Catawba Ridge High School, the newest high school in Fort Mill, completed its first year in 2019-2020. CRHS is a comprehensive public high school in Fort Mill, South Carolina. We are the fastest growing school district in South Carolina. The Fort Mill School District has an enrollment of over 18,200 students in 3 high schools, 6 middle schools, and 12 elementary schools. The enrollment at Catawba Ridge High School is currently 1732, and we serve grades 9-12.

The student population at CRHS is 68.1% Caucasian, 9.8% Hispanic/Latino, 9.5% African-American, 6.6% Asian, and 6% other.
