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<b>SPACE</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Fill the entire space of an artwork or area</li><li>• Understand the difference between a foreground, midground, and background</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Create a simple one point perspective artwork</li><li>• Use line and pattern to fill the space</li><li>• Use positive and negative space in a creative way</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Create multiple layers in the foreground, midground, and background</li><li>• Create an optical illusion</li><li>• Use two-point perspective in architecture</li></ul>
<b>BALANCE</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Experiment with actual balance in art</li><li>• Understand and use symmetry</li><li>• Create asymmetrical balance through humor</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Create radial symmetry</li><li>• Use balance in one-point perspective</li><li>• Use rotational symmetry</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Display an object in two ways visually</li><li>• Use symmetrical and asymmetrical balance in a single work</li><li>• Use paint strokes to convey balance</li></ul>
<b>UNITY</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Create unity through repetition of shape</li><li>• Create unity through repetition of subject</li><li>• Create unity through repetition of line</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Create unity through color and design</li><li>• Show unity in subject, even with contrast</li><li>• Show unity by repeating an element in an artwork</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Create a series of drawings using unity</li><li>• Create an artwork that has unity by repeating 3 or more elements</li></ul>



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## RHYTHM

- Create rhythm through placement of shapes and objects through collage
- Create rhythm through line

- Show rhythm through pattern and repetition
- Use multiple kinds of lines to create rhythm throughout an entire piece

- Show rhythm in fiber arts
- Create a piece inspired by a working artist that shows rhythm through at least 3 elements

## EMPHASIS

- Emphasize a subject by differentiating it from the background
- Create a focal point in the center
- Use line to create emphasis

- Use color, line, and pattern to create emphasis
- Create contrast in emphasis through light and dark or uncolored and colored

- Emphasize variation in color
- Use forced perspective to create emphasis
- Create convergence of background elements to create contrast

## MOVEMENT

- Use body language and positions to convey movement
- Learn how line can create movement
- Use large scale movement while creating art

- Create movement in a finished piece by using weight and balance
- Show movement through line
- Use technology to create movement in a digital piece

- Use repetition and line to move the viewer's eye through an artwork
- Create based on knowledge of the physics of movement
- Create movement through line and color



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## PATTERN

- Use basic patterns containing shapes and lines
- Contrast patterns within a single piece of art
- Create patterns inspired by an artist

- Create patterns from the environment, both man-made and natural
- Compare and contrast patterns by placing them next to each other

- Use animal patterns while creating a work of art
- Use patterns in fiber arts to create circular weaving
- Use patterns to create op art
- Create unique patterns

## CONTRAST

- Create contrast between black and white and bright colors
- Show contrast between two similar artworks
- Create contrast by using complementary colors

- Create contrast by emphasizing the subject
- Create contrast by using two different mediums
- Show emphasis of subject by using color

- Create contrast in a series
- Create contrast between mediums while creating contrast between environments
- Create contrast between at least 3 elements within a single artwork

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
