Class Rank

Policies regarding GPA, Class Rank, and Classification are in the CCISD Educational Planning Guide. SJC will only issue letter grades beginning with the Fall of 2023. The table below outlines how those grades will be converted for CCISD transcripts and GPA calculations. Unlike the comprehensive high schools, Clear Horizons dual credit courses are included in the GPA calculations. To receive dual credit for the high school diploma a student must earn a C or higher in a college class.

Parking

Students who have a valid driver's license and park a vehicle must obtain a free SJC parking permit from the SJC Business office. Students should review and abide by all parking requirements in the SJC Student Handbook. Students must also register the SJC permit with the Clear Horizons front office. Parking permits may be revoked for disciplinary reasons at the discretion of Clear Horizons or SJC Administration.

Schedule Changes

All high school schedule changes will follow the procedures outlined in the CCISD Educational Planning Guide. SJC typically does not honor schedule changes. If, due to extenuating circumstances SJC or CCISD permits a course drop, the Clear Horizons student will be scheduled in a Clear Horizons Teacher Tutorial for the remainder of the semester.

Semester Averaging for SJC Courses

Semester Averaging for credit is allowed for SJC courses that are taken within the same academic school year and within the same subject. For example, a 60 in first semester BIOL and an 80 in second semester BIOL would grade average to a passing, yearlong average of 70.

Laptops

CCISD provides a laptop for every student. If a student chooses to bring their own device, it must be a laptop with the capabilities of accessing all CCISD and SJC online curriculum and resources.

Skyward

Access student information, report cards, emergency contacts, pay fees or fines. Located on the Clear Horizons website. Click on “Logins” on the top right corner of the home page.

Naviance Family Connection

Stay connected with information regarding colleges, scholarships, and careers. Located on the Clear Horizons website. Click on “Logins” on the top right corner of the home page.

Blackboard

SJC uses Blackboard as the Learning Management System. Students have access to course materials and grades for college courses. Students should monitor Blackboard daily.

SJC Secure Online System (SOS)

The SJC Portal, often called SOS, is where all college student information is held, including schedules, transcript history, grades, professor contact, and class locations.

SJC AlertMe

SJC communicates all emergency and safety information through SJC AlertMe. Students can sign up for notification through their SOS account. Parents and guardians can sign up for alerts as well using a cellphone or email: <https://www.sanjac.edu/alert-me>.

SJC Email

SJC faculty and staff will only communicate with students through the SJC email. Students should monitor SJC email daily.

Technology Instructional Resources Continued

CCISD Email

Students should communicate with Clear Horizons staff using CCISD email. Students should monitor CCISD email daily. The CCISD email can be accessed through the CCISD SSO Portal.

Canvas

CCISD learning management system is Canvas. Clear Horizons teachers utilize Canvas to provide instructional material, announcements, assignments, and grades. Students should monitor Canvas daily. The Canvas app can be downloaded on to a device and is also found in the CCISD SSO portal.

Textbooks

Textbooks, including online resources, for both high school and college classes are provided at no cost when students are completing courses in the Clear Horizons Program. Every effort will be made to issue students SJC textbooks prior to the start of the SJC course. There may be a time when the textbook is not available. In this case, Clear Horizons will notify the SJC Dual Credit office to inform the SJC instructors of the extenuating circumstances. When materials become available, students will be notified via CCISD email. Students who are “not clear” from the prior semester will not be issued textbooks until all fees/fines are cleared, in alignment with CCISD procedures. Students will return all textbooks on or before the last class meeting. Materials returned with damage or lost materials may result in fines, based on CCISD policy.

TSIA

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board requires all institutes of higher learning assess the academic skills of each entering undergraduate student to determine college readiness by taking the Texas Success Initiative Assessment (TSIA). Students must meet criteria on the math, reading, and writing portions of the TSIA to obtain eligibility to enroll in certain college level courses. Students who do not meet the appropriate criteria are required to pursue remediation and to retest. Students will not be charged for up to five attempts. The form to retest is requested by the Clear Horizons counselor and signed by the SJC Dual Credit office. The student can only test with this signed form.

In some cases, students are exempt from passing the TSIA. Students with the following scores can be exempt:

- ACT – composite score of 23 with a minimum of 19 on the English test and 19 on the mathematics test.
- SAT – students with a minimum score of 480 on the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) test and a minimum score of 530 on the mathematics test.

