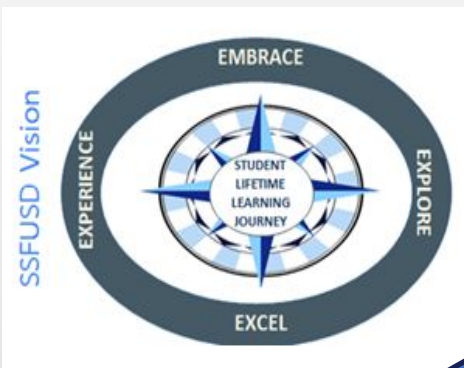


District Goals

LCAP GOAL 1

Academic Achievement

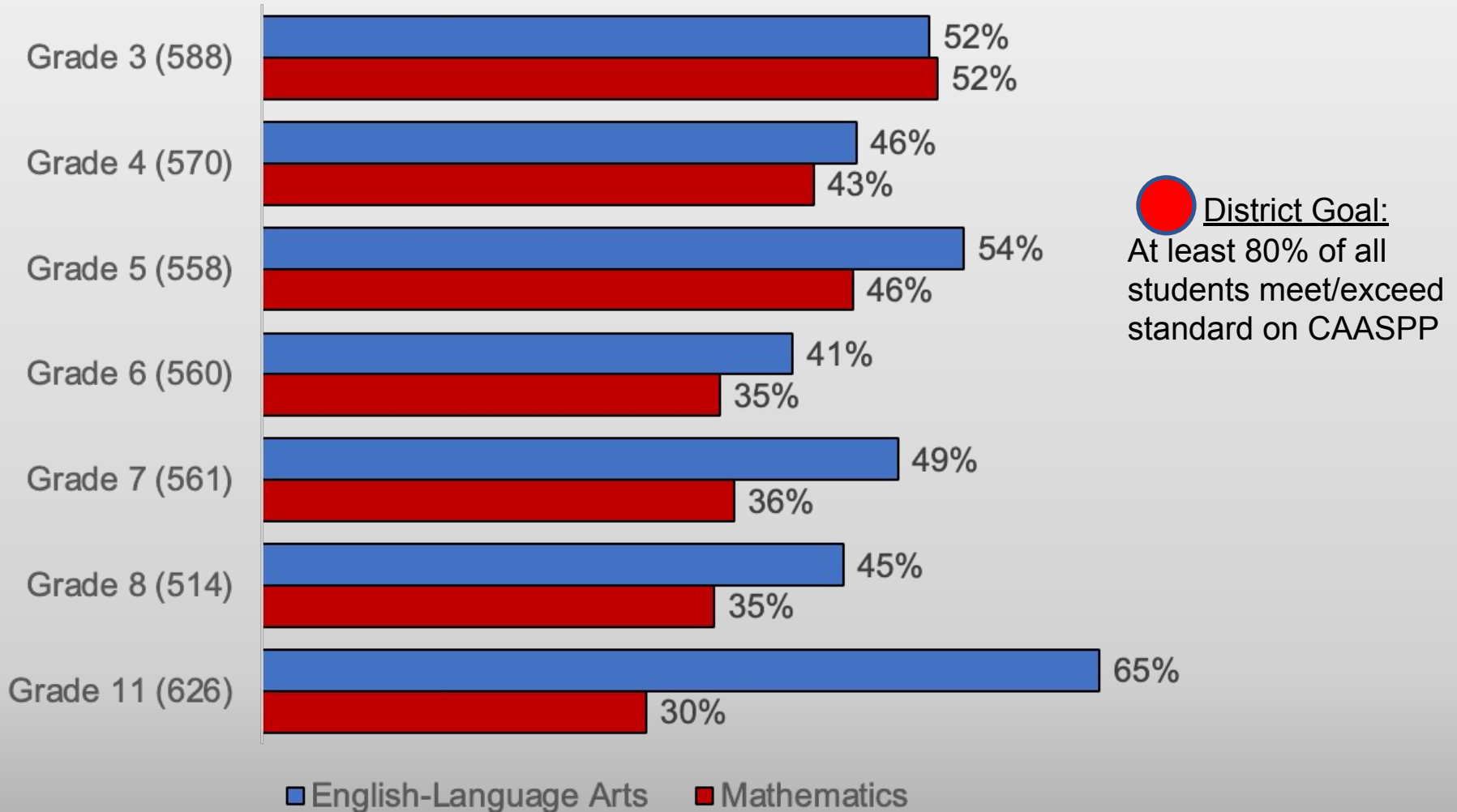

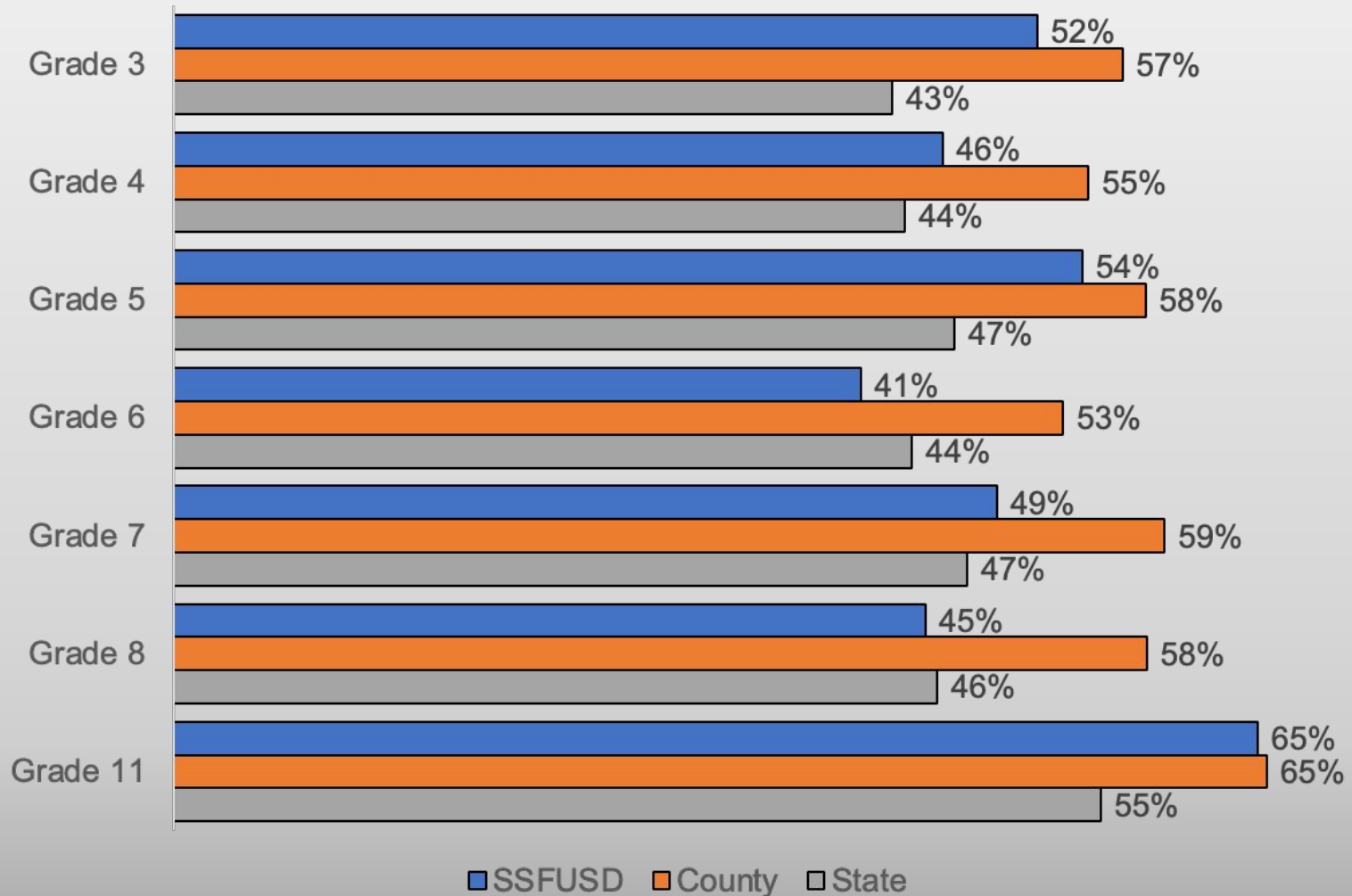
