Facilities Summary

The school was completely rebuilt under the previous bond measure. The classrooms were occupied in 2016, with the MPR and Library/Exploratorium completed in 2018. The field was completed in 2020. One of the missing elements in the new school is a covered walkway system to connect the classrooms and Admin/MPR. That would be the proposed focus of work on this campus.

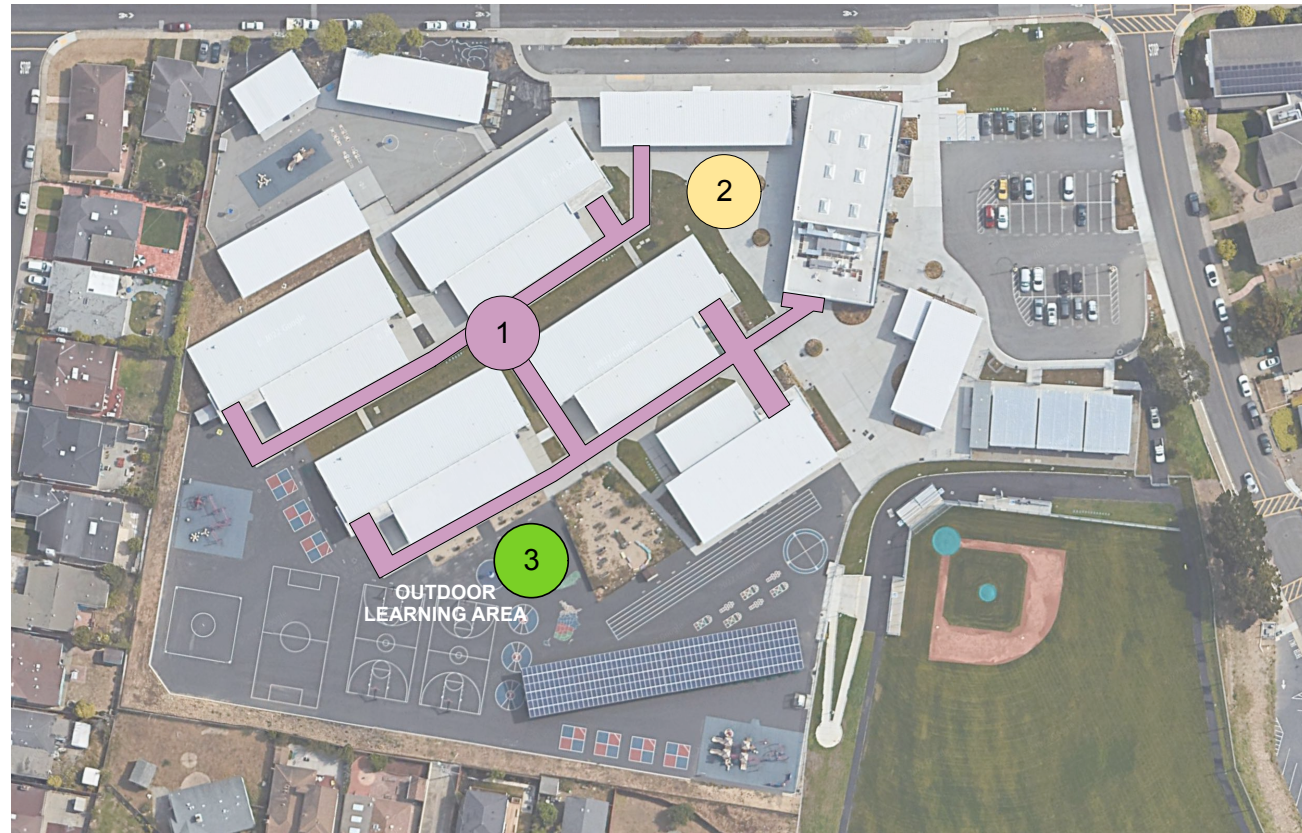

Facilities Summary

The school was built in 1970, and modernized in the late 1990's. New modular classrooms, Library and Exploratorium were installed to replace portables under the last bond measure in 2010. Modernization of the original campus buildings is critical, along with exterior renovation to refresh the aging appearance of the school. The Multi-Purpose building and Kitchen need upgrades to meet needs of the District's expanded nutrition services program. The Admin area needs updating and reconfiguration to meet the evolving program and community services needs at the site.

The site was not touched during the last bond and lacks educational program spaces provided for the District's other elementary sites. The classrooms, Administration and Multi-Purpose Building/Kitchen need major modernization, and reconfiguration to provide a 21st century learning environment and appropriate support spaces for the school community.

