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## **A Message from the Superintendent – Steve Quick**

We're excited to welcome all students and families—both returning and new—to the Okanogan School District! This year, our focus remains on high expectations, strong support for students and staff, improving facilities, and excellent programs that help every student succeed.

Thanks to voter approval of our bond last Spring, we'll spend this year planning and designing major projects to ensure they meet our needs and budget. The majority of construction will begin next fall after we access our state matching funds through the School Construction Assistance Program, following the timeline outlined by this program.

In the meantime, we hope to start work this fall on Dawson Gym and the Vocational Building using our \$6 million state modernization grant. Planned improvements include, but will not be limited to new roofs, HVAC upgrades, lighting, and air conditioning in the gym.

We encourage students to join sports, clubs, and activities—great ways to build friendships, learn new skills, and connect with school life. In addition, VG has a growing PTO, and parents are encouraged to get involved.

While state and federal funding is tighter than usual this year, our commitment to top-notch programs and strong student support remains unchanged.

As we open the doors to the 2025–26 school year, I am excited about what lies ahead. Our community's support, the dedication of our staff, and the energy and potential of our students make Okanogan an amazing place to be. Together, we will make this another fantastic school year.

## **Technology Coordinator – Cari Zachow**

We're excited to kick off another great school year! As part of our continued commitment to supporting student learning, we are once again offering laptop insurance for middle and high school students at a low cost.

### **Cost of Insurance:**

- \$30 for the first student
- \$10 for each additional student (e.g., 2 students = \$40, 3 students = \$50)

Laptops are a vital part of today's classroom experience, and we know accidents can happen—spills, drops, or even everyday wear and tears. With insurance, you can protect your student's device and avoid unexpected repair or replacement costs.

Each laptop is assigned to an individual student, and that student is responsible for any damage, whether it happens at school or at home. Purchasing insurance helps ensure that if a laptop is damaged (by the assigned student or someone else), repair or replacement costs will be covered.

If you choose not to purchase insurance, any damage to the assigned laptop will be the responsibility of the student and their family.

- In the Middle School Office
- In the High School Office

The Okanogan Outreach and our Open Doors program at Worksource are designed to provide students with options that will complement their unique educational needs. When enrolling, along with credit checks students are interviewed to determine what their desired outcome is and then we create an individualized education plan.

The Okanogan Outreach offers students the ability to accelerate their schooling for early graduation, engage in credit retrieval, or graduate with a Washington State Diploma. Outreach staff work with students to help them meet their educational goals by having extended hours and flexible scheduling to accommodate jobs, family and other commitments. As part of the Outreach program, we also offer online classes through Edgenuity for students who prefer digital learning.


The Open Doors Program enrolls students ages 16 (as of September 1, 2025) to 21 years of age who are working towards their Washington State Diploma or GED. This year we are fortunate to have two new staff members; Instructor Erin Delude and Student Support Specialist Ximena Sanchez. Both Erin and Ximena are committed to their students' well-being and success. They work closely with students to ensure academic goals are being met, as well as assisting with career readiness skills with instruction, internships and skill certification opportunities. Our staff monitors each student's progress regularly and adjusts lessons accordingly.

Outreach Enrollment Packets will be available for pickup on August 19<sup>th</sup> and enrollment appointments can be made at the same time. This year, we are continuing our school-wide focus on strong attendance. Our goal is for each classroom—and our school as a whole—to reach a **95% attendance rate**, this means (9 or less) days absent for the entire school year. We will track our progress monthly and celebrate our collective success throughout the year. As you know, strong attendance helps students feel more connected, confident, and successful in school. Setting a consistent bedtime and morning routine, avoiding appointments during school hours, and talking with your child about the importance of showing up are just a few simple ways to support regular attendance. If your child is struggling with school-related anxiety or a sudden change in behavior, please don't hesitate to connect with their teacher or our school team—we are here to help.

As summer winds down, now is the perfect time to ease back into school routines. In my own home, that means earlier bedtimes, more structured days, and building excitement about the new school year. A great way to prepare is by setting aside just 15 minutes a day for reading, practicing math facts, or journaling. These small efforts at home make a big difference in the classroom.