Students Meeting/Exceeding Standard - by Grade Level





Smarter Balanced English-Language Arts: SSFUSD, County, State

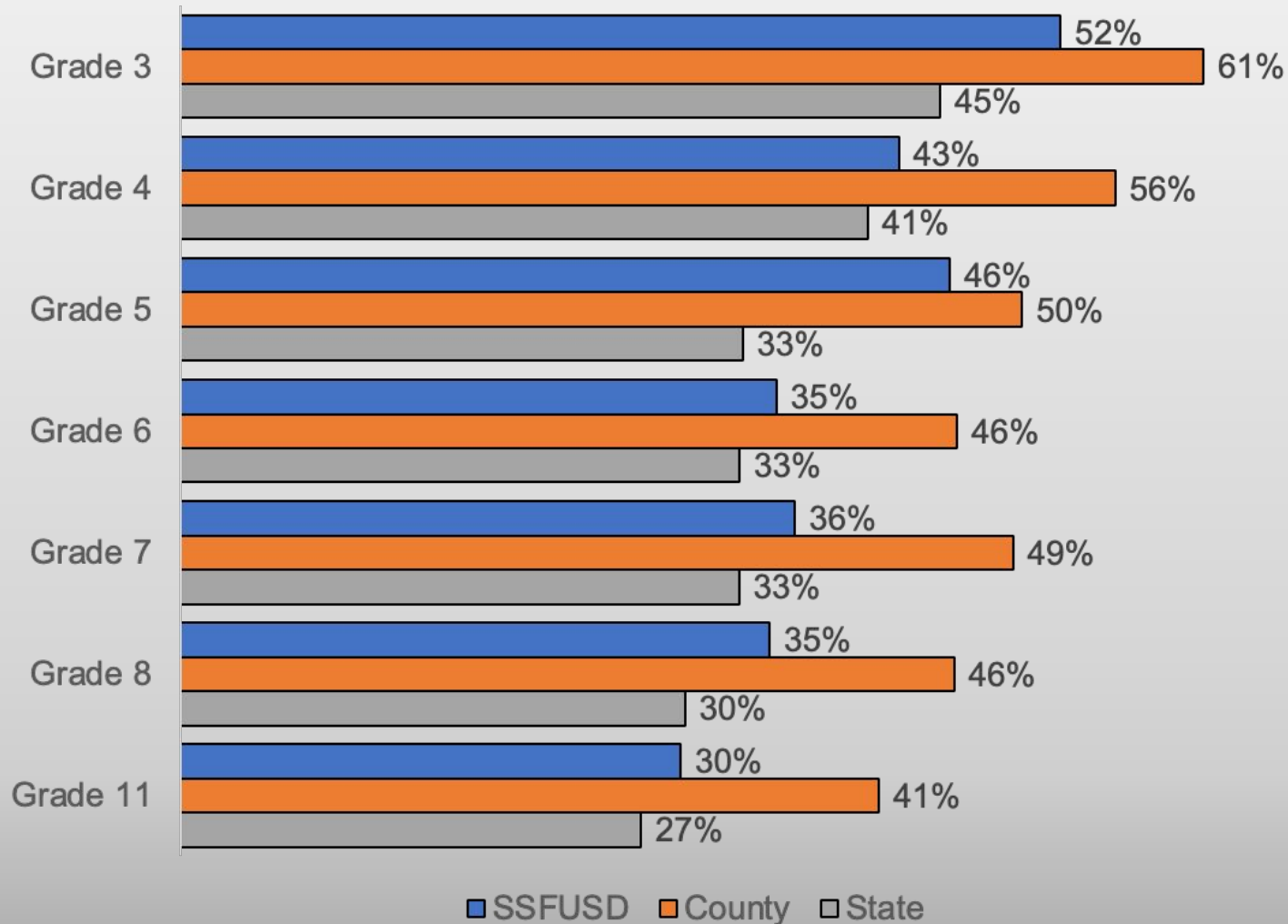
Percentage of Students Meeting/Exceeding Standard - by Grade Level