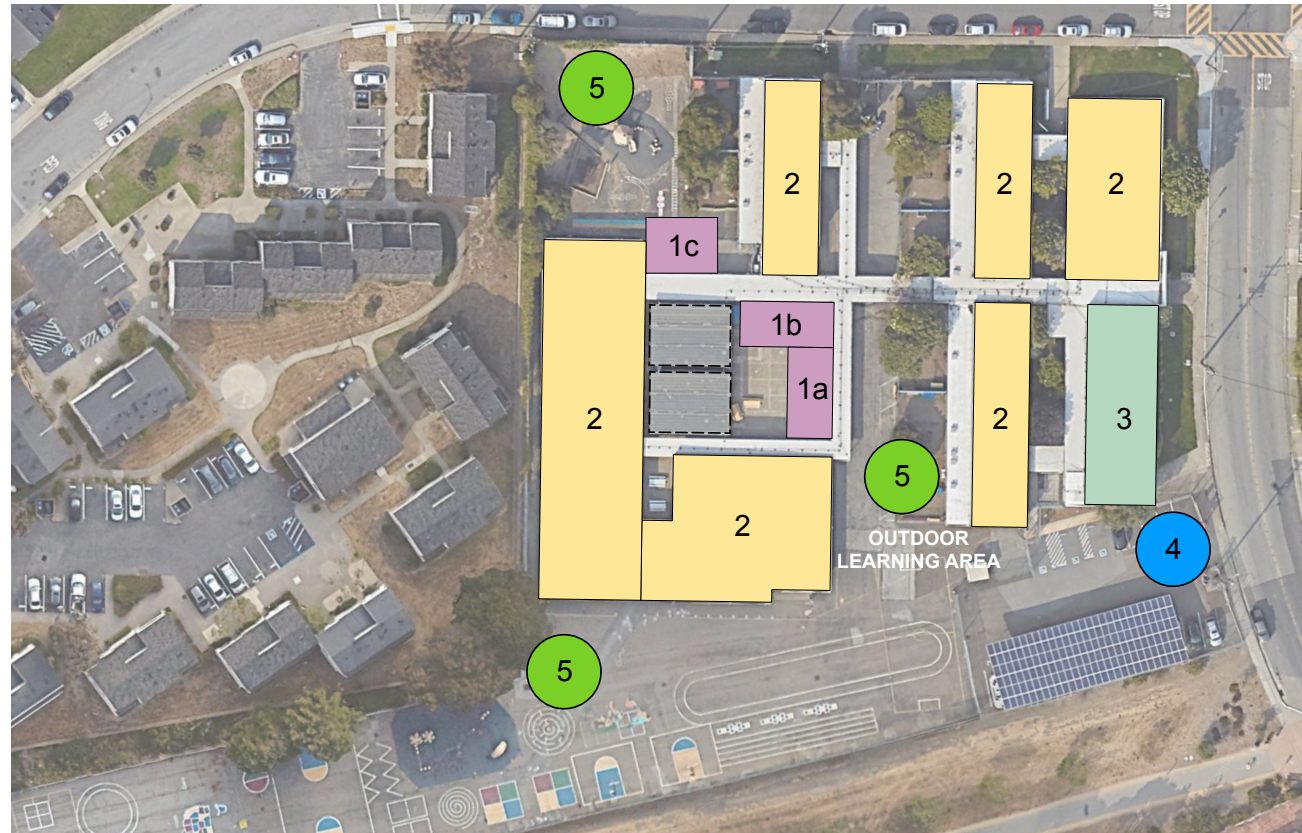

Facilities Summary

Martin's Building A, built in 1921, is one of the oldest school buildings in the District. The remainder of the main campus buildings were added in 1948 and 1952, and modernized in the 1990's. A partial modernization was completed from 2017-2021 using non-bond funds. The focus of the proposed work on this campus is to complete the modernization of Building A, the Multi- Purpose building and renovate and reconfigure the Administration Building in order to provide better community and family support services.

