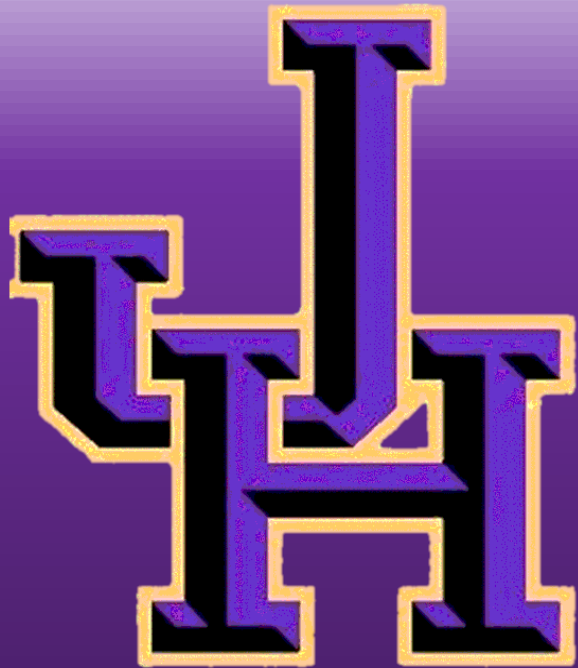

Dress Code

- **Clothing MUST COVER ALL UNDERGARMENTS on everyone (muscle shirts, bras, underwear.) Underwear may not be worn as outerwear.**
- **No undershirts, backless blouses, halter/tube tops, spaghetti straps, crop-tops/midriffs, off the shoulder, and sports bras/exercise tops are allowed on campus.**
- **T-shirts, blouses, and all tops must not expose any amount of cleavage.**
- **See-through fabrics must have a garment other than underclothing underneath. Excessively revealing clothes are not allowed (Cut-outs, low-cut tops).**
- **Shorts must be appropriate in length for school and educational settings**
- **Excessively baggy pants are not acceptable. Pants must be worn over the hips for everyone and cover all undergarments.**
- **Pajamas, blankets and all other sleepwear are NOT allowed unless it is a spirit day**

Students will be offered clean loaner clothing to change into. Students will be expected to return loaners at the end of the day.

Other consequences may include ALC, Suspension, and After School Work Program.

Your i-Ready results help our school make important decisions about your placement in **Math** and **English** classes.

- **Do well** → Shows you're on track and helps keep you in classes that match your skills.
- **Don't rush / if you score below your ability** → Could lead to changes you may not want.
- Possible Changes if Scores Are Low:
 - **✗** Lose an elective and be placed in an **intervention class**.
 - **✗** Move from **advanced (IB, Honors)** to a **college prep class**.
 - **✗** Miss out on opportunities for **advanced courses** in the future.

Take your time. Try your best. Your future placement depends on it!

Bullying/Harassment

Dear Parent / Guardian,

In accordance with Board Policy 5127, the principal may deny a student the privilege of participating in graduation ceremonies and/or activities in accordance with school rules. School rules shall ensure that prior to denial of the privilege(s), the student, and where practical his/her parent/guardian is made aware of the grounds for such denial and that the student is given an opportunity to respond to the denial. The student and parent/guardian shall receive written notice of the denied privilege and the means whereby he/she may appeal this decision. Please have a discussion with your student about this notice. This is an opportunity for students to help Improve Grades, Attendance, and Behavior to help the student have a positive senior year.

Jurupa Hills High School CLASS OF 2025 SENIOR IN GOOD STANDING CONTRACT

THIS CONTRACT IS TO BE SIGNED BY BOTH PARENT/GUARDIAN AND STUDENT
CONTRACT MUST BE BROUGHT IN ON JULY 26, 2024 IN ORDER FOR STUDENT TO RECEIVE A CLASS SCHEDULE AND COMPLETE THE REGISTRATION PROCESS.

