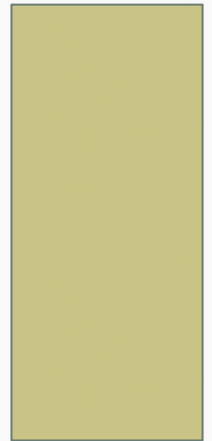

# Academics (AM Session)

- Each cluster was led by an Academic Teacher *and* an all-day SMCL facilitator
- BellXcel partnered with Scholastic to create an *engaging, rigorous, and student-centered* curriculum
- Lessons focused on language and literacy for both whole group & small group centers: teacher led & facilitator led
- Lesson plan template provided to guide planning that's data-driven, differentiated, and incorporates growth mindset into lessons.
- An Academic Coach dedicated to *each* site.

# Enrichment (PM Session)

- Each cluster was led by Teacher Assistant and Enrichment Teacher.
- Most clusters implemented a quiet time for scholars to regenerate for the afternoon enrichment.
- Focus on STEAM, SEL Growth, Mindfulness and Yoga.
- Enrichment themes included: Engineering, Force & Motion, Robots, and Chemistry
- Enrichment themes were connected to literacy lessons
- On Site experiences: Try It Truck and Imagination Playground from SMCL. Puppet Show, Science Assembly, Cascada de Flores, and Petting Zoo from SSF Library.

- Closed community time with reciting the Scholar Pledge

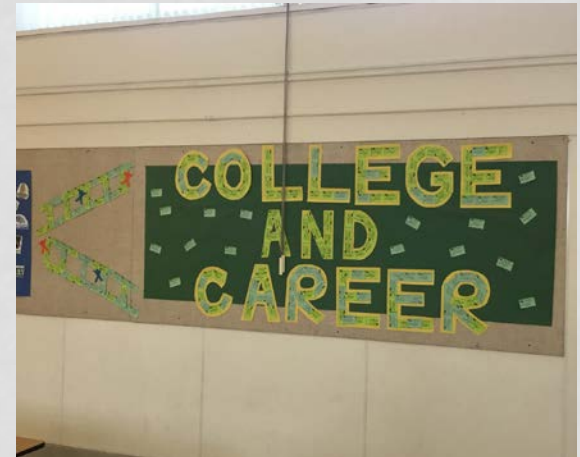

# Program Overview

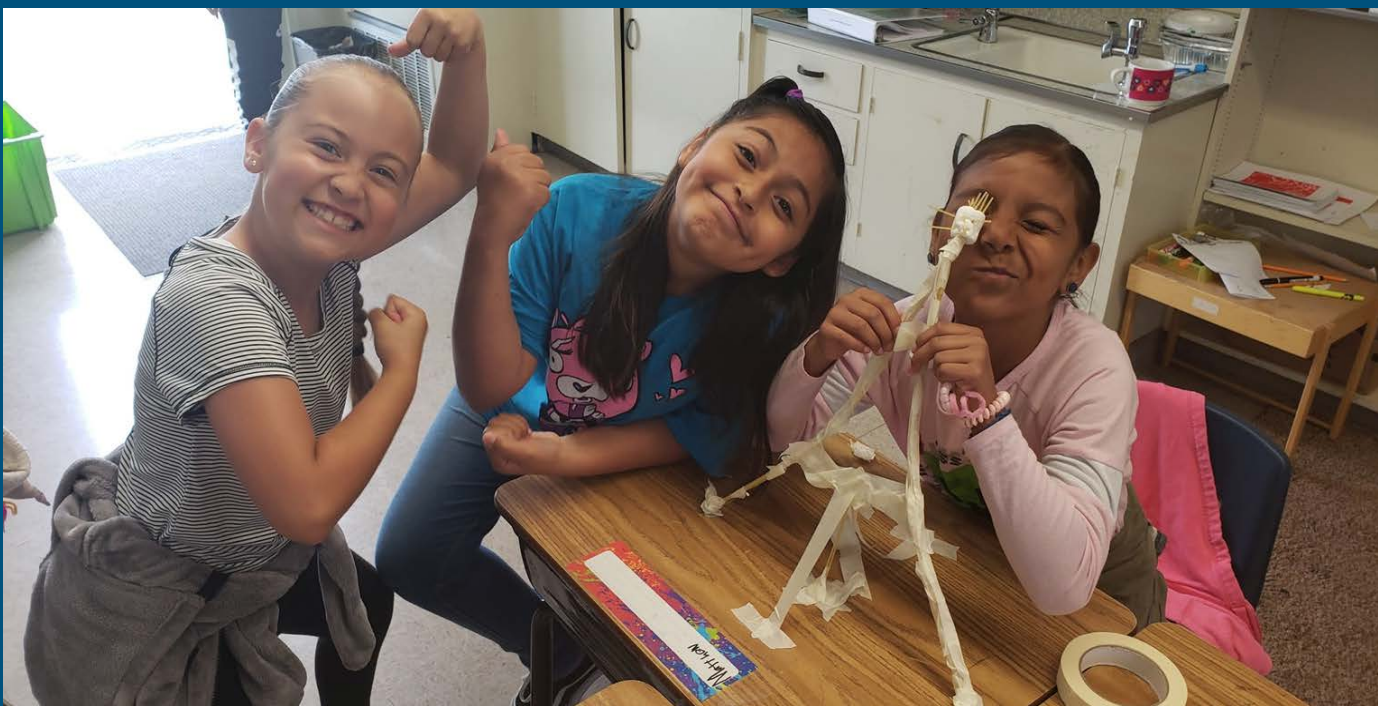
- Three 3rd grade classes, 4th grade classes and 5th grade classes; two 6th grade classes, 7th grade classes and 8th grade classes

