PROCEDURE:


- WALK THROUGH WITH YOUR BOOKBAG STRAPPED ON YOUR FRONT
- PASS YOUR LAPTOP TO THE ADULT ON DUTY
- PHONES, AIRPODS & KEYS MAY REMAIN IN POCKETS
- UMBRELLAS, CERTAIN GLASSES CASES, BINDERS WILL MAKE THE SYSTEM ALERT
- IF THE SYSTEM ALERTS ON YOU, YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO MOVE TO A SECONDARY SEARCH AREA
- IF THE SYSTEM DOES NOT ALERT ON YOU, YOU CAN KEEP IT MOVING



DAILY SECURITY SCREENINGS

- STUDENTS WITHOUT BAGS WILL BE ABLE TO PASS THROUGH THIS SCREENING MORE QUICKLY.
- STUDENTS WITH ATHLETIC BAGS/EQUIPMENT WILL “CHECK THEM” WITH THE SECURITY GUARD AND THEN PICK THEM UP WHEN THEY LEAVE. STUDENTS WILL NOT HAVE ACCESS TO THESE BAGS DURING THE SCHOOL DAY. GYM BAGS WILL BE HANDLED SEPARATELY.
- STUDENTS SHOULD USE THEIR LOCKERS AND/OR LEAVE BOOKS AT HOME UNLESS INSTRUCTED TO BRING THEM FOR A SPECIFIC DAY



A student who misses 10% or more of his/her enrollment period is identified as chronically absent.	A student who misses 10% or more of his/her enrollment period is identified as chronically absent.
Principals may excuse up to 6 days per year.	Principals may not excuse days. The SC-PA code will no longer be available.
Principals may use the SC-PA code for up to 2 days when a student has been placed on summary suspension if the infraction was unfounded.	Principals may use the SC-EX code for up to 2 days when a student has been placed on summary suspension and the student's involvement in the infraction is unfounded. Parent notification must be documented in Log Entries.
Parent notes are not excused.	Parents may submit notes for up to 6 school days, and the days will count as parent-excused. (Students taking dual-enrollment courses must follow the attendance guidelines from the credit-granting institution. Parent notes cannot be used to excuse absences from HGTC or CCU classes.) Elementary/Middle Schools – 6 days total High Schools – 3 days per semester, for a total of 6 days Parent notes will not be accepted during designated state testing dates. Due to high school final exams, parent notes will not be accepted the last 3 days of the school year for students in grades 9-12. Parents must submit a note within 3 days of the student's return to school from an absence. Notes may be submitted prior to the student's absence.

TARDY POLICY

Students should be in class on time ready to begin each school day at 7:58am. Those who are not on time for school/class are tardy.

1st offense: Verbal Warning

2nd offense: Parent contact and 15 minute after school detention

3rd offense: Parent Contact and 30-minute after school detention

4th offense: Students will be referred to the principal for a possible Attendance Intervention Plan (AIP).

After-school tardy detentions will be held on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays outside of class times. It is the responsibility of the student and his/her parents to provide timely transportation from detention in the afternoons.



LUNCH OPTIONS

- Students may bring their own lunch.
- Several microwaves are available for student use.
- Students may order lunch daily from HCS Early College High School.
- Mr. McQueen sends out each menu on our weekly announcements, along with the link for ordering. **Lunches MUST be ordered before 8:30 a.m.**
- Students will eat in the commons area or outside. Students may also eat in a classroom as long as a teacher is present and a club is not meeting.

CAMPUS RESTRICTIONS

- Dorms, Dining Facilities, HTC Center, Game Room in Student Center are OFF LIMITS TO ALL STUDENTS
- Starbucks and Einstein's Bagels for 11th/12th grade only
- Student may not remain in cars once parked on campus
- No student may visit their car during the school day without SA administration permission



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CAMPUS RESTRICTIONS

- Students are not allowed on the CCU campus after 3:30pm or weekends unless with a parent/guardian
 - or previous permission from school administration
- Students may not return to campus without permission once they have left

SCHOOLGY


- Schoology is our instructional platform. This platform provides fingertip, remote, and constant access to assignments and assessments.

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


GRADING POLICY
