California Scholarship Federation (CSF)

CSF Life Members will wear a gold cord to wear at graduation; a CSF Gold Honor Seal will be affixed to their diplomas. Life Membership is awarded to students who have applied and qualified for

membership during four semesters (grades from sophomore, junior, and senior years) with at least one semester of membership during senior year. Life Membership requires application for membership using semester grades earned during their senior year.

Accordingly, seniors must apply in February using their grades from the fall semester of their senior year to earn Life Membership. If a senior does not meet the life membership requirements after the fall semester of his or her senior year, his or her spring semester grades may be considered. Seniors who need their eighth semester grades to qualify for life membership may not receive the gold cord for the graduation ceremony unless they take the initiative to reach out to the CSF advisor.

Caps and Gowns

The cost of the cap, gown and tassel is covered in the Graduation fee. Members from the Class of 2026 completed their cap and gown order form at Returning Student Orientation. You can also visit the [SMCHS Jostens Graduation Page](#) to order special graduation items and announcements.

Caps, gowns and tassels are issued to seniors on Tuesday, May 26, 2026, at the Graduation Practice. These are issued only to those who have met all academic requirements, are in good standing with the Discipline Office and are cleared of any financial obligations with the Business Office. The Lumen Christi Service Project, Junior and Senior Year

The Lumen Christi Service Project, Junior and Senior Year

The Christian service program at SMCHS provides an opportunity for students to encounter Jesus in the most vulnerable members of society. Through the service program, students have the opportunity to explore how God calls us personally to bring light (*Lumen Christi*) into the world.

The Lumen Christi Project: During junior and senior years, students serve with any non-profit whose outreach is direct (face-to-face) work with the vulnerable and marginalized. This includes serving people with disabilities, animals and the environment, people suffering economic and social poverty, and people who need companionship in their faith journey. All qualifying service opportunities must be **direct and in-person**. This is project is an extension of your educational and spiritual formation, where they are able to share the Light of Christ in our world. This is a graduation requirement for all students.

- The Lumen Christi Project requires 40 hours of direct service over the course of Theology 3 and Theology 4 or Philosophy 1 and Philosophy 2. (As opposed to the previous 20 hours each year).
- **“Roll Over” hours will be accepted-** Students can count any qualifying service hours toward Lumen Christi beginning in the summer before their Junior Year (June 1, 2024) and ending at the service hour **deadline on April 24, 2026.**
- All service hours, whether for the Lumen Christi project or extracurricular, must provide **direct (face-to-face) contact** with those being served over a sustained amount of time. **All agencies need to be nonprofit, except for hospitals or eldercare facilities.**
- Students use MobileServe as the online system to enter and verify all hours, both for their required hours, and hours done above the requirement.

- Indirect activities such as office work, fundraising, and donating money will continue to not be counted toward service hours.
- Students do not receive letter grades for their Lumen Christi project. Rather, completion of the project is a **graduation requirement. If a student does not complete their Lumen Christi project, he/she will not receive his/her diploma.**

The due date for this graduation requirement is **April 24, 2026**

Class Reunions

The first reunion for the Class of 2026 will be held in the summer of 2036. Typically, alumni form a committee to plan the reunion with help from the SM Eagle Foundation. Official reunions are traditionally held every ten years. Remember to notify the SM Eagle Foundation whenever your address changes so you will be notified of reunion dates and other alumni events. College Admissions

Senior year can be a whirlwind with all the college application deadlines - be sure to keep your college list and application deadlines organized! Know that your College Counselor is here to help and assist you during this process. Below are some important dates.

Counselor & Teacher LOR Requests and Surveys – August 25th.

All Teacher Letter of Recommendation requests must be officially submitted through Scoir by **Monday, August 25th** (this must be done through Scoir, NOT common app). For detailed instructions on requesting the Teacher LOR, please see your Senior College Counseling Handbook.

