K. b. SSFUSD Testing

Comments:

I encourage SSFUSD to accept CUE COVID-19 test results for students attending class under modified quarantine. Recognizing these quick, accurate tests would improve school safety, minimize unnecessary missed class time, ease the burden on families who have access to them, and free up public resources for families who don't.

- In its "COVID-19 Testing Options" document, the San Mateo County Office of Education specifically lists CUE tests as an appropriate test for "unvaccinated students who are close contacts, to remain in school for a modified quarantine."

- CUE COVID are accurate (97.8%) molecular NAAT tests (similar to PCR) that provide results in 20 minutes, whereas the county testing sites can take up to 3 days to return to results. Given that the CA Department of Public Health states that "[if] the turnaround time is longer than 2 days, response testing with molecular tests is not an effective screening method," permitting molecular tests with quicker results would improve school safety. Further, if students with access to CUE systems can use those results for school it would take strain off the county and school-based testing sites, hopefully shortening results turnaround times for everyone.

- Unlike some other at-home tests, the Cue system interfaces with an app and the company automatically reports test results to the relevant public health authorities in accordance with local, state, and federal requirements.

- Though there have been concerns about the accuracy of home tests, my personal experience at a county-endorsed testing site was not materially different from administering a home test: I took my child to a van completely enclosed in plexiglass and the attendant spoke to us through a speaker. I scanned a QR code to fill out all the "paperwork" online and didn't have to show any ID. The attendant dropped me a test kit through a chute, gave me a one-sentence explanation of how to administer it to my child, and asked me to drop it in a slot in the back of the van once we were finished. The main difference was that I had to scour the internet for a last-minute appointment, spend 45 minutes driving to and from the closest test site with an opening, and have my child miss two days of school waiting for results.
