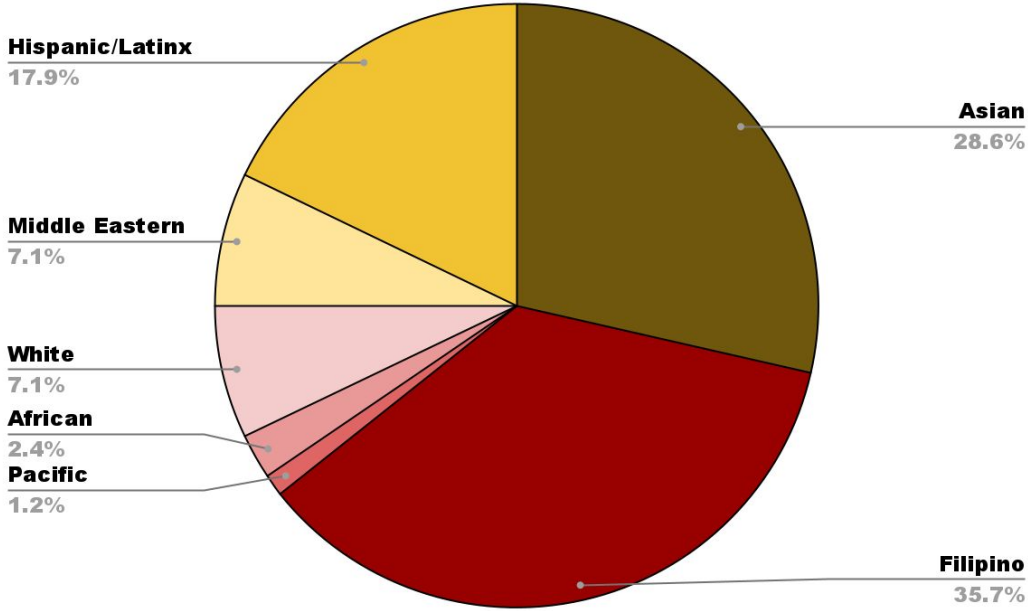

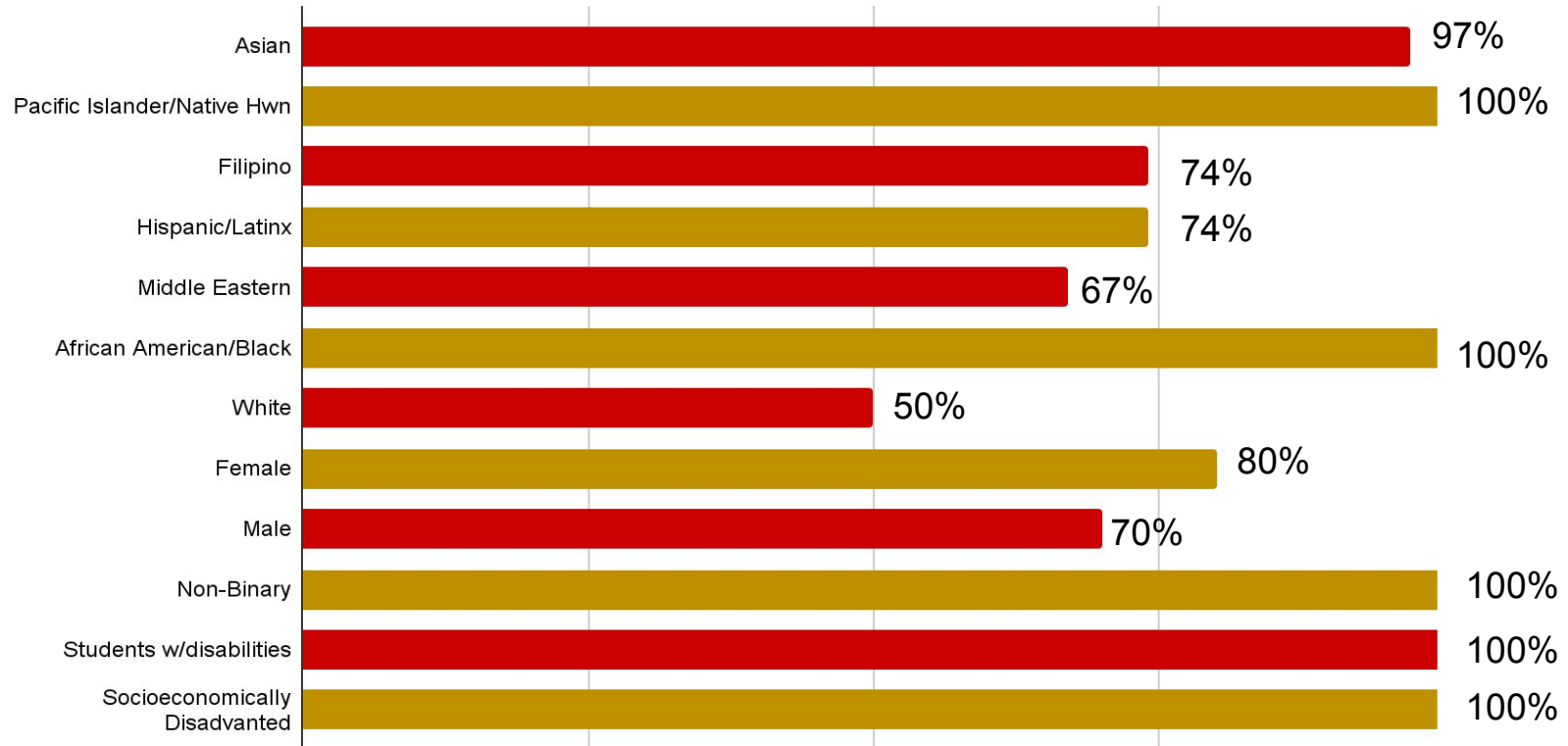

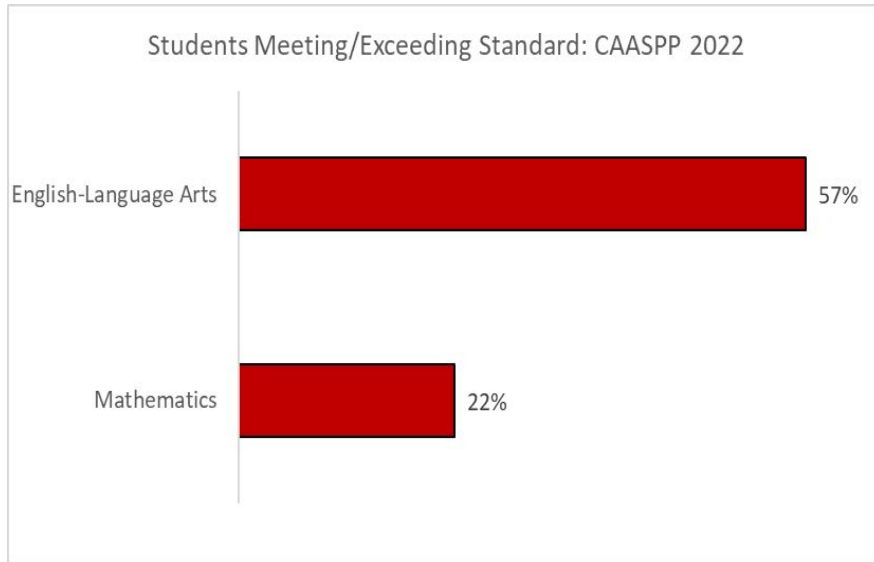

Program Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the program, Middle College students will reach the following outcomes:

Social Justice (75%)

- Middle College students will be able to identify unfairness on the individual level (e.g., biased speech) and injustice at the institutional or systemic level (e.g., discrimination).

Social Emotional (75%)

- Middle College students will develop mindfulness skills of themselves and others that appreciates diversity and conveys respect.
- Middle College students will learn to set goals that enhance their social emotional well-being and develop their leadership skills.

Academic Standing (90%)

- Middle College students will maintain good academic standing (2.0 GPA or higher) per semester.

