<p><b>Title VI: <i>Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964</i></b> Prohibits discrimination, exclusion from participation, and denial of benefits based on race, color, or national origin</p>	<p><b>Section 504: <i>Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973</i></b> Requires that individuals with disabilities not be excluded from, denied benefits of, or subjected to discrimination. Ensures that a person with a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities receives accommodations, services, and supports necessary to access and participate</p>
<p><b>Title IX: <i>Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972</i></b> Prohibits sex-based discrimination and sexual harassment</p>	<p><b>IDEA 2004: <i>the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 2004</i></b> Ensures a free appropriate public education (FAPE) in the least restrictive environment to students with disabilities.</p>
<p><b>Title II: <i>Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990</i></b> Prohibits discrimination, exclusion from participation, and denial of benefits on the basis of disability and ensures equal access to programs and services.</p>	<p><b><i>The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act</i></b> Ensures educational rights and protections for children and youth experiencing homelessness.</p>