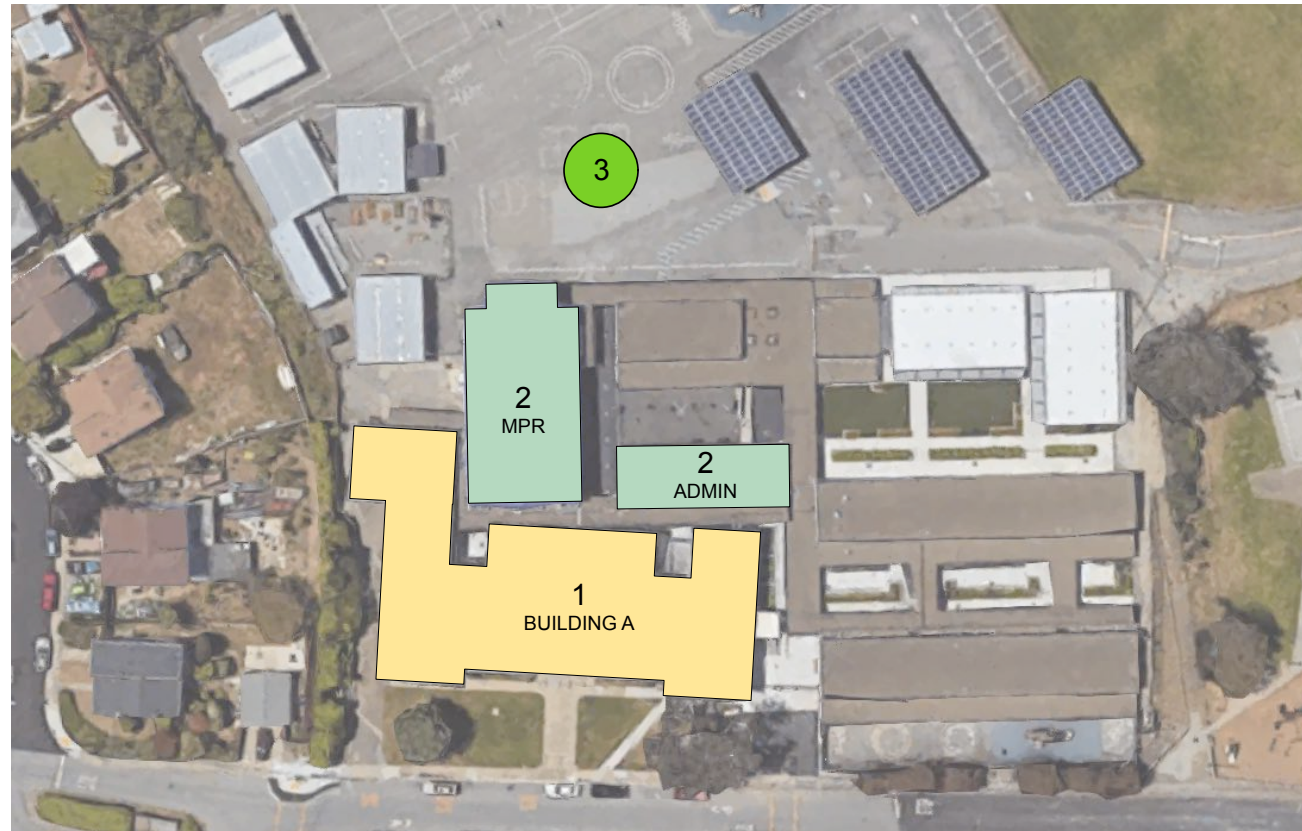

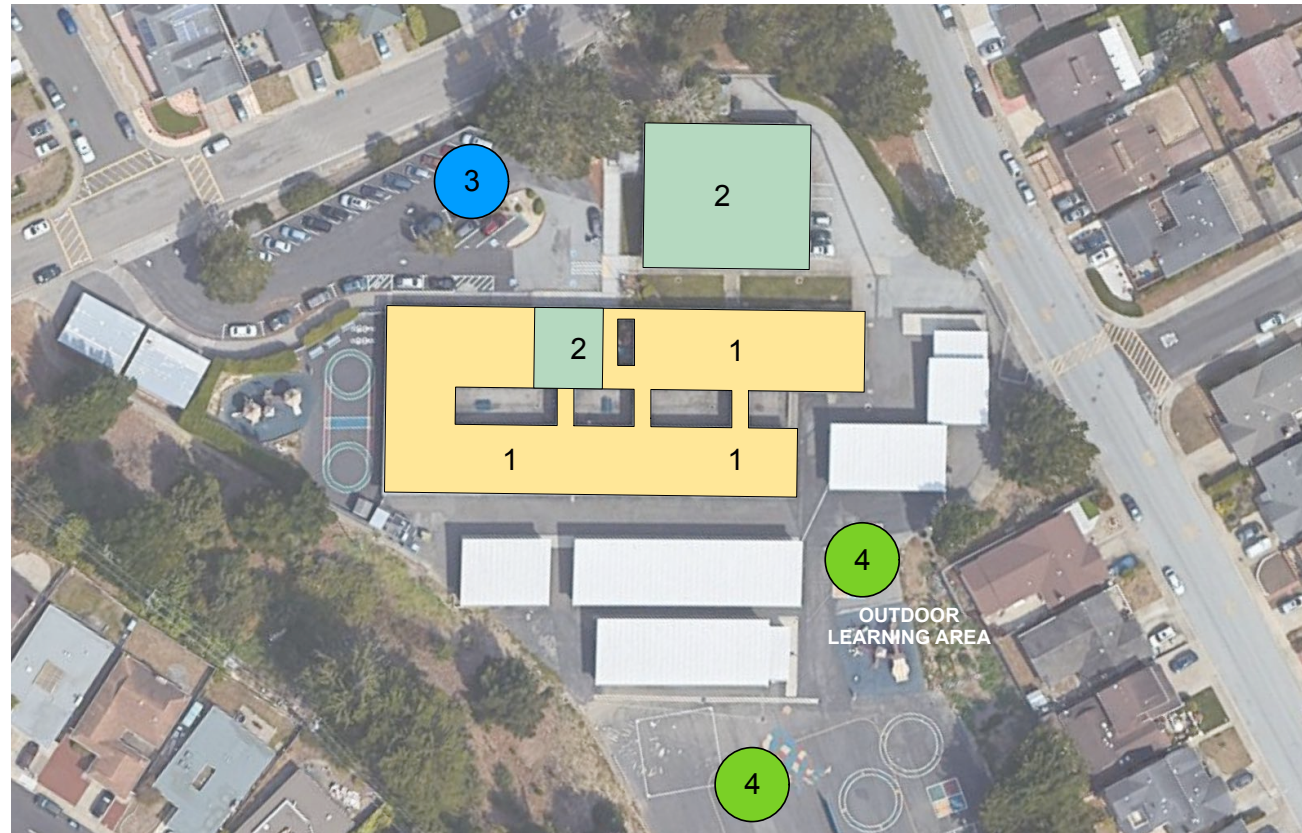

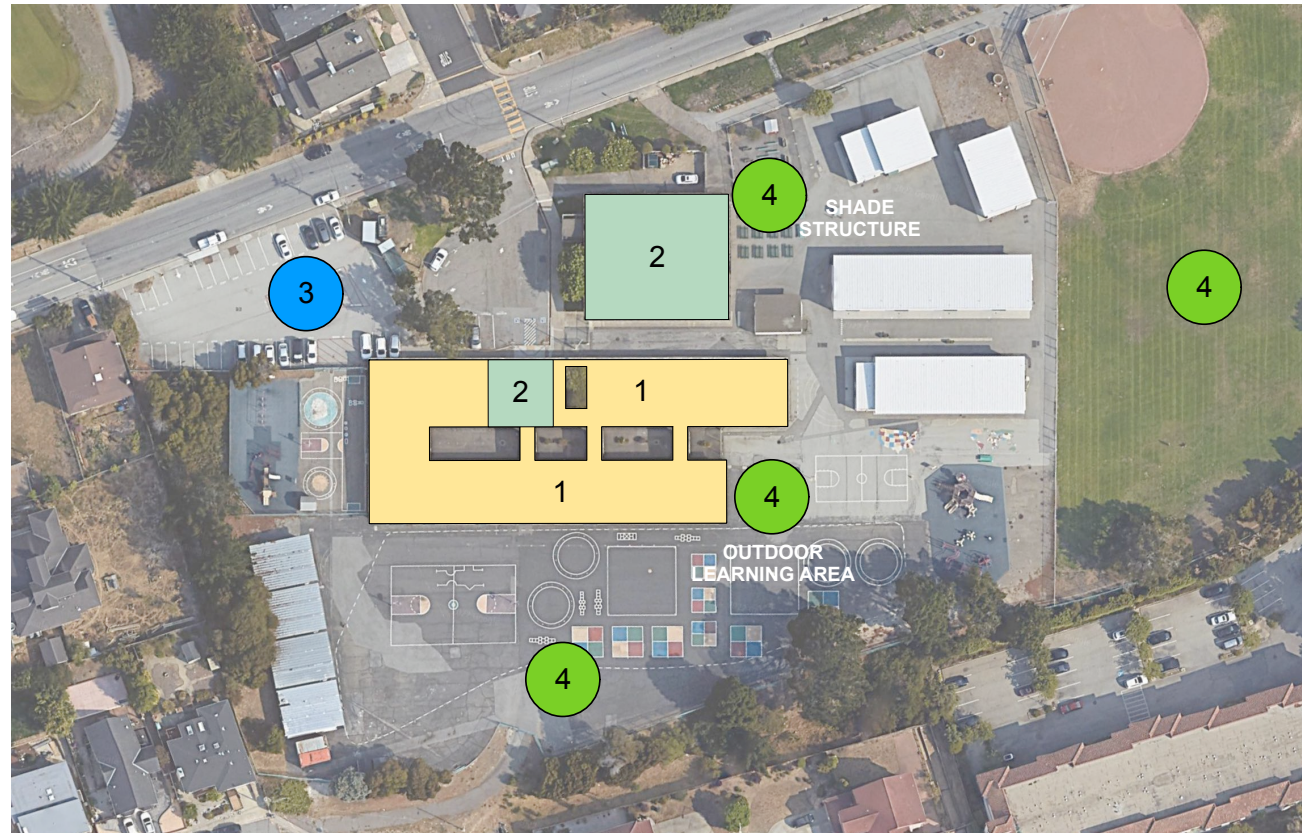

Spruce was built as a high school in 1933 and is larger than most District elementary schools, with other buildings added in 1956 and 1968. It was modernized in the late 1900's. Many portables were added over time, and most were replaced with new buildings under the last bond measure. The original campus buildings are in need of significant modernization. The Administration area needs to be updated for program and community support needs. The Cafeteria and Kitchen need reconfiguration for expanded nutrition services, and the Gym needs modernization. Site upgrades including playground rehabilitation, outdoor learning areas, and shade structures are a priority at the site.

