Stratford High School (SHS) is a comprehensive public high school serving grades 9-12, which offers a rigorous college preparatory program. With over 200 course offerings, our school is designed to prepare graduates to become community-minded independent thinkers and problemsolvers.

Stratford students take part in numerous athletics teams, fine arts pursuits, student publications, service organizations, student council, honor societies, and special interest clubs.

SHS consistently earns academic distinctions from the Texas Education Agency and is recognized among the best high schools in our area and beyond by U.S. News and World Report, Texas ACT Council, Niche, and others. The Anti-Defamation League has also regularly designated SHS as a No Place for Hate campus.

Weighted grade points are awarded for only one course per year, grades 9-12, in each of the four core curricular areas (English, math, science, social studies). GPA is determined by dividing the total grade points by the number of courses attempted. Courses not included in the calculation of GPA include those taken as correspondence/online, credit by examination and those taken in summer school and middle school. An expanded grading scale includes Special Education.

Spring Branch ISD reports class rank outside the top 10% only for those students who make a formal request to have it included on their transcript.
