#### **ABOUT US**

Burlingame High School (BHS) is a comprehensive four-year public high school located 15 miles south of San Francisco. The suburban setting of Burlingame is home to 30,000 residents. BHS is one of seven high schools in the San Mateo Union High School District (SMUHSD) and enjoys close ties with and receives tremendous support from the city and community of Burlingame. SMUHSD is a district with open enrollment, and BHS students come from the entire district boundary area. Approximately 1,600 students attend the school and there are 90 credentialed personnel to support their learning (95 with counselors included).

#### **OUR STUDENTS**

Students at Burlingame High School are dedicated to improving their school and larger community through participation in numerous programs such as school culture initiatives, athletics, clubs, service learning, and volunteerism. We offer a broad curriculum to support students as they explore their academic, personal, and career goals. Our school gives students the opportunity to investigate their passions through various coordinated opportunities in job shadowing, peer tutoring, and concurrent enrollment at local community colleges as well as dual enrollment courses taught on our campus in collaboration with local colleges. Additionally, we house an Adult Transition Program (ATC) for 18–22 year-old students continuing to receive services through Special Education.