# The Arts Program

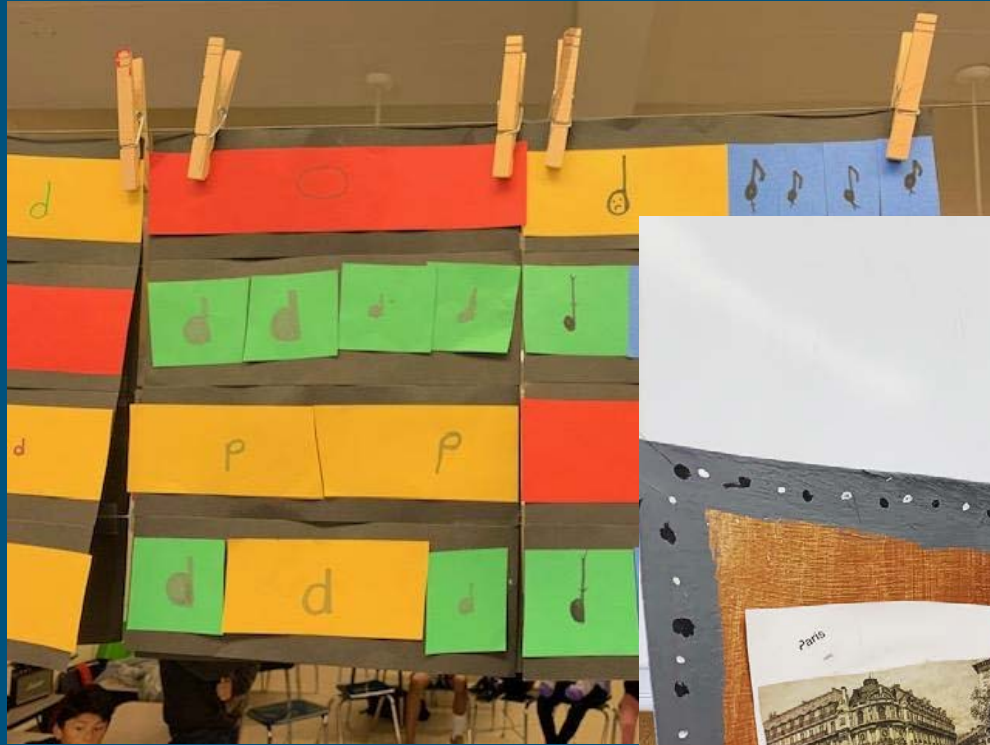
Goal: To develop students' creative expression

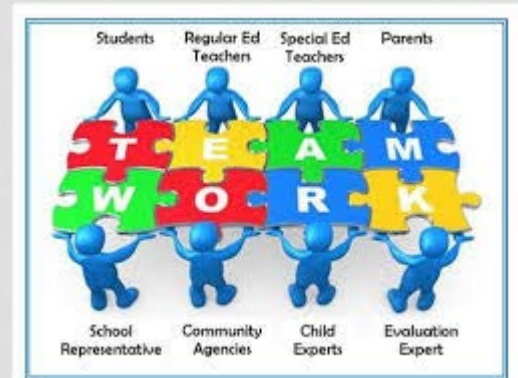

# ESY Defined

- Authorized under both federal (IDEA) and state law
- Special education and related services that:
  - ❖ Meet state standards
  - ❖ Are provided to a special education student beyond the district's normal school year
  - ❖ Are provided in accordance with student's IEP
  - ❖ Are provided at no cost to parents
  - ❖ Are provided only if IEP team determines that services are needed for student to receive FAPE.



# ESY Staff

- 2 Preschool teachers and 6 Paraprofessionals
- 6 Elem. teachers and 20 Paraprofessionals
- 2 Middle School teachers and 3 Paraprofessionals
- 3 High School teachers and 7 Paraprofessionals
- 1 Postsecondary (ATP) teacher and 5 Paraprofessionals
- Service Providers:
  - 2 Speech and Language Pathologist (SLP)
  - 1 Occupational Therapist (OT)
  - 1 Adapted Physical Education (APE) Specialist
  - 1 Physical Therapist (PT)
  - 1 Vision and Mobility Specialist; and
  - Behavior Management Therapists
  - Mental Health Specialists, and other specialists available on campus as support services for students

  - Life Skills

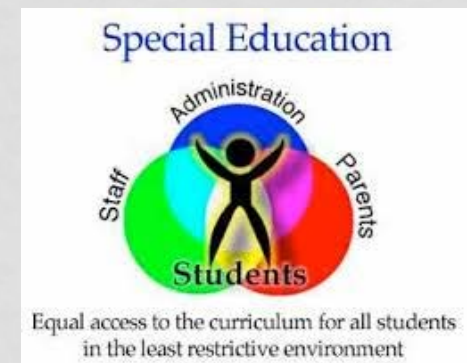

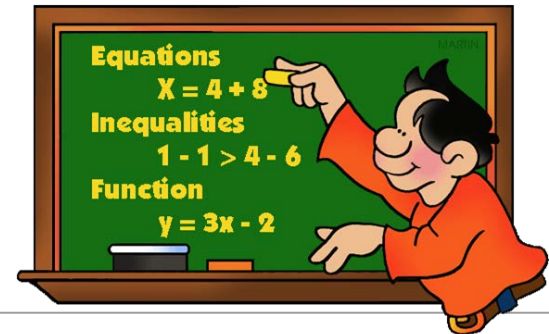