**Important dates!:** Our class lists will be posted on the school entry doors on the 15<sup>th</sup> through the first day. We will have an informal open house to see classrooms and meet teachers on the 25<sup>th</sup> from 3:00-5:30. Our first day of school is the 26<sup>th</sup> for grades 1-5 with our Kindergarten and pre-school (TK) screening and WA-Kids assessments on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, parents will be called to schedule these appointments for Kindergarten and TK.

I feel incredibly fortunate to begin another year with the amazing students, families, and staff of Virginia Grainger. I truly value the partnership between school and home, and I encourage each of you to get involved—whether it's through your child's classroom, the PTO, or attending one of our many family events. Communication is a priority for us, and I want you to know that my door is always open. Please reach out if you have questions, ideas, or simply want to connect.

The high school office will reopen on Wednesday, August 13 at 8 a.m. and our first day of school is scheduled for Tuesday, August 26. If you're new to Okanogan High School, please contact the office so we can assist you in scheduling an appointment with a counselor. For our incoming freshmen, we understand the transition to high school brings a mix of excitement and nerves. To help ease that transition, we invite you to attend Freshman Orientation on Thursday, August 21 at 6 p.m. in the cafeteria. Hosted by our ASB officers, this event is a great opportunity to explore the school, meet classmates, and receive answers to questions you may have.

The high school office is now cashless. With that, all payments made in the office must be completed using a credit or debit card. You may also pay online at any time through the payment portal on the district website. This change helps us provide a more secure and efficient service to our students and families. Speaking of a typical purchase made at the beginning of the year, one of the best values out there is our Bulldog ASB Card! For just \$45, students gain admission to all regular season home games and receive discounts throughout the year. Please know that ASB cards are required for athletes and those participating in ASB activities or clubs.

Consistent attendance matters because students who attend 90 percent or more of the school year are more likely to earn higher grades and graduate on time. Please be aware that guardians must provide a written excuse or call the office whenever a student returns from an absence. Unexcused absences may result in loss of make-up privileges or ineligibility for extracurricular participation on that day. Building on that, our electronics device policy is still in effect as students cannot be on their devices during the school day. Last year's implementation resulted in major improvements to learning, focus, and social interaction—all while limiting disruptions.

As we begin the 2025-26 school year, we look forward to reconnecting and continuing to build a unified Bulldog community grounded in Courtesy, Pride, and Respect. Okanogan High School truly has something for everyone. To our students—be bold in exploring opportunities, stay present, commit to doing your best, and never give up. #### Child Find Notice

The Okanogan School District is required by Washington Administrative Code 392-172-100 to inform patrons of the special education services and programs available within the district. The State of Washington defines special needs as having concerns with developmental delays, vision, hearing, health, communication skills, academic performance, social-emotional status, general intelligence, motor abilities, autism, traumatic brain injury, transition services or other disabilities.

People with children from birth to age 21, who have any of these conditions, are encouraged to contact the district’s director of special services, Tanya Peterson - 422-3580, for more information.

#### McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children & Youth

Are you struggling to find permanent housing due to financial difficulties? Okanogan School District’s McKinney Vento program can help your child maintain their school stability and can help connect your family to resources. If any of the following circumstances are true, your children may qualify for McKinney-Vento support through Okanogan School district’s McKinney Vento program.

Are you currently:

- Couch surfing (moving from place to place to sleep),
- Doubled up with friends or relatives due to financial hardship,
- A teen living on your own,
- At risk of losing your home,
- Living without plumbing or electricity,
- Living in a hotel or motel, vehicle or campground,
- Living in a shelter, or
- Living on the street

If you can answer “yes” to any of these living situations, please contact Julia O’Connor by calling or texting (509)322-7131 and let her help you connect with school and area resources.

## Home-Based Instruction (Homeschool) Students

Parents providing homebased instruction to their children must, according to Washington State laws, file the following information via their local school district: child's name, grade, birth date, and credentials, if any, of home instructor. Parents may pick up forms and file this information at the Okanogan School District office located at 115 Rose Street.
