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DESCRIPTION:

- Medical Therapeutics is an applied course designed to prepare students to pursue careers in therapeutic and nursing services. Upon completion of this course, a proficient student will be able to identify careers in therapeutics services; components of a comprehensive health care team and facility; assess, monitor, evaluate, and report patient/client health status; and identify the purpose and components of healthcare treatments. In this class there will be topics of discussions and assignments regarding sexuality, anatomy and physiology of the male and female reproductive systems, fetal development, and childbirth as well as sexually transmitted diseases.

HOSA (Future Health Professionals):



This is done through technical instruction in the classroom, work-based learning opportunities in the clinical setting and leadership skills through HOSA.

Class Expectations:

1. Rules and Policies of the Student Handbook will be followed at **ALL** times.

• Important things you need to know for this class-