Smarter Balanced Mathematics: SSFUSD, County, State

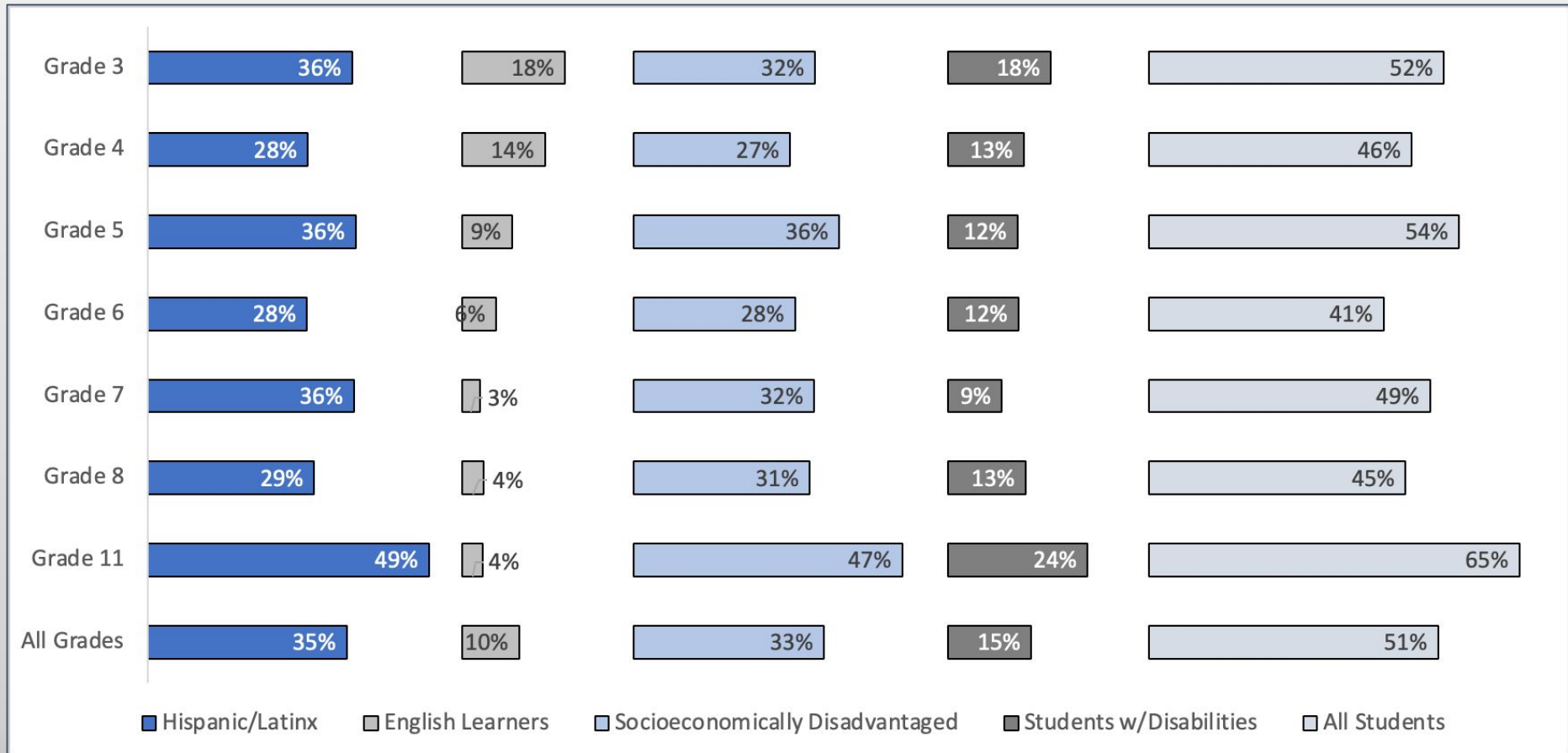
Percentage of Students Meeting/Exceeding Standard - by Grade Level

