

DROP-OFF / PICK-UP

- Occurs at the North Campus Doors of the high school
- Enter the parking lot or park along W 213th (east side of the street)
 - Cafeteria opens at 7:00 for early arrival and breakfast
 - Students remain in cafeteria until 8:10
 - After 8:18 - students enter through the HS front entrance
- Campus Drive - reserved for School Buses and Transportation Vans
- Walkers may enter through Campus Drive
- Bike Racks - located on the North Side of the building (LOCK IT UP!)
- Appointments - pick up & sign out in the MS office

- Dismissal at 2:57






HOMEROOM - 8/21 ONLY (1ST DAY)

DISTRICT CELL PHONE POLICY

- OFF and AWAY during the instructional day.
 - 7:30 - 2:57 if you have a 1st period.
 - 8:15 - 2:57 if you have a 2nd period.
- 1st Violation - confiscation, held in the office, student pick up at the end of the day.
- 2nd Violation - confiscation, held in the office, parent pick up at the end of the day. Extended Tuesday Detention issued.
- 3rd Violation - confiscation, held in the office, parent pick up and meeting with the Associate Principal. 3 days of ISR issued.
- 4th Violation - confiscation, held in the office, parent pick up and meeting with the Associate Principal. Progressive OSS issued.

DISTRICT CELL PHONE POLICY

- If phones are not picked up by 3:30 phone will remain in the main office until the next school day. If this occurs on a Friday, the phone will remain locked up until the following school day.

MACBOOK EXPECTATIONS

- ALL students issued a MacBook Air, with case, and charger.
 - Device issued within the first few days of school.
 - ***Emergency Medical Forms and Technology Agreement MUST be completed before device is issued.***
- Permitted to take them home.
- Student is responsible for charging the device each night.
- Lost charger - students may purchase a new one in the Innovation Center.
- Broken Computer - Innovation Center will provide a loaner.
- MacBook Insurance - \$50 with a \$50 deductible. Intentional damage may result in a higher deductible and/or student charged to replace the device.

DRESS CODE

- Shoes/sandals must be worn at all times.

 - 4th Tardy = Extended Tuesday Detention






