

The Community

The **Bedford Central School District** is located approximately 45 miles north of NYC in suburban Northern Westchester County. The school district is composed of 1 high school, 1 middle school, 5 elementary schools and has a richly diverse (socioeconomically, culturally & ethnically) population, serving students from the towns/hamlets of Mt Kisco, Pound Ridge, Bedford Hills, Bedford Village & Bedford Corners. Our district spans 59 sq. miles and has a population of 32,000 residents. The district has 17% English Language Learners and 36% of our students access Free & Reduced Lunch. Fox Lane HS is a comprehensive four-year public high school with an approximate enrollment of 1094 students & a current senior class of 295.

Academics

Class Rank/Weighting Policy: Fox Lane HS **does not rank students**; transcripts show **both** the **weighted** and **unweighted** GPA. Most courses with an H (Honors) or AP (Advanced Placement) designation will receive 10 add-on points in calculating the **weighted** cumulative average (GPA). The 10 points are not added to the final course average shown on the transcript but are used in GPA calculation only.

Grading: Numeric grades are awarded on a 0-100 point scale with 65% as passing. GPAs on the transcript were calculated at the end of 11th grade. When a **letter** grade is posted the key is as follows: **AUD** – Audit, **DRP** – Dropped, **E** – Excessive Absences, **I** – Incomplete, **NG** – No Grade, **NI** – Needs Improvement, **P** – Pass, **PH** – Pass w/Honors.

Transfer Students: Transfer students receive a grade of "P" (Pass) for credits earned at other schools and are not calculated into the Fox Lane High School GPA.

Graduation Requirements (22 credits total): **Courses:** English, 4; Social Studies, 4; Math, 3; Science, 3; World Language, 1; Physical Education, 2; The Arts, 1; Health, .5; Electives, 3.5. **Exams:** 5 Regents exams; **No Regents exams are included on transcripts unless requested.**

Course Level Designations: **AP** – Advanced Placement; **H** – Honors; **R** – Regents/College Prep; **ESOL** – English for Speakers of Other Languages; **A, B** – Regents Stretch Course

Dual Enrollment Opportunities: Science of Natural Disasters (**SUNY Oneonta**), Science Research (**SUNY Albany**); SUPA Forensics (**Syracuse**); *Project Lead the Way*: Drawing & Design (IED), Principles of Engineering, Computer Integrated Manufacturing (**RIT**); College Algebra & Trig, Statistics, Calculus (**SUNY WCC**). **New for 2025-2026:** College Spanish H, College French H, College Italian H (**SUNY WCC**), and BC Calculus (**SUNY WCC**)

Middle School Acceleration: Most students have an opportunity to earn 1 credit of World Language in 8th grade. Accelerated students can earn an additional 1 credit of World Language and/or 1 credit of Algebra 1 in 8th grade. Prior to 8th grade students cannot earn HS credit as per NYS regulation.

NY State Seal of Biliteracy: The NYSSB recognizes graduates who have attained a high level of proficiency in English & one or more world languages. 44 Students in the class of 2025 received the NYSSB.


The only courses tracked from middle school are Math and World Language.