Percentage of Students Meeting/Exceeding Standard - by Grade Level

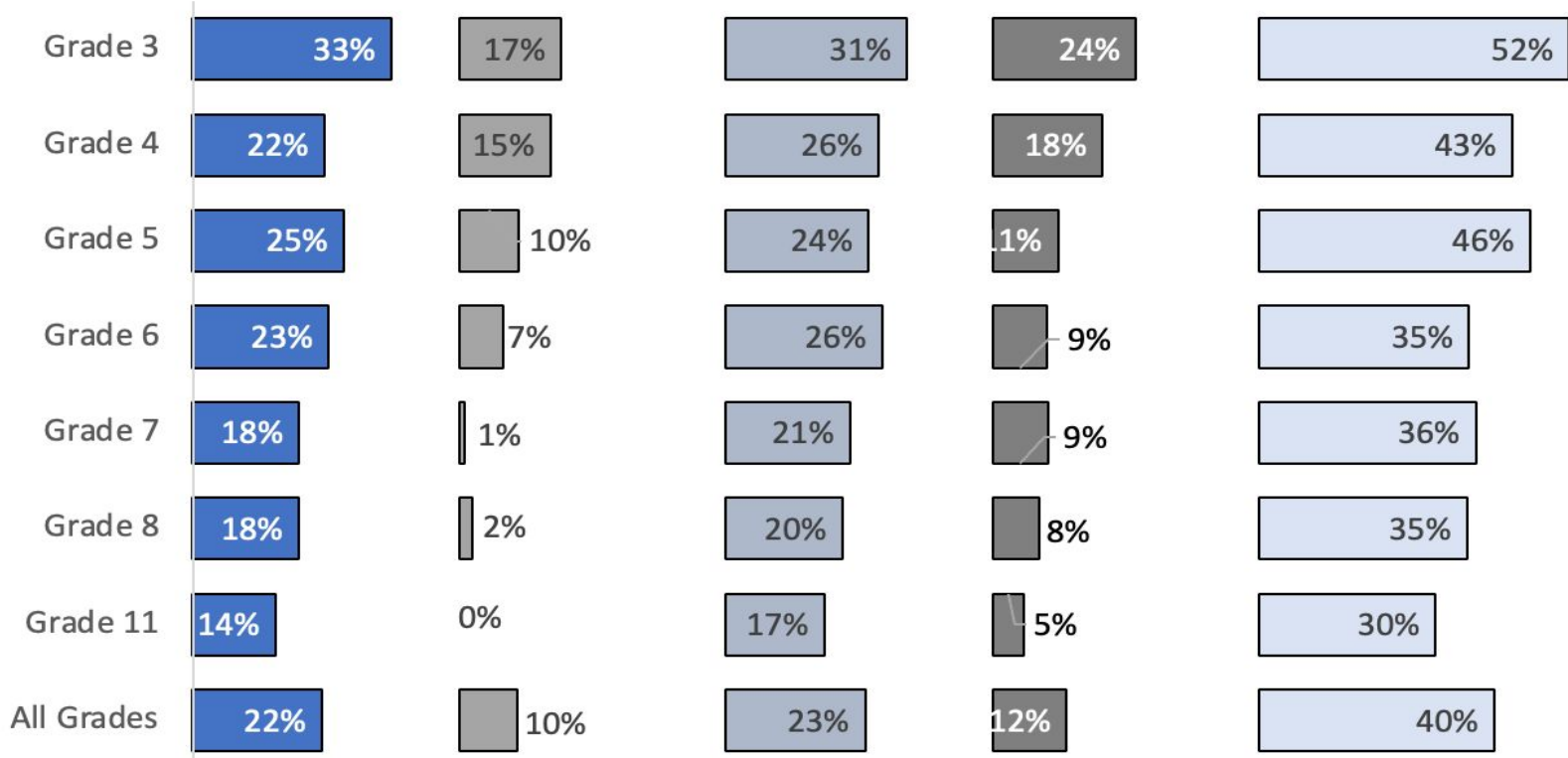

Percentage of Students Meeting/Exceeding Standard - by Grade Level



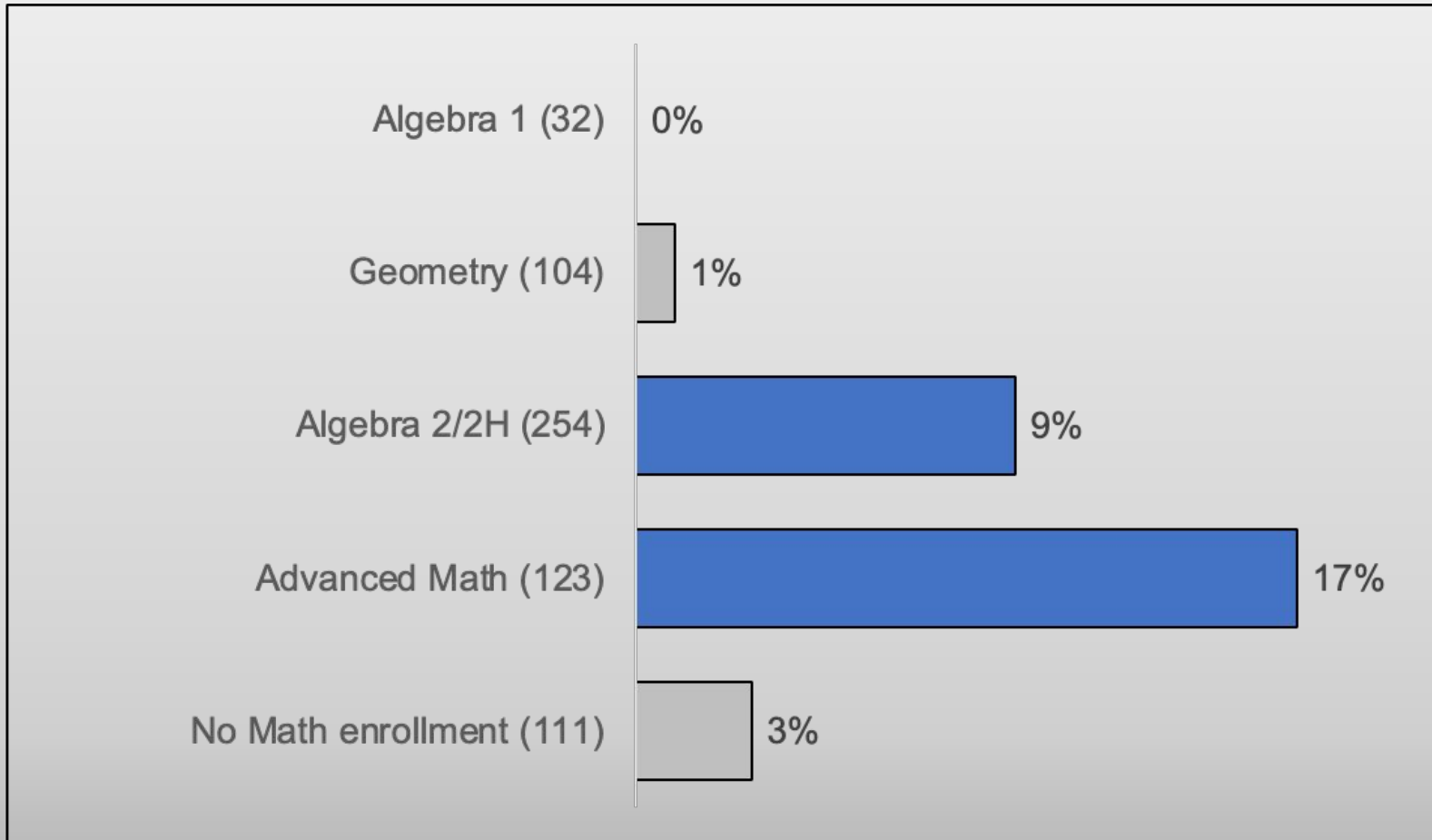

