Advanced Placement Exams



Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Self-Study Guidelines

Beginning with the 2025–2026 school year, students may only register for an AP exam if they are currently enrolled in the corresponding AP course—either in-person or virtually. The only exception to this policy is for AP courses not offered at Northview High School; in such cases, students may pursue a self-study option.

To register for a self-study AP exam, students must visit Dr. Bounds’ office to obtain a Self-Study Contract, which must be signed by both the student and a parent/guardian. Additionally, the exam fee of \$125 must be paid in full through OSP before registration can be processed.

Important Deadline:

All self-study exam requests must be submitted by **October 1, 2025**. Late submissions will not be accepted under any circumstances.

Please note: If a student registers for an AP exam but does not attend on the scheduled exam day, an unused exam fee of \$75 will be charged.

Dress Code Enforcement Begins Monday, August 18

Beginning August 18, students will no longer receive warnings for dress code violations. Any student out of compliance will be required to change into a school-provided t-shirt and pants.

Dress Code Guidelines

To support a focused learning environment, students must dress in a way that reflects neatness, cleanliness, modesty, and pride in themselves and NHS.

Please ensure your student follows these expectations:

- **Undergarments must not be visible. Pants should be worn at the waist.
- **Prohibited Content: Clothing and accessories must not display alcohol, drugs, tobacco, weapons, gangs, or any offensive, inciting, or sexually suggestive content.
- **Gender Neutral Box: All clothing must cover the boxed area shown in the reference image below.

13a.I	Improper Dress	Students in the school district are expected to dress and groom themselves in such a way as to reflect neatness, cleanliness, and safety. All students shall dress appropriately so as not to disrupt or interfere with the educational program or the orderly operation of the school. Examples of inappropriate dress and grooming include lack of cleanliness in person or dress; shoelessness; "short-short" clothing; bare midriffs; "tank tops"; "see-through" clothing or apparel which designates gangs or similar organizations or any dress that is disruptive to the educational process. Designated dress involving school activities approved by the principal shall be acceptable. The principal or other duly authorized school official shall determine whether any particular mode of dress or grooming results in a violation of the spirit and/or the intent of this rule.
