IV. Superintendent Report

Dr. Alexa Doeschner, Superintendent of Schools, started her report by expressing her heartfelt gratitude to the community for entrusting her in this very important role. She continued by stated the following:

"I deeply value the trust and confidence you have placed in me and I do not take it for granted. I remain fully committed to serving the students and staff of the community of the Glen Cove City School District and I look forward to working with this board and future boards to support the success and well-being of every student".

Dr. Doeschner began her Superintendent's Report by sharing photo's she took at the high school graduation and the moving up ceremonies she had attended last week, congratulating all of them.

The new Superintendent of Schools, went on to say that NYSSBA (New York State School Boards Association) holds an annual convention that Glen Cove attends and has participated in the last two years. She stated that at this year's convention we would like to showcase our students with some of the photos that Ms. Vicovich, our Public Relations staff member, has taken and at the request of President Raimo would like to see if any of the photos are accepted at this year's convention.

Dr. Doeschner was in San Antonio this past Sunday as Mr. Klatsky, our new Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum/Instruction/ Technology, attended a leadership panel where he was chosen along with a superintendent and an associate superintendent. He was part of this panel that focuses on Building a Unified Vision leading with Purpose and Clarity. The new Superintendent of Schools was in attendance to document Mr. Klatsky's achievement so that it could be shared this evening as we should all feel pride in seeing one of our staff members being represented on the national stage and speaking eloquently on leadership and vision. She congratulated him.

Additionally, Dr. Doeschner continued in saying that Glen Cove was chosen to present our literacy work in San Antonio. Ms. Kristen Shaefer, English Coordinator, along with Dr. Doeschner, presented on Collaboration and Coaching, Vision, Alignment and Implementation of a K-5 ELA Curriculum. They shared the information along with strong data with over 60 people in attendance. She acknowledged and congratulated the literacy team along with the incredible teachers and students.

The Superintendent of Schools, mentioned that as of January 2024 New York State passed a new law that requires all districts in New York to check and update how we teach literacy to students in PreK - 3rd grade. This year, along with all school districts, we have to make sure that we are using the best researched based practices so that all our students can become strong readers. All New York State districts are required to complete a form (Literacy Attestation). This form is due in by September 1, 2025. We have made literacy a priority in our district and we have aligned our practices to the science of reading. Dr. Doeschner stated that the strong data that they shared nationally will be incorporated into the agestation. She shared this information via a PowerPoint presentation so that everyone knows that this work is happening by showing a timeline of what has been done so far and the schedule of what will continue as they move forward.

In closing, Dr. Doeschner updated the Board of Education and the community on the construction that's going on in the district by showing some pictures via a PowerPoint presentation where she stated the following:

- Deasy's project is underway with different classrooms being added. The elevator shaft has been completed. The Deasy Safety Team toured the elevator shaft and approved the work and are happy with this addition in their building.
- Photos of the high school were displayed with a gutted cafeteria showing work is underway and additional photos showing the science wing area displaying the gutted coordinator suite and the construction crew working in that area.