TSIA continued

Students who are unable to pass the Reading and Writing portions of the TSIA, by August of the 11th grade year, will have to withdraw from Clear Horizons.

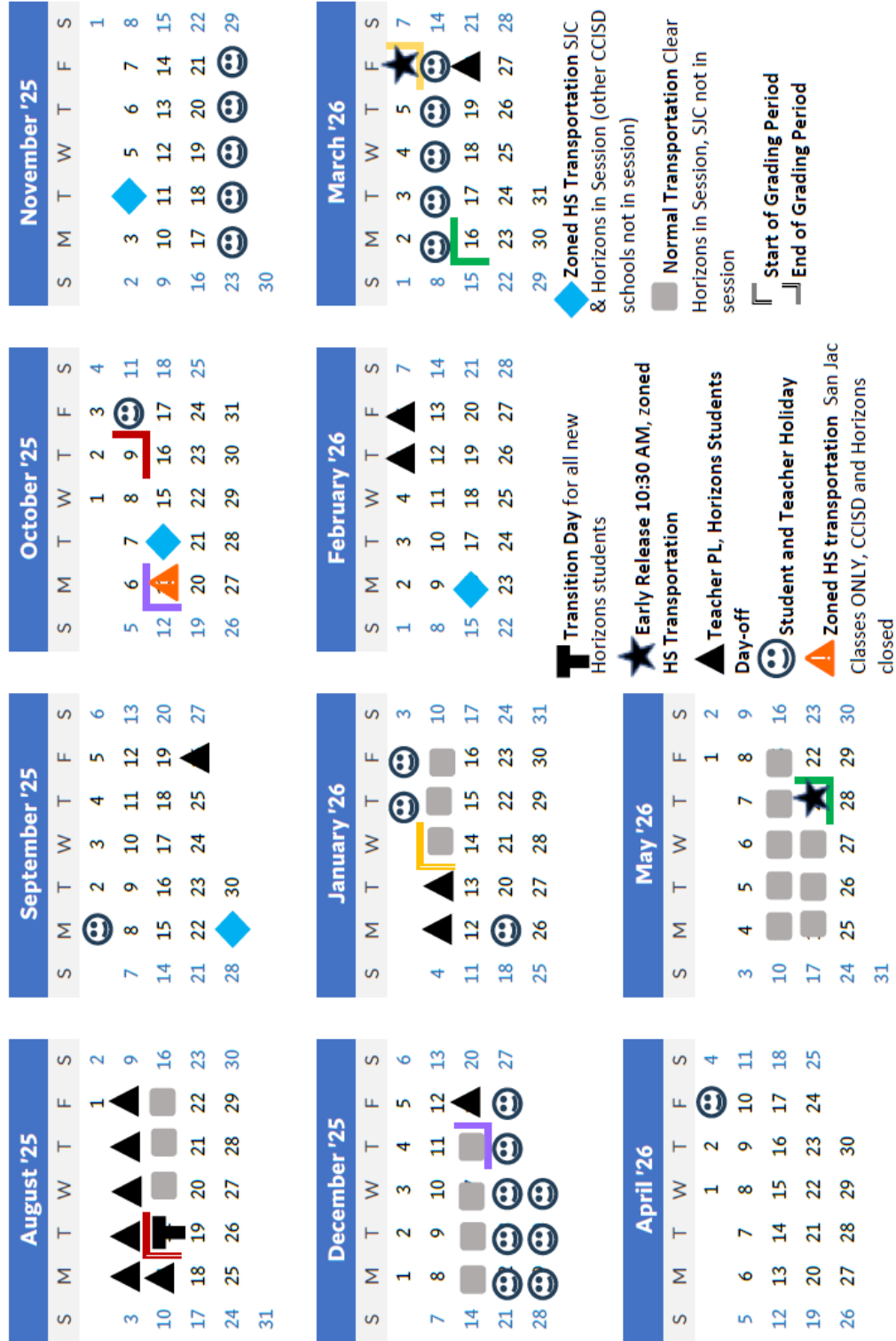
Students who are unable to pass the Math portion of the TSIA, by August of the 12th grade year, will not be eligible for an associate degree.

Withdrawal

Families are asked to make a four-year commitment to Clear Horizons. This commitment is reiterated annually with the Parent/Student Agreement (See Appendix C). The Clear Horizons staff is committed to helping each student and family work through difficulties that may cause a student to consider withdrawing. A meeting with the Clear Horizons Principal is required prior to a withdraw request.
