THE COMMUNITY

The Community:

An education-oriented community with high expectations for its schools, the Half Hollow Hills Central School District is located in a residential area of 48,000 people in the central part of Long Island, approximately 40 miles from New York City. Providing for the education of more than 8,850 students, the school district has five elementary, two middle and two high schools.

Accreditation:

Half Hollow Hills Schools are fully accredited by the New York State Department of Education.

College Representatives and On-site Decision Visits:

In addition to hosting semi-annual Mini-College Days, our high school counseling departments invite and host college representatives throughout the year to meet with students. Many local colleges participate in "On-site" Decision days, as well.



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CURRICULUM & PROGRAMS

The Half Hollow Hills K-12 program is designed to meet the individual needs of all students. Our diverse population includes many students at various levels of educational development. Our high schools offer strong academic programs, including 31 Advanced Placement courses, 25 Honors and/or college-level courses offered in collaboration with Stony Brook University (ACE Program) and Long Island University (High School Scholars Program). Students have an opportunity to earn the AP Capstone Diploma™ or the AP Seminar and Research Certificate™ based on AP exam performance.

“Project Lead the Way” Engineering courses sponsored by the Rochester Institute of Technology are available. The “Senior Experience” program is available for a select group of students that combines English 12 and Government/Economics into a Humanities-based curriculum. Incorporated into this program is a required year-long professional internship focused on career exploration. A select group of students participate in our competitive Independent Research Programs, culminating in various national events & competitions. Many students enroll in Independent Studies in World Languages, including Arabic, Cantonese, Japanese, Hebrew, Hindi, Greek, Russian, and Urdu.

Several students participate in the BOCES Wilson Tech Program during their junior and/or senior year. Others audition to participate in the BOCES Long Island High School for the Arts School, available to juniors & seniors. Both high schools offer extensive extra-curricular club and organizational activities as well as interscholastic athletic programs, intramural sports, and community service opportunities.

COURSE WEIGHTING POLICY

Weighting of courses affects a student’s weighted average, which is computed at the end of 11th grade. Student transcripts indicate both the true & weighted average. Our schools utilize a 100 point grading scale. No grade (true or weighted) ever exceeds 100. The multiplication formula for computing weighted averages is described below. The examples are based on an 80 final course grade:

AP Course Final Avg.= 80%	Honors Course Final Avg.= 80%	Regents Course Final Avg.= 80%
100 – 80 = 20; the 20 is multiplied by .50 = 10; 10 quality points are then added to the original 80 average = 90 weighted average.	100 – 80 = 20; the 20 is multiplied by .30 = 6; 6 quality points are then added to the original 80 average = 86 weighted average.	100 – 80 = 20; the 20 is multiplied by .10 = 2; 2 quality points are then added to the original 80 average = 82 weighted average.
*Electives and Physical Education Courses receive <u>no weight</u> in the course average.		

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Students who maintain a 93% cumulative average (based on the weighted averages of AP/Honors courses and the true average of all other courses) through the mid-point of their junior year and beyond are eligible for the National Honor Society.
