

Agreement for Student Use of District-Issued iPads - Grades K-8

The Kirkwood School District provides an iPad to K-8 students as a tool for learning. The use of district-issued devices while on and off campus is subject to all restrictions and guidelines contained in District Policies EHB, JG, EHBD-AP(1) and student behavior guides. Parents must complete and sign this agreement. In addition, students and parents/guardians are asked to review and sign the Kirkwood Digital Citizenship Contract. The District reserves the right to withdraw or limit use or possession of the iPad at its discretion.

Parent/Guardian (K-8): Please initial the box(es) below: I understand that the iPad issued to my child provides access to coursework and curriculum. I understand that this device is an essential tool for learning in our 1:1 environment. In the event that the iPad is damaged or lost due to misuse or neglect by my child, I understand I am responsible for its repair or replacement. The full replacement cost of the iPad will be \$500. The District will cover the cost of accidental damage to District-issued devices by K - 2nd grade Students. Parent/Guardian (Grades 3-8 ONLY): Please indicate your preference by initialing ONE of the boxes below: I agree to participate in the self-funded device protection plan (see next page), which will cover the cost of accidental damage of the device. The power cord, charger, case, and/or keyboard (grades 3-8) are not covered by the device protection plan. I do not agree to participate in the district device protection plan. In the event of damage or loss I understand I am responsible for the cost of repair or replacement of the iPad based on the pricing from the Incident Without Device Protection Plan table below. iPad Device Protection Plan

Grades 3-8

The Kirkwood School District offers an opportunity to families who wish to enroll in a device protection plan that will cover the cost of accidental damage or theft of a district-provided device.

Terms and Conditions

You will be responsible for protecting your assigned iPad from loss or damage. If an accident or theft should occur, the Kirkwood School District will waive your responsibility for the financial loss, subject to a deductible for multiple occurrences, as outlined below. In exchange for this damage waiver, Kirkwood requires payment into a device protection plan.

The iPad waiver fee for the School Year is \$20 (\$10 for students receiving free or reduced lunch).

New coverage must be purchased during the enrollment period for the school year. The device protection plan must be purchased no later than the last Friday in September.

Payment

Payment may be made through a My School Bucks account using Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover or checking and savings accounts. Please visit www.myschoolbucks.com to create and/or log into an account. While not preferred, payment via cash or check may be made in person in a school's main office.

Device Protection Plan Structure

There is no deductible for the first and second covered claims per year *if families have paid for the device protection plan*. Families who do not opt into the device protection plan are asked to pay repair fees according to the table below.

Incident With Device Protection Plan	Deductible	Incident Without Device Protection Plan	Repair Fee
1st occurrence	\$0	1st occurrence	\$50
2nd occurrence	\$0	2nd occurrence	\$100
3rd and subsequent occurrence	\$200	3rd and subsequent occurrence	\$200

Excluded Losses

Certain conditions not covered by this damage waiver include: 1) any dishonest, fraudulent, malicious or criminal acts, 2) any loss to software, data, documents, music, videos, recordings or other personal information that the student has placed on the device, 3) additional loss caused by the failure to use all reasonable means to protect the device after it has been damaged, 4) disappearance of the device without submitting a copy of a formal police report to school authorities and 5) any use not in accordance with District policies and procedures.