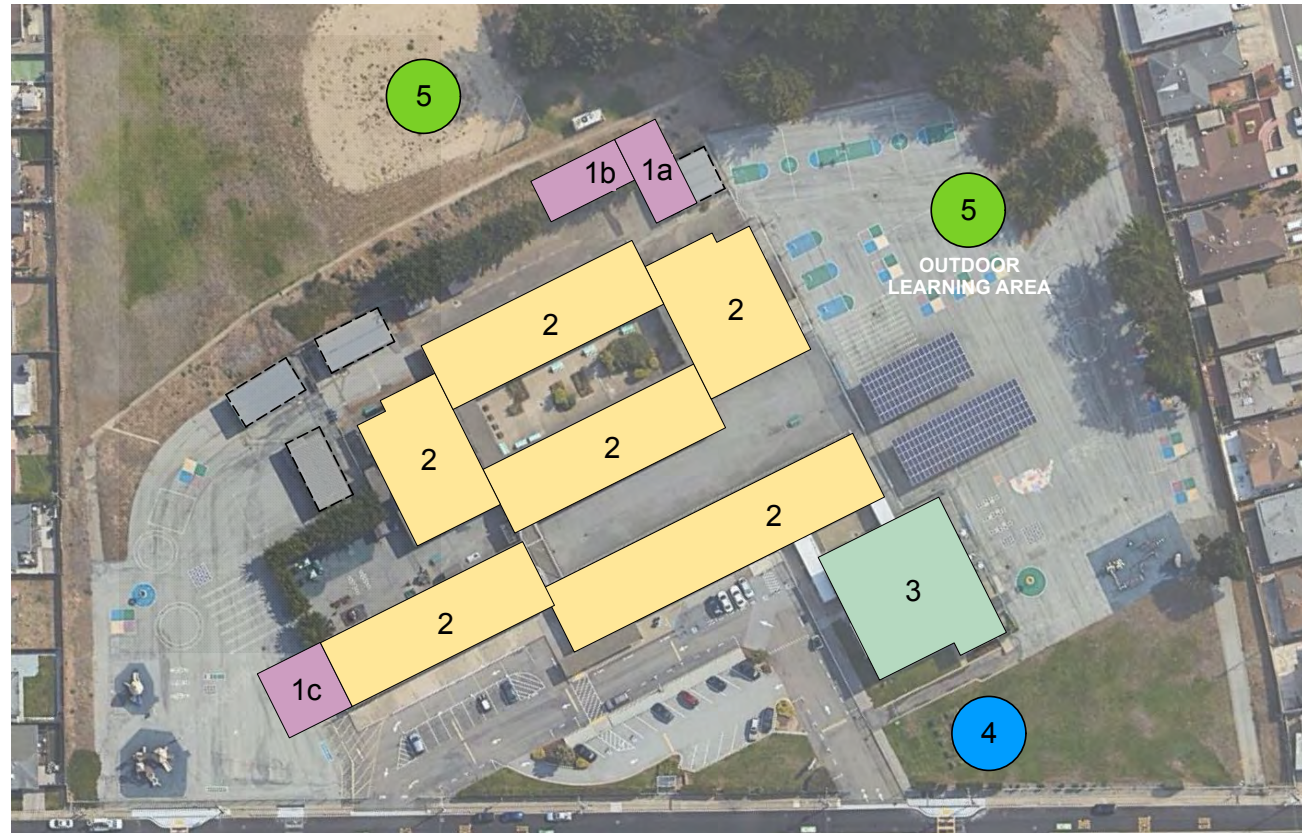

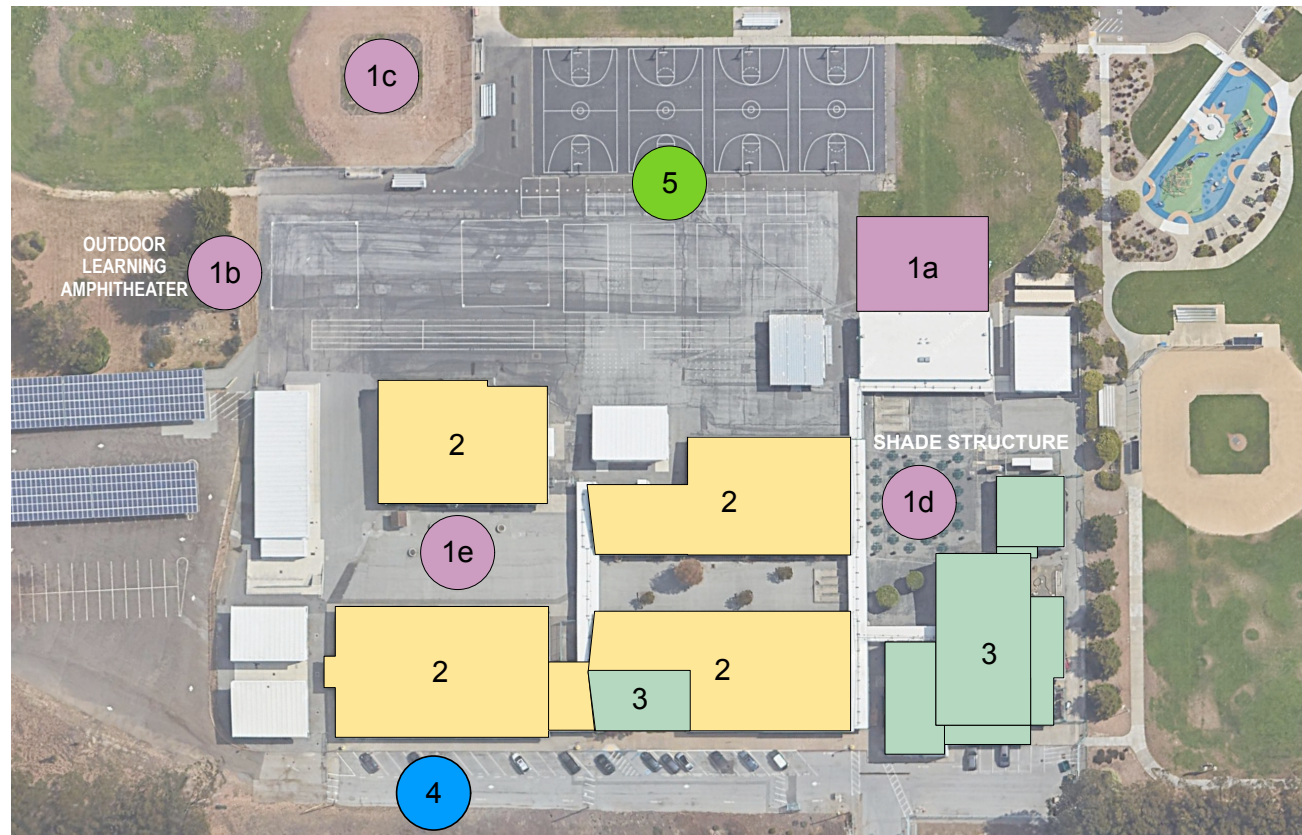

During the last bond measure new buildings were added, including a Science wing and classroom wings. The campus entry was landscaped, and site accessibility was addressed in 2018-19. The site lacks a middle school gym and the Administration wing is undersized, lacking adequate program spaces for student and community support. Existing older buildings need significant modernization. Site hardscape areas need rehabilitation and expansion to support middle school PE.

Most of the campus was built in 1968, with the upper wing added in 1972. A few portables were added over the years. The campus was modernized in the late 1990's. During the last bond measure portables were replaced by two new classroom buildings and the Science wing was renovated and modernized. The other existing original buildings need significant modernization. Drop-off and parking at the site needs to be reconfigured for safety and accessibility. The hardscape and existing play areas need major rehabilitation. The lower field needs reconstruction and accessibility upgrades for PE programs.

The Baden HS campus houses the Continuation High School and the District's Adult Education program. The Baden campus was built between 1953 and 1957. Other buildings were added in the 1960's. While the campus has been modernized in the late 1990's, they are in need of significant upgrades to meet current standards. The hardcourt areas of the site need major rehabilitation. There are ongoing site infrastructure needs to address. Remaining older portables need to be replaced. Renovations to support project-based learning are proposed.

All of the major buildings were built between 1960 and 1962. The campus was most recently modernized at the end of the 1990's, and two new 2-story Science wings were added during the last bond measure. Artificial turf football/soccer field and a new softball field have also been completed. The original buildings are in need of significant modernization, including window replacement and classroom upgrades to support 21st century learning. Critical seismic upgrades are needed at the Gym and Cafeteria / Kitchen wings. The theater renovations are critical to support the school's performing arts programs. Site work to increase accessibility is an ongoing issue at El Camino.

