Dear Class of 2029 Family,

It is my pleasure to welcome you to our CBA community and to what I know will be an amazing school year! I hope that each of you has had a great summer filled with fun and relaxation. As the school year begins there are many activities to introduce your son to the traditions of CBA, as well as help him prepare for the start of his important journey.

On August 26, 2025 the Class of 2029 will meet their big brothers from the Class of 2027 at the Big/Little Brother BBQ. Mrs. Maccarella will be sending out more information shortly.

Freshmen will report on Wednesday September 3, 2025 for their first day of orientation. Freshmen should arrive no later than 8:05AM and will report to the Henderson Theater to begin the day. Dismissal will be at 12:34PM. This is a very important day for the Class of 2029 as they will participate in Freshmen Oath Day. Oath Day is an opportunity for our freshmen to learn more about the Academy Oath. The day includes speakers, discussions and a class teaching Mass. Students should wear the normal school dress code with a blazer. Also on Wednesday, freshmen will have their yearbook pictures taken. Enclosed in this mailing is the Normandy Studio photo form. Please bring the completed form to school on the 3rd. All students should be in full dress code. Students are photographed in sports coats/blazers. Freshmen Orientation continues on Thursday, September 4, 2025. Freshmen should arrive at school no later than 8:05AM and again report directly to Henderson Theater. Dismissal will be at 12:34PM.

On Friday September 5th all grades will participate in Welcome Back Day which is a full day. For the Class of 2029 that will include the Heath Run and Freshmen Welcome Day. The Freshmen Run has been a tradition at Christian Brothers Academy for more than fifty years. In addition to the run there will be orientation activities and some friendly class competition among the freshmen homerooms. Freshmen should wear their gym clothes and sneakers suitable for running to school that day. Students requiring an inhaler should have one with them. Backpacks and computers should be left at home. Lunch and snacks will be provided. Dismissal will be 2:34PM.

- The school building will be open daily at 7:30AM. Students arriving early should report to the library or the dining hall. The library will be open until 5:00PM each day.

- **The Pegasus Yearbook** is an award winning student publication that chronicles the many events of the school year. Yearbooks can be ordered online on the 2029 Class Page or by bringing cash or check (in an envelope with student's name) to the Main Office. Yearbook orders are due by December 5, 2025. The cost is \$60 if purchased by **December 5, 2025**. Yearbooks ordered after that will be \$70. No orders will be accepted after February 20, 2026. To avoid waste we will order only enough yearbooks to cover the orders so if you would like a yearbook, please be sure to order one.

Finally, I would like to take the opportunity to encourage you to urge your son to get involved in the many extracurricular and co-curricular activities offered at CBA. Clubs meet both before and after school and during the enrichment period to ensure that students have as many opportunities to participate as possible.

In keeping with our mission, CBA's extracurricular activities provide a unique opportunity to nourish the whole person--mind, body and spirit. Our many clubs and activities allow students to take their learning beyond the classroom and to nurture passions outside of the realm of the academic curriculum. 
It is my hope that your son will immerse himself in the day to day life of the CBA community where we are more than just students and teachers but a community that grows and develops each and every day.