Educational Goal Achievement (90%)

- Middle College students will graduate w/their high school diploma and minimum of 36 college units their senior year (2-year program).
- Middle College students will identify their academic and professional passions, talents, and interests, and create a plan to pursue them

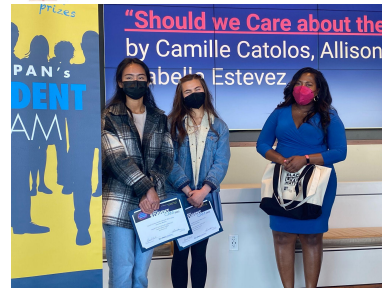

Educational Access Center

The EAC provides accommodations, counseling, assistive technology, and support services to students with documented disabilities in accordance with State and Federal law. We currently have 7 students from SSFUSD that have an IEP or 504 plan.

Food Insecurity

For all students in our program we are providing them with lunch vouchers and ensure they have continued access to our SparkPoint center for groceries. We also provide snacks for in between classes.

Personal Counseling

Personal counseling offers brief confidential individual counseling, crisis intervention, mental health and substance abuse assessments, and community referrals. Talking about issues and concerns in a safe and confidential environment can enable students to become more successful in their classes and personal life.

Academic Coaching/Tutoring

We provide academic coaches and tutors for all of students in both their high school and college courses. We have embedded tutors in our high school

SUPPORT SERVICES



Retention Specialists

Middle College has two Retention Specialists one for each grade cohort. They meet with the students regularly to ensure students are feeling welcome and adjusting to their classes and new learning environment. They support students emotionally and academically. Meet with teachers and college professors to ensure academic success.



Open Office Hours

Our high school teachers have open office hours 3 hours a day to develop relationships with our students, provide extra academic support, answer questions, go over assignments, grades etc.

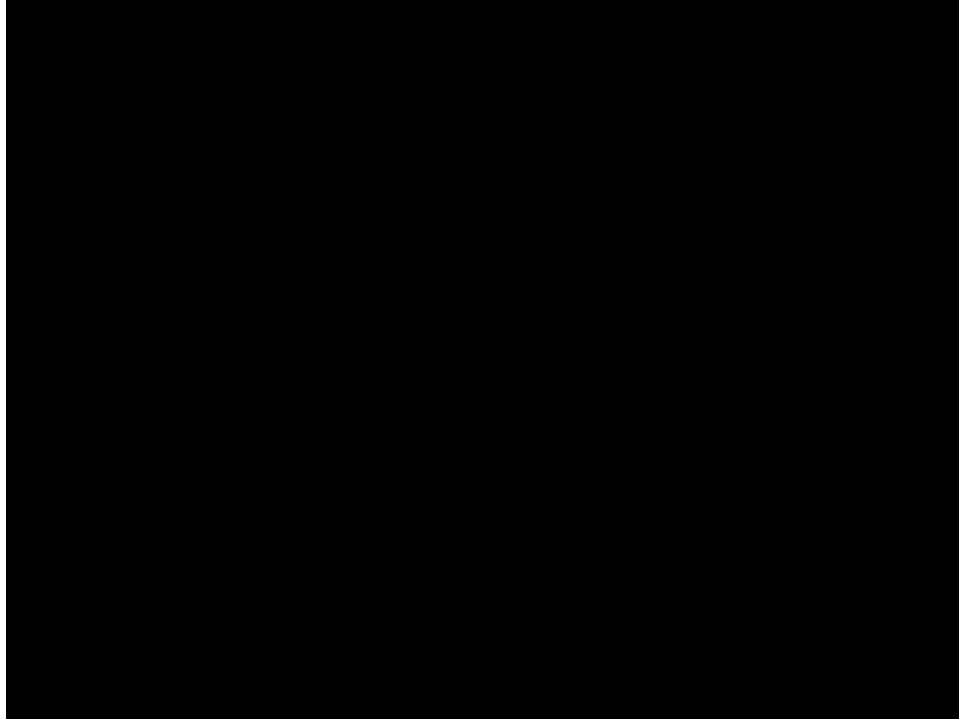


Middle College Lounge