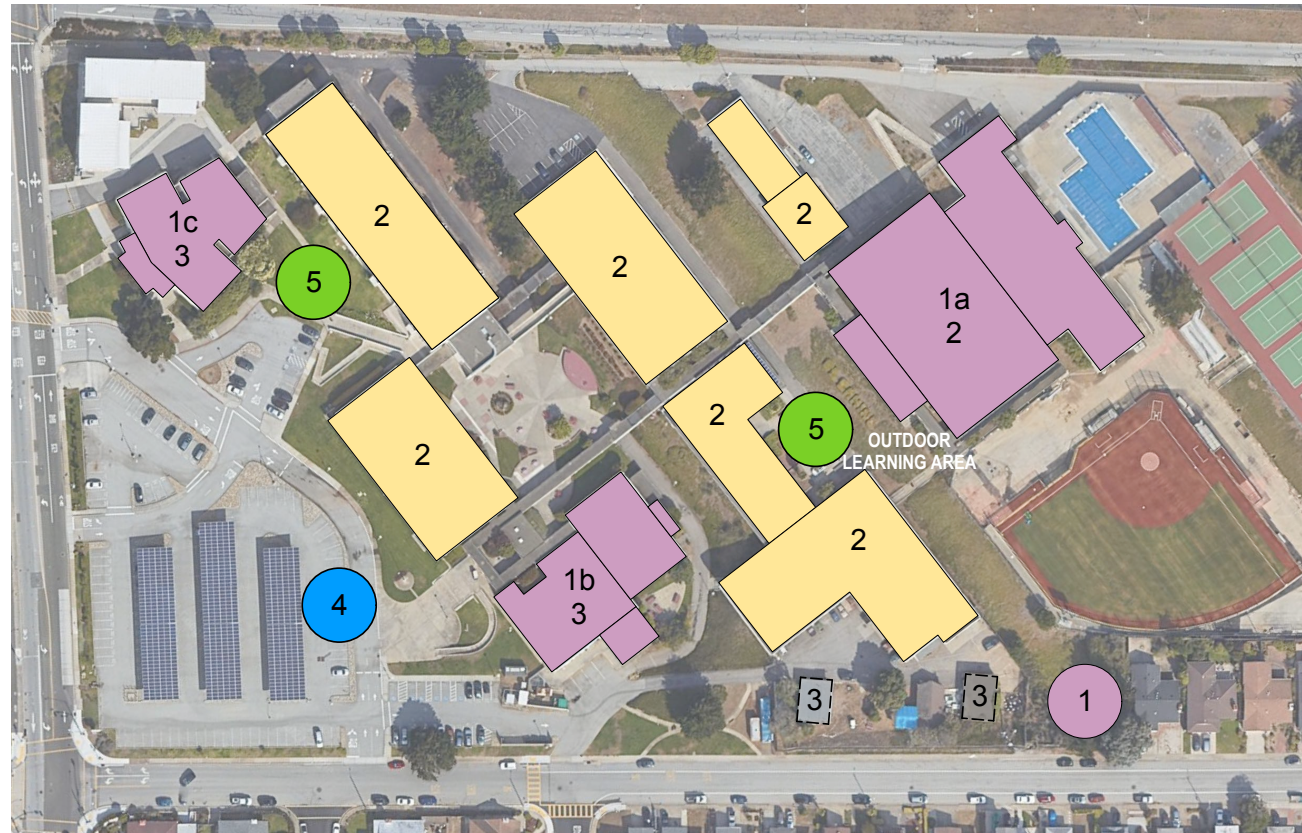

The campus was constructed in 1950-51 with added Library in 1962 and Administration building in 1968. Many portable classrooms were placed over time, mostly replaced by new 2-story classroom wings under the last bond. The campus was modernized most recently in the late 1990's. The original buildings need significant modernization and classroom upgrades to support 21st century learning. Unfortunately, some of the buildings are beyond their useful life. A new Gym/Locker/PE and Athletic facility is a priority to support those programs. In addition, replacement of the shop wing is proposed with a new CTE/STEM wing. Renovation of the Performing Arts spaces is also a priority.