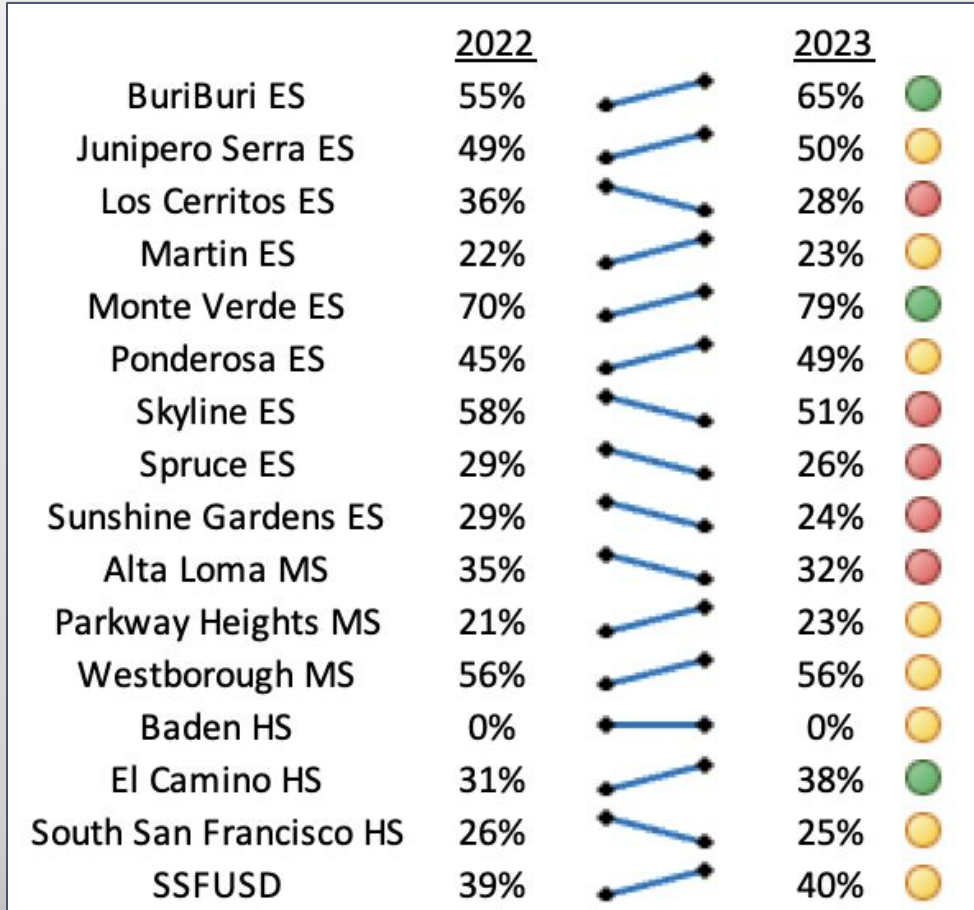

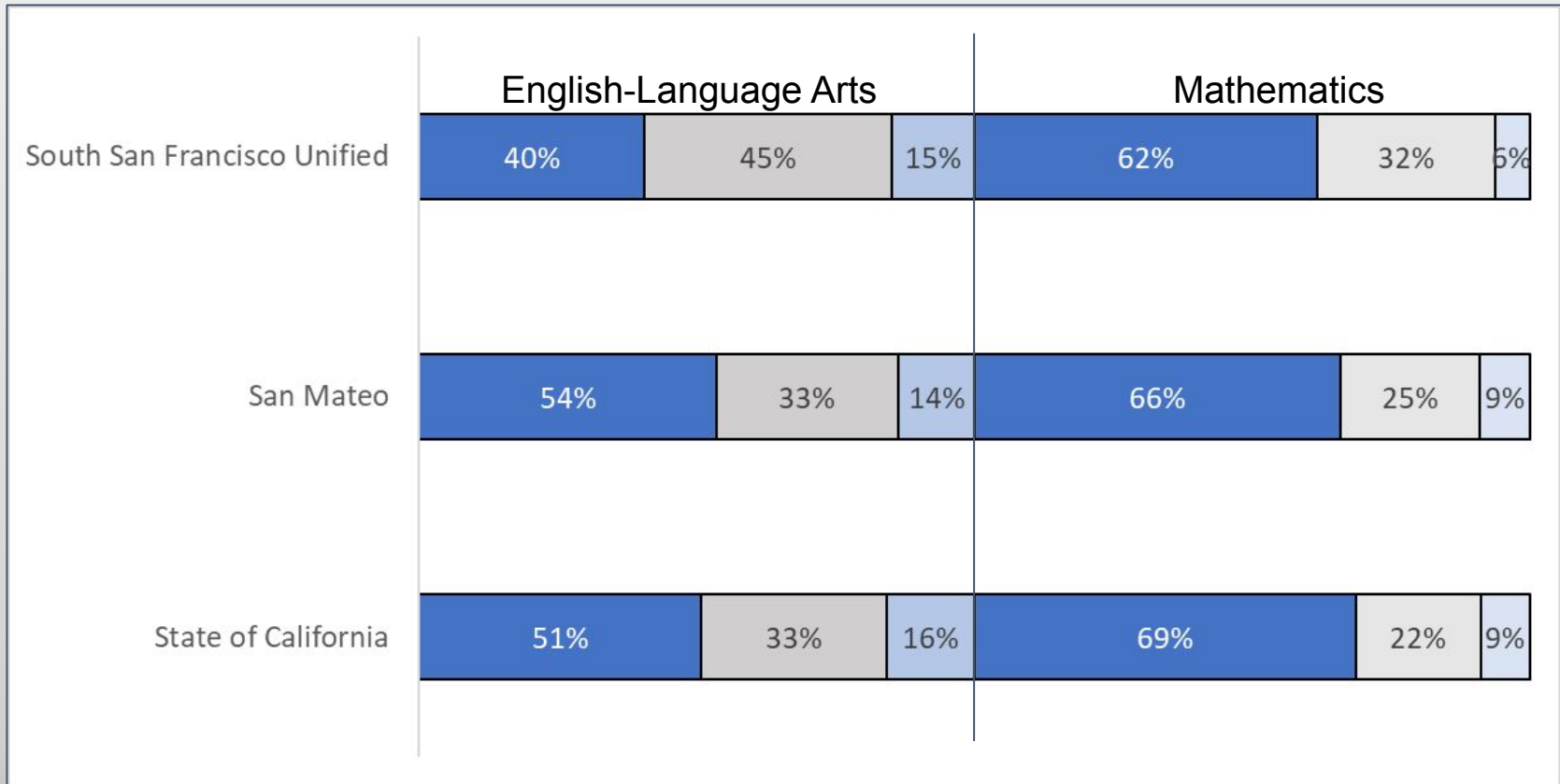

- From 2019 to 2023:
- Declined in Smarter Balanced ELA and Mathematics
 - Increased in CAST
 - Declined in CA Alternate ELA and Mathematics

Note: In 2021, due to distance learning and remote testing, participation rates in SSFUSD were below the target 95%, ranging from 29% to 96%. Because the CA Alternate Assessments were administered only in person, participation was very low.

