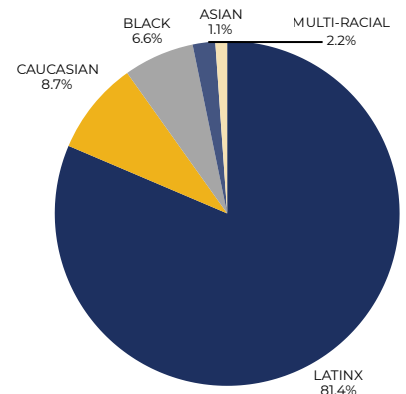
SCHOOL OVERVIEW

- Round Lake High School offers students the opportunity to earn College and Career Pathway endorsements through the State of Illinois in Arts and Communication or Health Science and Technology

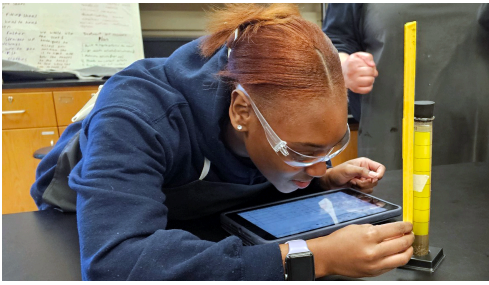

STANDARDS BASED GRADING POLICY

In standards-based grading, the grade calculation is more complex than in traditional grading. However, the grade assigned is a far better representation of student learning than under traditional grading practices. Each class is broken up into a group of Power Standards, Standards, and Indicators.

- Power Standards and Standards identify the concepts and skills students are expected to master to complete the course successfully.
- Indicators define what it looks like to master the standard to which they are attached. Students are assessed and provided feedback at the Indicator level.
- Each grade entered on a standard is meant to be an indication of mastery of the concept or skill at that moment in time.
- Student's performance is evaluated based on a rubric, which describes the required performance level, and is then assigned a categorical rating based on that performance.
- Students must perform at the "Basic" level (category 2) or better on every power standard and standard in order to be assured of passing grade in the course.

PROGRAMS OF STUDY

Students who have earned a teacher recommendation are eligible to take honors and advanced placement courses all 4 years of high school.

- Students are not restricted to the number of accelerated courses allowed per semester.
- In 2025, 364 students took 654 AP exams, earning a mean score of 3.0 and a 66% AP Test Pass rate.
- We offer **33 honors courses and 18 AP courses** in both the core subject areas and electives that demand high levels of cognitive and problem-solving processes. The instructional pace is rigorous, emphasizing curricular depth, breadth, and enrichment.

LAKE COUNTY HIGH SCHOOLS TECHNOLOGY CAMPUS

Offered for students in their junior and senior year, this program allows Round Lake students to apply to attend classes at the “Tech Campus” in a career specific training program. Students can become certified in various concentrations, as well as earn both high school and college credit through the College of Lake County simultaneously. Programs Round Lake students participate in include, but are not limited to, Automotive Service, Certified Nursing Assistant, Culinary Arts, Emergency Medical Services, and Cosmetology.

DUAL CREDIT

Through a partnership with the College of Lake County (CLC), sophomores through seniors can earn college credit while completing high school graduation requirements. RLHS offers the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses at no cost. Current class offering include: Graphic Design, Photography and Digital Imaging 2, Video and Animation 1, Math in Trades and Strength Training 1.

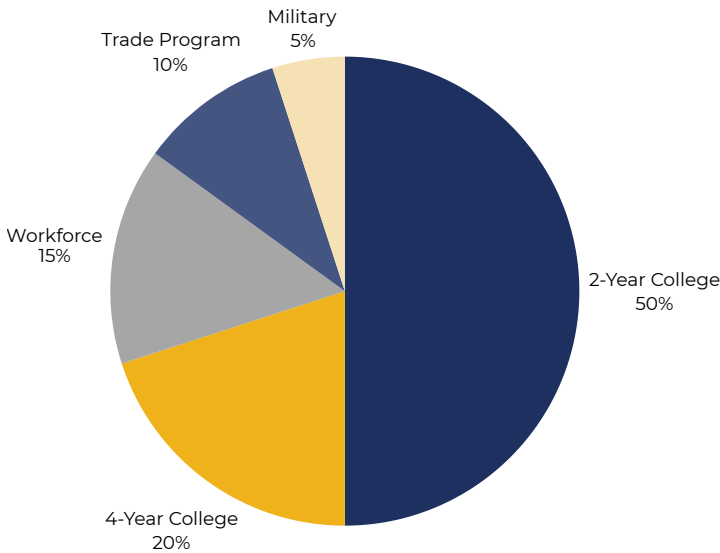
WORK BASED LEARNING

Students have career development opportunities, some notable student engagement experiences include partnerships where 10 students completed an internal internship with IT and Law Enforcement, 4 students completed internships with Endeavor Health, 25 students completed programs with Rosalind Franklin University, and 17 students completed the FutureReady program focused on essential employability skills. Additionally, our Community Civics Honors course provides students with the opportunity to connect with stakeholders in the greater Round Lake Area. Providing the ability to create positive change through volunteering and civic engagement leading to scholarship and internship opportunities.

BEYOND ACADEMICS

All students take elective courses that are embedded within their school day. Additionally, these courses offer opportunities for real life exposure to work embedded experiences with industry partners such as the Chicago Bears, Rosalind Franklin University, Endeavor Health, Baxter Healthcare, Scot Forge and State Representative Laura Faber Diaz. Students also have the ability to connect with TRiO Educational Talent Search for additional academic and career support.

STUDENT MATRICULATION

In recent years, our students have enrolled at: University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, Illinois State University, Northern Illinois University, Lake Forest College, Loyola University Chicago, DePaul University, University of Chicago, Illinois Wesleyan University, Colgate University, Beloit College, UW-Madison, Stanford University, to name a few. The majority of our students enroll at the College of Lake County following graduation to continue their post-secondary education.

95% of students who attended Senior Kick Off will be the FIRST in their families to attend college.
