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WHAT IS PRE-AP?

Pre-AP features grade-level instruction intended to give all students the opportunity for growth. It offers a focused framework, instructional support, model lessons, and classroom assessments while focusing on skills that students will need to succeed in AP courses, college, and careers.

Shared principles:

- Close Observation and Analysis: Students carefully observe a data set, text, image, or problem--capturing relevant details before attempting to explain, analyze, or evaluate.
- Evidence-Based Writing: Students learn to craft precise sentences before progressing to longer forms of writing—applying these skills as they craft claims, develop arguments, and provide explanations.
- Higher-Order Questioning: Students engage with questions that are elevated beyond simple recall as they make predictions, synthesize, evaluate, and compare--learning that deep questions lead to deeper understanding.
- Academic Conversation: Students become active participants in their own learning through frequent opportunities to compare, critique, debate, and build upon others' ideas--recognizing that all voices, including their own, deserve to be heard.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This year we will develop students' critical thinking skills by studying reading, writing, speaking, listening, and language skills. Students will also learn about:

- Vocabulary
- Spelling
- Grammar
- Multiple genres
- Argumentative/persuasive writing
- EOC prep

COURSE ACTIVITIES (What we will be doing)

Below you will find descriptions of the most common activities that students will participate in during the course of each semester.

- Organizing and drafting writing
- Reading a variety of texts on different topics to deepen understanding of the course topics



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- Reading a novel and engaging in discussion over the reading
- Reading independently and participating in class assignments and discussions
- Unit 1 Pre-AP Performance Task: Analyzing an Argument
- Unit 2 Pre-AP Performance Task: Writing a Literary Analysis
- Unit 3 Performance Task: Writing a Synthesis Argument
- Unit 4 Performance Task: Analyzing Pivotal Words and Phrases
- Preparing for EOC

During each unit, students will be responsible for independently reading a book from the pre-approved choice list. At the end of the unit, students will independently complete a project over the book for a Major grade. The school does have some copies of some of the books that students may check out. We do not have copies of all of the books. Students may also purchase their own copies or borrow from the library.