Finalizing Your College List:

Your college list should be finalized in Scoir under the “Applying” column in the “My Colleges” section by Friday, October 10th, for November 1 and later deadlines, August 15 for September 15 deadlines and September 15 for October 15 deadlines. Any changes to your list that you wish to make after this date will need to be approved and added by your College Counselor.

Grad Night

Grad Night 2026 is scheduled for May 28, 2026. Grad Night 2026 is a late-night party, organized by the Activities office to ensure a safe, drug and alcohol-free graduation celebration. Senior families will receive additional information, including specific location, times, ticketing and related information when it becomes available.

The National Commission against Drunk Driving has reported that drinking is the number one killer of teenagers. However, new campaigns to stop underage drinking by party-prone teens, such as Grad Night, have positively affected these statistics. SMCHS believes that our parents can offer graduates a graduation celebration that they will love, in a safe, drug and alcohol-free atmosphere.

In an effort to ensure a safe, drug and alcohol-free celebration, students are not allowed to bring food, drinks, book bags or large purses to this event.

Graduation

The graduation ceremony will be Thursday, May 28, 2026, at 10:00am at Honda Center in Anaheim. Admission is by ticket only. Graduates do not need a ticket for admission to the ceremony. Children 2 years and younger who will be lap-sitting will not need a ticket for admission. **Please note that a Graduation Announcement is not a valid ticket for admission.** Additional general admission tickets will be available for purchase during the spring semester.

Dress Code:

- Gentlemen should wear their cap and gown and dress shoes, dress slacks, dress shirt and a tie.
- Ladies should wear their cap and gown and nice dressy outfits.
- Corsages, leis or boutonniere may not be worn during the graduation ceremony.
- All students wear the medallion they received at the Baccalaureate Mass. NHS, CSF, IB students may also wear their hoods and cords. Only cords distributed by SMCHS may be worn during the graduation ceremony.

Graduation Announcements

Graduation announcements are often used by families to “announce” their student’s upcoming Graduation. The Graduation fee does not cover/include any graduation announcements, and these items may be ordered directly from Jostens. Orders may also be placed online through the SMCHS store on the Jostens website. Announcements will be distributed to seniors during lunch, at the end of April 2026. It is suggested that they be mailed to family and friends three weeks prior to graduation.

***Please note that a Graduation Announcement is not a valid ticket for admission for Graduation. Information about Graduation tickets will be communicated after January 2026.**

Graduation Fee

Each graduating Senior will be assessed a Graduation Fee of \$425. The fee was added to the FACTS tuition account at time of registration and is due with your August installment of tuition. Remember any FACTS fees, including the graduation fee, does impose an additional \$50 late fee for each month that remains unpaid. The Graduation Fee covers the expenses of the graduation ceremony, Baccalaureate Mass, yearbook signing luncheon, cap, and gown, etc. The Graduation fee is non-refundable and **does not** include the cost of the Talon Yearbook, Senior Tributes, Grad Night nor Graduation Announcements.

Graduation Policy

In order to receive a diploma from Santa Margarita Catholic High School, a student must:

- Have successfully completed a minimum of 270 credits of coursework.
- Transfers from non-Catholic schools complete at least 20 credits of Theology at Santa Margarita.
- Have no un-remediated grades of “F” on his or her transcript.
- Have a cumulative academic GPA of 2.0 or better.
- Be in good standing with the Attendance and Discipline Office.
- Have no outstanding financial obligations with the Business Office.
- Have completed all Christian Service obligations.

A senior who has the misfortune of receiving a grade of “F” on his or her transcript will not receive a diploma from Santa Margarita Catholic High School until the “F” has been remediated. In order for this student to participate in graduation exercises he or she must:

- Have a cumulative academic GPA of 2.0 or better.
- Not have more than 2 “F” grades on the transcript.
- Be in good standing with the Attendance and Discipline Office.
- Have no outstanding financial obligations with the Business Office.