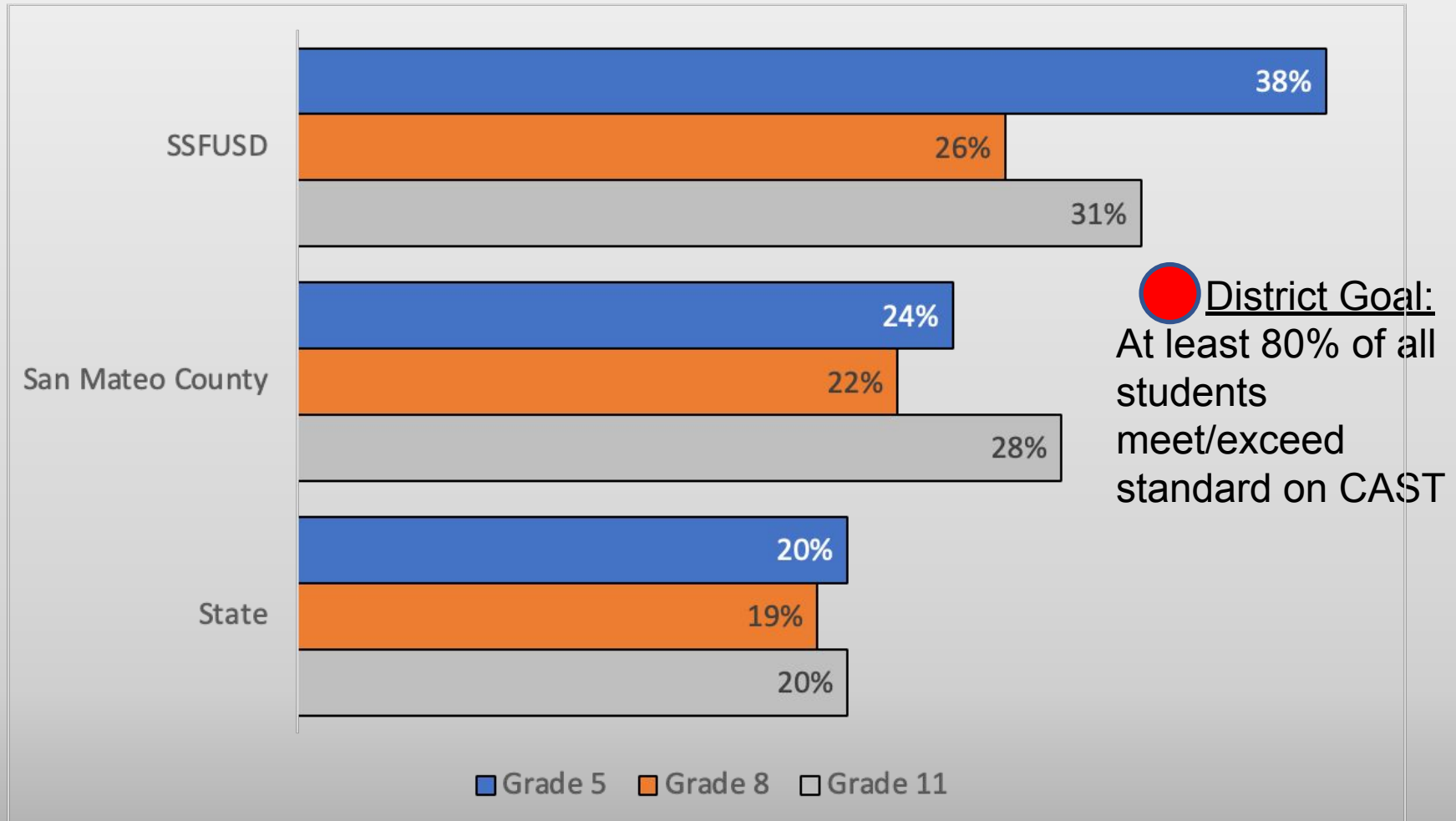

CA Science Test: SSFUSD, County, State

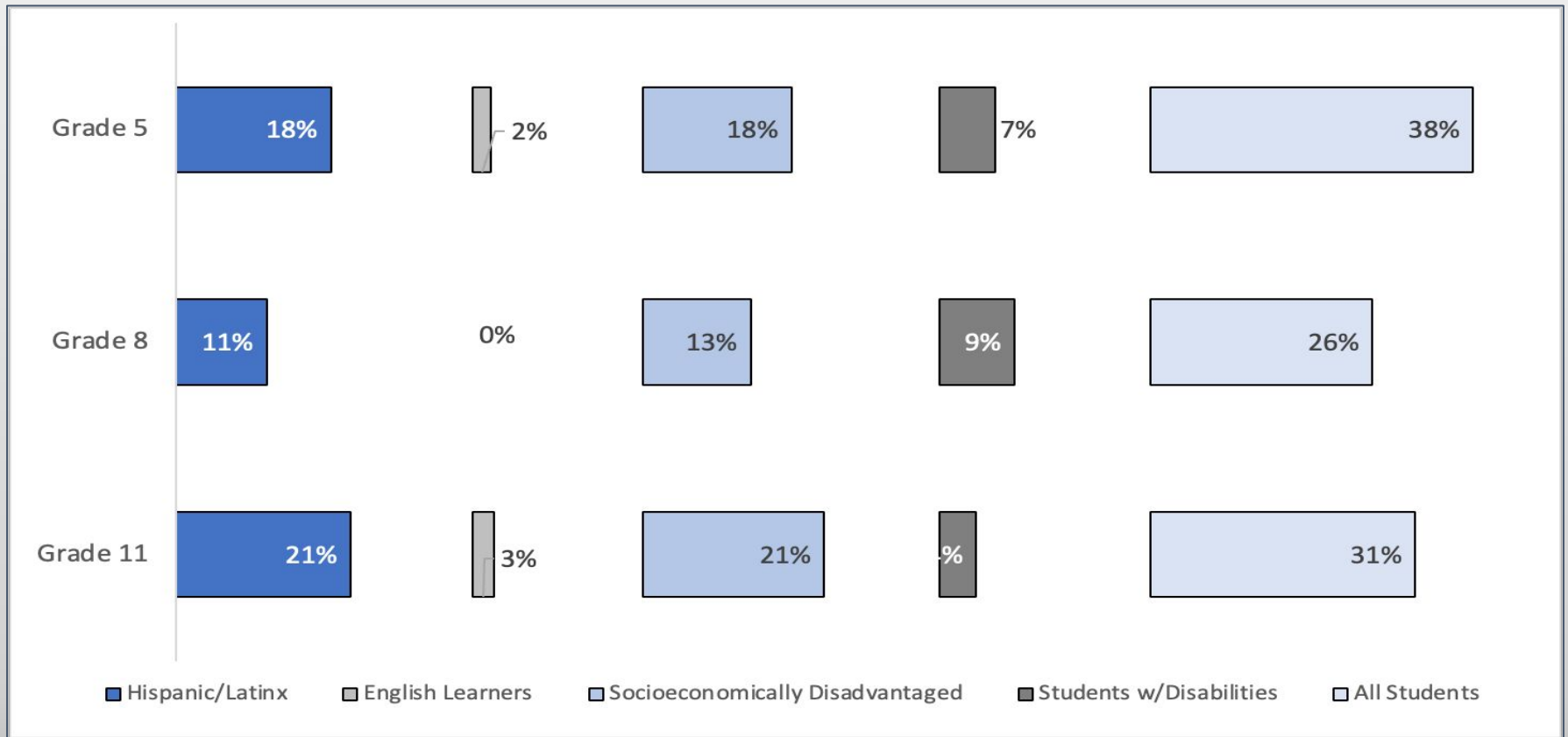
Percentage of Students Meeting/Exceeding Standard - by Grade Level

