At Cross Keys Middle School, we host parent nights to assist parents in learning about the MAP assessment and reading the reports. We host curriculum nights to ensure they know about our core content and how to use the Infinite Campus to monitor their child's progress. Spring and Fall parent conferences are held for open feedback. We also set up tables with several laptops where parents can get tutorials provided by staff members showing them how to check the parent portal and monitor their child's progress in school.