All incomplete work must be turned in by the 80% posting date in order for this work to be calculated into final grades. Any senior who is enrolled in a non-Santa Margarita online class needed to meet graduation requirements must have all work and the final exam completed by May 1st with the official transcript received by the counselor no later than May 10th. Any student who has a “School Hold” on his

or her diploma will not receive the diploma until the hold is removed. Students who have a “School Hold” on their diploma because of incomplete graduation requirements must have those deficiencies completed by August 31st of the graduation year. If applicable, a transcript from the community college or university must be submitted to Santa Margarita for the completed work. The date of graduation on the transcript will reflect the year the graduation requirements have been met if not done by Aug 31st of their graduation year.

Graduation Practice

All seniors **must** attend a mandatory graduation practice from 9:00 am – 11:30 am Tuesday, May 26, 2026. You will receive your caps and gowns at this practice. Any student absent from graduation practice will not be allowed to attend the graduation ceremony.

Kairos Retreats

The Kairos retreat program is about spending time with God at His invitation and being open to experience His presence. It can transform your outlook and experience of life as you know it. Seniors attend this four-day retreat to experience a compassionate and loving community, intense prayer, and interior reflection.

Kairos is an experience of living in a rare and unique Christian fellowship, like that of the early church community. Because of the unique nature of Kairos, the retreat fills up quickly. It is good to register ahead of time to ensure there will be a spot on the roster. Kairos is held at the Mission San Luis Rey Retreat Center located in Oceanside, CA. Students pack a sleeping bag, pillow, clothes, and a few personal items. The rest is taken care of by the Kairos Leadership Team.

Everyone on retreat will get the opportunity to share their own unique life experiences. Shared prayer and group discussions are a major focus every day. While the format of the retreat is shaped around Catholic Tradition, Kairos is open to students from all religious backgrounds. Kairos is not based upon religious dogma, but on a process of personal discovery, in which each student is encouraged to find and engage his/her own sense of spirituality and moral accountability.

Students that attend are also invited to become a retreat leader after their first Kairos retreat. This is another great way to “give back” and to inspire others to live out their faith in God and in others.

It is our hope that your support and encouragement will direct your child to consider making a Kairos retreat this year. Kairos retreat dates, as well as registration windows for each retreat, are scheduled throughout the school year. Prom

Prom will be on Thursday, May 21, 2026. Check-in will begin at 5:30 PM, dinner will be served promptly at 6:30 PM and dancing will take place from 7:30 PM to 10:00 pm. No students will be allowed into this event after 6:30 PM. The attire for Prom is formal. Selective Service Registration

All men must register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their eighteenth birthday. Registration is a way our government keeps a list of names of men from which to draw in case of a national emergency requiring rapid expansion of our Armed Forces. By registering all young men, the Selective Service ensures that a future draft will be fair and equitable. Most men turning 18 can register by mail, if they receive a Selective Service form in the mail. Forms are also available at any U.S. post office, and you can now register on-line at www.sss.gov. The form asks for the young man's full name, address of

birth, email, telephone number, and Social Security number (if he has one). On the form that is sent in, his signature is also required.

Senior Cruise

Senior Cruise is scheduled for Thursday, September 11th at Hornblower Cruises, 2431 West Coast Highway, Newport Beach. This event is only open to SMCHS seniors and takes place in Newport Harbor. Students will begin boarding at 6:30 PM and the yacht will return to the dock at 10:00 PM. Dinner, dancing, and pictures are included in the ticket price. Parking is not included in the ticket price and may be purchased upon arrival from the parking lot attendant for \$10 per car (cash only). Please visit the [SMCHS Senior Page](#) for more details.

Senior Trips

SMCHS does not sponsor a senior trip. The information you may receive from travel agencies is not sanctioned by our school. Nor do we allow other agencies to advertise such trips on our campus.