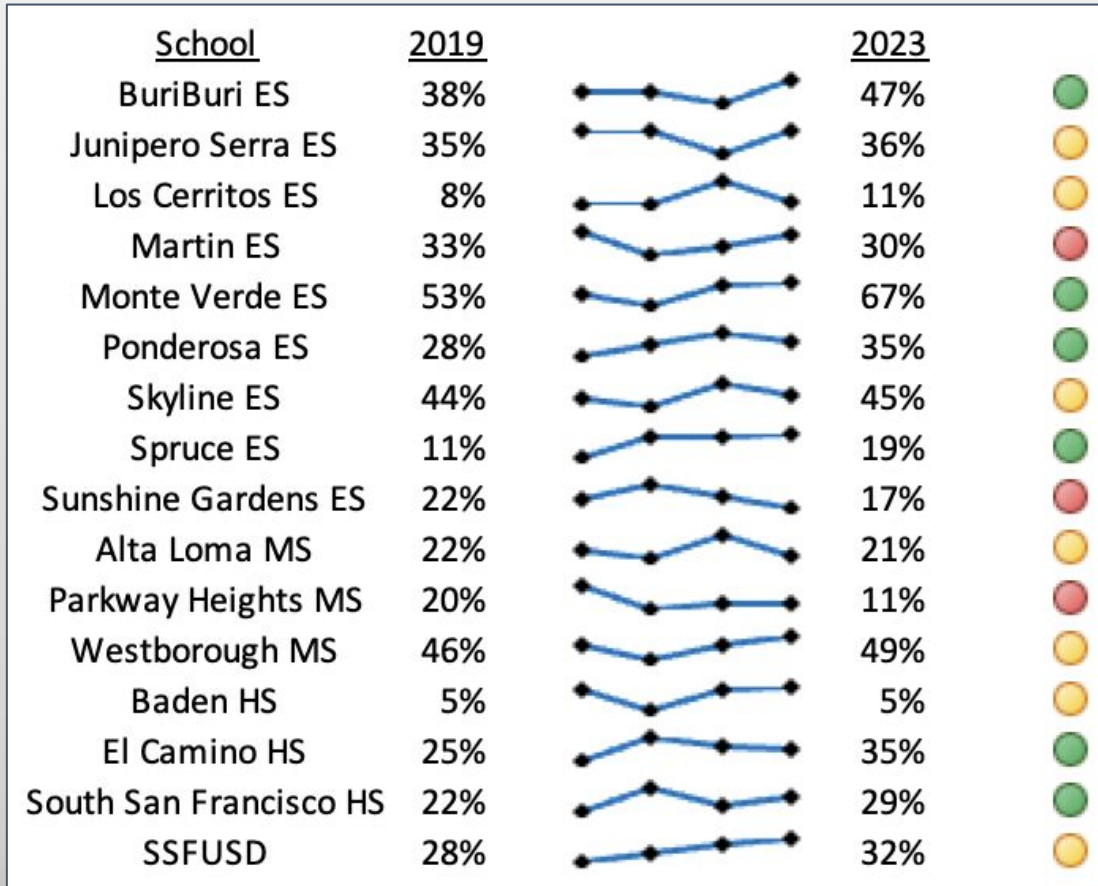

Key Takeaways

- In line with county and state, 2023 results largely maintained from previous year
- Several target student groups and schools are making incremental progress
- Performance in early grades among all student groups
- Mathematics is a continued focus; watch for impact of changes in course-taking at secondary
- Progress in science with implementation of Next Generation Science Standards and instructional strategies
