## Classroom Expectations

### Expectation 1: Be respectful

When expectations are not met, the teacher will first provide verbal guidance and reminders. If the behavior persists, parents will be contacted to collaborate on reinforcing expectations at home. In severe or continuous cases, a referral will be made to the school office.

Positive reinforcement, visual aids, and clear routines will help students learn and meet these expectations.



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## Attendance Policy & Its Importance

Regular and punctual attendance is fundamental to academic success. In first grade, students build on new skills every day, and absences can create gaps in their learning that are difficult to close. Consistent attendance helps students maintain routines, develop social skills, and participate fully in the classroom community.

**Please notify the school office if your child will be absent.** Frequent or prolonged absences can significantly affect your child's ability to master the first-grade skills.

## Learning Objectives (Texas TEKS)

By the end of the first semester, students are expected to demonstrate proficiency in the following TEKS standards:

### English Language Arts and Reading (ELAR)

- **Phonological Awareness & Phonics:** Apply first-grade phonics skills to decode regular one-syllable and two-syllable words.
- **Fluency:** Read texts with accuracy, expression, and an appropriate pace.
- **Comprehension:** Identify the main purpose and key details of texts, and make connections between the text and personal experience.
- **Writing:** Write complete, coherent sentences with correct capitalization and punctuation.
- **Vocabulary:** Develop vocabulary through reading and word study.

### Mathematics

- **Numbers & Operations:** Add and subtract whole numbers within 20. Understand place value up to 100.
- **Geometry:** Identify, name, and describe two-dimensional and three-dimensional shapes, such as circles, squares, triangles, and cubes.
- **Measurement:** Tell time to the hour and half-hour. Measure the length of objects using non-standard units.
- **Algebraic Reasoning:** Use models to solve one-step word problems involving addition and subtraction.

### Science

- **Physical Science:** Identify properties of objects, including color, shape, size, and texture. Describe the effects of magnets.
- **Earth & Space Science:** Observe and describe the water cycle. Identify objects in the sky like the sun, moon, and stars.



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- **Life Science:** Identify the needs of living organisms (plants and animals), including food, water, light, and shelter.

## Social Studies

- **History & Culture:** Identify family customs and traditions, and describe American celebrations and symbols (e.g., Independence Day, Veterans Day).
- **Government & Civics:** Identify community leaders and describe their role.
- **Geography:** Use simple maps, globes, and charts to locate places.
