

Suggested Class-wide Behavior/Social Emotional Interventions



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| Tier 3: Individual Supports | Tier 3 interventions apply to a few students. These students receive more intensive, individualized support to improve their behavioral and academic outcomes. |
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Before you start, a few important points:

- All student's behavior communicates something and serves a function (i.e., attention, escape/avoidance, sensory, tangible). Select an intervention that addresses the function.

- These are additional supports/strategies to add to the Tier 1 and Tier 2 interventions that are already in place.

*******WARNING! Restraint should ONLY be utilized by those specifically trained and certified in the techniques, as they can cause injury and even death if performed incorrectly**

- Check with federal, state, district, and school regulations to find information about the policies and training regarding the use of restraint
- Restraint should only be used when in emergency situations where the health or safety of the student or other persons are at imminent risk
- Restraint should only be utilized by persons specifically trained and certified in the use of the techniques
