## Course Content: Selecting and Using Course Materials

“Issues that might, from particular social, historical, or cultural viewpoints, be considered controversial, including references to ethnicities, nationalities, religions, races, dialects, gender, or class, may be addressed in texts that are appropriate for the AP English Literature and Composition course. Fair representation of issues and peoples may occasionally include controversial material. Since AP students have chosen a program that directly involves them in college level work, participation in this course depends on a level of maturity consistent with the age of high school students who have engaged in thoughtful analyses of a variety of texts. The best response to controversial language or ideas in a text might well be a question about the larger meaning, purpose, or overall effect of the language or idea in context. AP should have the maturity, skill, and will to seek the larger meaning of a text or issue through thoughtful research.” This statement is from College Board, but it also applies to Dual Credit students.

## AI in this Classroom:

One of the main goals of this class is for you to become a better writer/communicator. For this to happen, you will have to read and write a lot. My job is to provide feedback so that your abilities can improve. In order for me to do this, I must be able to read YOUR writing. I need to recognize YOUR voice.