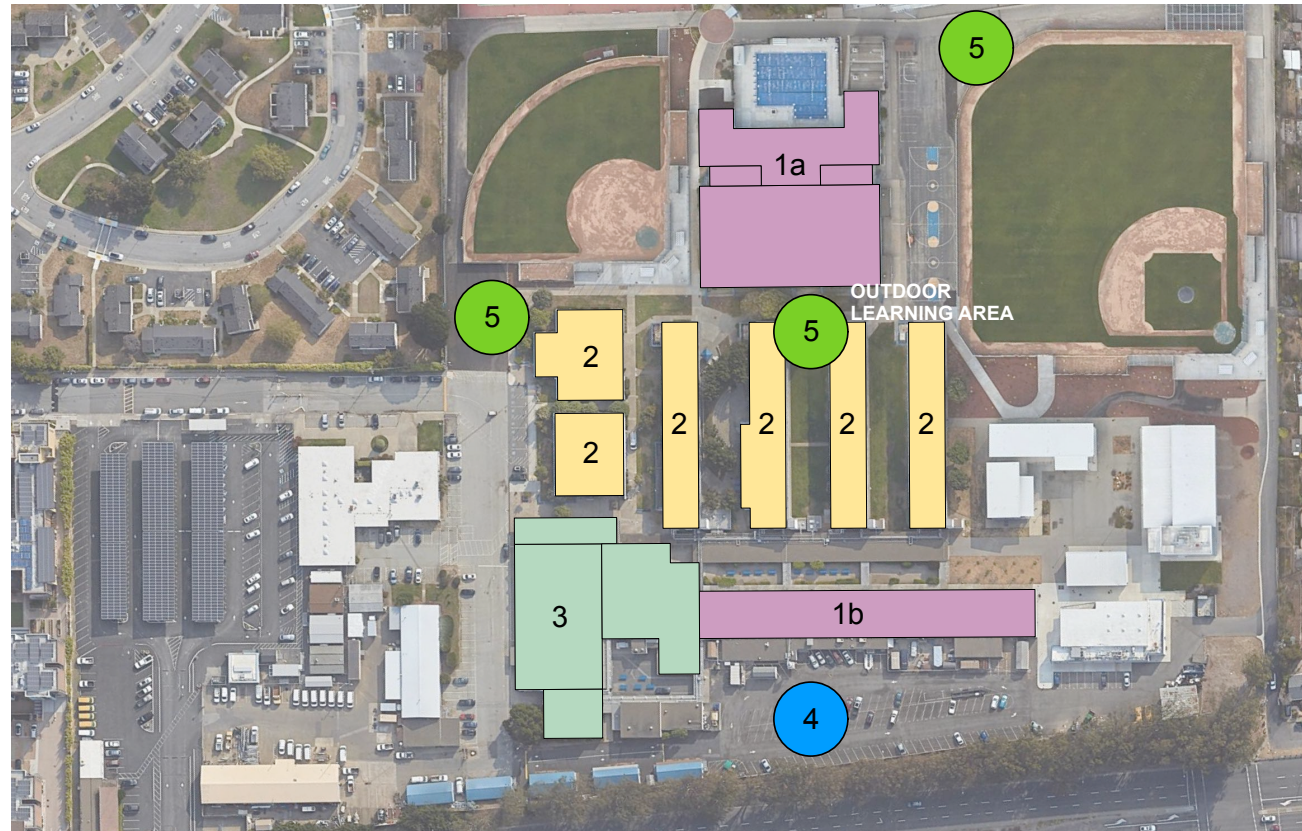

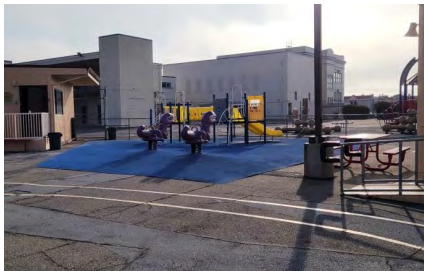

Facilities Summary

The Children's Center provides Pre-School and After School programs. It is located on the Spruce site and includes 5 portables and a dedicated parking area. There are a total of 5 Pre-School Classrooms and two office/support buildings. The campus was built between 1997- 2006. The buildings are nearing the end of their useful life and need significant modernization work to continue in use.

1. Priority Projects: Demolish all existing District Office portables, and the Special Education building. Rebuild with a new two story office building in the same location.

2. Modernization: Modernize the original permanent District Office buildings.

Facilities Summary

The South San Francisco Unified School District Offices are located adjacent to South San Francisco High School. The first permanent building dates from 1949, the larger north side addition was built in 1961. Over the course of the next 50 years the District added seven portables and one small permanent building to house the growing District services teams. All of the buildings that make up the District Offices complex have significant deficiencies. The portables are far beyond their useful life and need immediate replacement. A new replacement building can provide for a more efficient work environment and better serve students, staff and our community.

1. Priority Projects: Demolish existing school and develop Workforce Housing project on site, with over 125 units of varying types, Childcare Center, landscaping, and parking.

Facilities Summary

Foxridge Elementary School was built in 1967. It has been closed for over 15 years and is partially leased for a private Pre-School and used by the District for storage. The buildings have not been modernized or upgraded since the 1990's. The site is in poor condition. As the District considered possible construction of Workforce Housing, the Foxridge site stood out as appropriately sized and well located for the development of a new affordable housing community for our educators, classified staff and their families.

Facilities Summary

Hillside Elementary School was built in 1970. The buildings were most recently modernized in the late 1990's. The school was closed in 2005, and a major portion of the site is leased to a private school. The District utilizes the south wing with eight classrooms as a Pre-School and Special Education program facility. Portables have been added over time adjacent to this wing to house site staff and District Special Education staff functions. The buildings are in need of significant modernization. There are accessibility issues with the site and related to the portable offices. The District needs to work with the leasee to implement plans to modernize the leased areas of the site.

Facilities Summary

Serra Vista Elementary was built in 1960, the Cafeteria / Kitchen added in 1965. The school is closed and the site is partially leased for a private school, with a portion used by the District for professional development. The buildings are in poor condition. The proposed work at this site is to maintain the asset and provide safe spaces with upgraded accessibility.