THIS CONTRACT WILL GO INTO EFFECT BEGINNING Monday, August 5, 2024
(IMMEDIATELY UPON ENROLLMENT FOR ANY NEW SENIORS)

NOTE: SIGNATURES ARE NOT A PRE-CONDITION TO THE EFFECTIVE DATES OF THIS CONTRACT.
Failure to return the signed contract on time may result in failure to participate in activities.

I understand that participating in ANY of this year's school events including senior closing events and the graduation ceremony is a privilege. To be eligible to participate, I must maintain the established criteria for academic achievement, attendance, and behavior during my senior year. To ensure that I may participate in school activities, the senior closing events, and/or the graduation ceremony, I understand that I must meet all the following criteria per Ed Code 48200 and Board Policy 5127.

ACADEMIC

- Must be on track to complete all academic requirements including Senior Project by May 16, 2025.
- Must complete Senior Project by the end of third quarter.
- Pass all required classes, earning a minimum of 230 credits.
- Complete and verify through the Guidance Department, any additional credits needed from Adult Education, Dual Enrollment and/or college classes by May 2, 2025.
- Complete a FASFA application and College Application.

ATTENDANCE

- Maintain 97% attendance in each semester (equivalent to no more than 18 period absences per semester). Excessive absences and/or tardies may result in Administrative action.
- If available, complete all Saturday School Sessions before the end of the 1st semester for 1st semester absences, and by March 28, 2025, for 2nd semester absences. *Note-Saturday School can only be used to make-up full day absences. Period absences AND tardies cannot be made up through Saturday School.

BEHAVIOR

- Behave in a mature & responsible manner. This behavior standard applies at school and at any school sponsored activity.
- No in or out of school suspensions for any reason. If suspended, student will not be permitted to participate in one or more events, including participation in the graduation ceremony.
- Participation in any "ditch days" or other senior pranks will result in the automatic loss of one or more senior activities. Seniors with "late-start" or "early release" schedules are not to be on campus except during officially scheduled times.
- Attend "MANDATORY" graduation practices/senior events scheduled for May 2025. Students may not be permitted to participate in the graduation ceremony if they fail to attend the graduation practices.

FINES/FEES

- Pay all outstanding fines/fees to Jurupa Hills School and FUSD by Senior Check-out date.

*Note-Refunds for activities lost due to ANY academic, attendance, behavior, or unpaid fees WILL NOT be given.

Board Policy 5127 - In order to encourage high standards of student conduct and behavior, the principal may deny a student the privilege of participating in graduation ceremonies and/or activities in accordance with school rules. School rules shall ensure that prior to denial of the privilege(s), the student, and where practicable his/her guardian, is made aware of the grounds for such denial and that the student is given an opportunity to respond to the proposed denial. If privilege(s) are to be denied, the student and parent/guardian shall receive written notice of the denied privilege and the means whereby he/she may appeal this decision. A request for an appeal hearing must be submitted in writing no later than one week after receiving written notice of denial.

Your signature indicates acknowledgement of the conditions stated in this contract. All JHHS seniors will be held to the standards listed in this document regardless if it is signed/returned or not. This form verifies that you were made aware of the policies that will be enforced. Seniors (including those that are 18 years old) are responsible for sharing this contract with their parent/guardian and obtaining their signature.

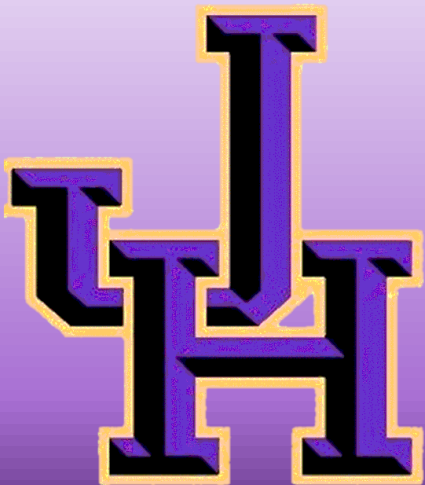