Several travel agencies offer trips without formal supervision. Parents considering such trips should carefully review the material you have received. If you read the fine print in the brochures, you may find that the tour companies' "chaperones" are only there to make sure student accommodations and travel arrangements are met. As a result, students are placed in an environment where they are not safe. Sometimes, trip activities organized by the tour operator are held in bars, clubs or near a place where alcohol is made readily available. The environment created by these parties and the availability of unlimited alcohol is dangerous and potentially catastrophic.

Senior Tablets

How much will it cost to purchase the tablet at the end of the year?

The Tablet device will be free to students who have attended SMCHS for all four years and paid the technology fee all four years. The purchase price for students that have not paid four years of the technology fees will be no more than the difference between the initial cost of the device minus the technology fees paid by the family. These devices cannot be used by any current or future SMCHS student as they will no longer be under warranty or include any of the necessary school software.

What will be available to the student on the device?

The Senior tablet will be returned to factory settings as required by the school's licensing agreement. Users will have full administrative rights. Students will have access to their Office 365 accounts until September 30th, 2026. Students are encouraged to use a college or University Microsoft account and reinstall any apps/games they have purchased prior to September 30, 2026.

How will the program work?

- All graduating students are required to return their tablets to the Tech Service Center after their last exam during final exam week (May 18-21).
- By returning the device to the Tech Service Center, the student agrees that they have backed-up all their files to their Office 365 OneDrive account and/or an external USB drive.
- SMCHS is not responsible for any data lost while restoring the device to factory settings.
- The Tech Service Center will restore the student's device to its original factory settings,
- Students who have not paid the technology fee all four years that wish to buy the tablet will complete the purchase process and present a copy of the receipt when the device is returned.
- Devices will be available for pick up by June 30 from the Tech Service Center.

- Devices not picked up from the Tech Center by July 15th will be considered donated and SMHCS will not be offer a replacement.

What if I don't want my tablet?

All seniors who choose to not purchase or have no need for the tablet are still required to return the device to the Tech Service Center after their last exam during final exam week (May 18-21).

Students will not receive their diploma if the device is not returned. There is no charge for returning the tablet to SMCHS if there are no other issues with the device, wilful damage, etc. may pose a charge when turned in to the Tech Center.

Textbooks

Textbook buybacks will take place at the end of May if applicable and permitted by the textbook provider. Specific dates and times will be announced in the Eagle Update several weeks before the buyback dates. Please look for details in May. Questions about textbooks can be submitted to textbooks@smhs.org.

Tuition

All Tuition and additional fees must be paid in full by the end of April in order to be able to participate in any graduation activities.

Voter Registration

The Activities Office offers voter registration forms to any interested student. You may register to vote at any time throughout the year. However, you must be registered to vote at least 29 days prior to an election to vote in that election. You can also register online at: www.ocvote.com

You are eligible to register to vote if:

- You are or will be at least 18 years of age on or before the day of the next election, and
- You are a citizen of the United States, and
- You are a resident of California, and
- You are not in prison or on parole for a felony conviction.

Senior Class Panorama & Yearbook Luncheon

All seniors are invited to attend the Senior Class Panorama & Yearbook Luncheon immediately following Graduation Practice on Tuesday, May 26, 2026. Seniors should wear their college sweatshirt for a special senior panorama picture to be taken before the catered lunch buffet is served. The cost of this event is included in the Graduation Fee. Alumni Association information will also be available. Please Note: The cost of the yearbook is not covered by the Graduation fee; a separate yearbook fee will be billed through your FACTS account.

Talon Yearbook

The procedure for purchasing a yearbook will be the same as the last few years. A yearbook will be ordered for every student who does not opt out by **October 10th, 2025**. The charge (\$130 for ASB Card Members / \$180 for non-ASB Card Members) will be added to your tuition account after the opt out date of October 10th, 2025. An email will be coming in the beginning months of school with directions on how to opt out.

Senior Tributes

SMCHS parents may order a Tribute for their child through the company, Tribute Ads; a full-service online production company that offers various sizes, templates, and colors to create your student’s Senior Tribute. They will simplify your creation process; however, you still have the option to create a tribute of your own design.
