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### COURSE DESCRIPTION

Spanish 2 is a high school level course that builds on the foundational skills acquired in Spanish 1, aiming to further develop students' abilities in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. The course continues to emphasize communication skills and cultural understanding.

By the end of Spanish 2, students are expected to reach the **Novice-High to Intermediate-Low** proficiency level according to the ACTFL (American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages) guidelines. This means students will be able to:

- use memorized phrases and recombined vocabulary to create simple sentences on familiar topics;
- manage simple, predictable communication, ask and answer questions, and create simple sentences;
- understand simple phrases and sentences in predictable and everyday contexts on familiar topics with familiar vocabulary;
- produce short, simple sentences on familiar topics, and respond to basic questions in written form.

### COURSE ACTIVITIES (What we will be doing)

Students will listen, speak, read, and write in Spanish daily.

Due to the nature and importance of in-class work, active participation is necessary in Spanish class and is the single most important factor for student success. Students are required to pay attention and come to class ready to be active participants. They are required to demonstrate their ability to read, speak, write, or listen in Spanish. They may also be required to identify vocabulary or explain cultural/historical information. Assignments completed in class or as homework include but are not limited to: translation, answering questions, illustrations, flash cards, or storytelling/writing. Any assignments completed in class or for homework may be taken for a grade.
