



Design Standard Vinyl Covered Tackable Wall Finish

Purpose

This design standard has the purpose of creating a consistent application of vinyl covered tackable wall finish panels in classrooms throughout the South San Francisco Unified School District, thereby achieving a standard of aesthetic quality, maintenance and performance throughout all renovation and new building projects.

Design Standard

- Vinyl covered wall panels create an acoustical, tackable wall surface from floor to ceiling in classrooms and other appropriate areas. Panels must be applied over a minimum of ½” gypsum wallboard or 3/8” plywood substrate.
- Vinyl to be machine laminated to 1/2” lightweight wood fiberboard. Specify square edge. Wrap long edges of board.
- Vinyl covering to weight a minimum of 8 oz. per square yard and have a Class I flame spread rating. The fabricated panel to have a Class II rating minimum.
- Install with PVC plastic moldings cut from 10’ lengths.
- Care shall be taken in mounting tackboard so that the texture of all panels will have the same orientation and color match.
