#### What Your Child Will Learn

  - Instrument Families
- Songs and Musical Games
  - Folk songs to teach rhythm and pitch sets
  - Songs that teach other musical concepts
  - Prepare performance songs: Performance on Oct 23, 2025

  - Learn movement to performance songs

#### 4th Grade

  - Single Eighth Notes
  - Syncopated Rhythms
  - Eighth and Sixteenth Note Combinations
  - Dotted Half Note
- Melody Pitch
  - Read melodic patterns with 5-6 tones
  - Read and sing Major tonic and major dominant tonal patterns
  - Melodic instruments
- Harmony/Form
  - Simple part-work
- Expression & Articulation
  - o Crescendo
  - Decrescendo

- Timbre
  - Soprano and Alto voices
- Songs & Musical Games
  - Performance Songs: 4th Grade performance is November 13th, 2025
  - Folk songs to aid in learning rhythmic and pitch concepts
- Movement
  - Folk dances
  - Historical dances-Medieval & Renaissance Periods
  - Body percussion
  - Movement with performance songs
- Respond to Music (Various periods and cultures)
  - Verbally and through movement
- Critical Evaluation
  - Identify and describe music heard using music vocabulary
- Audience Etiquette
  - Exhibit audience etiquette

#### 5th Grade

- Rhythm/Meter
  - Practice and perform previously learned rhythms in a variety of ways
- Melody Pitch
  - Read and sing Major tonic and major dominant tonal patterns
  - Read and sing Minor tonic and minor dominant tonal patterns
  - Utilize middle school sight singing techniques, building pitch recognition, and reading
  - Melodic instruments: Pitched percussion and the recorder
- Harmony/Form
  - Rounds
  - Partner songs
  - Two-part songs on the recorder
  - Creating harmony through multiple instrumental parts
- Expression & Articulation
  - Review Crescendo
  - Review Decrescendo
- Timbre
  - Soprano, Alto, Tenor, and Bass voices: Learn about MS and HS Choir
  - Every instrument in band via solo demonstrations and band blending: Learn about MS and HS Band
- Songs & Musical Games
  - o Performance Songs: 5th Grade performance is December 11th, 2025
  - Rounds
- Movement
  - Movement with performance songs
  - Movement as an assessment tool
  - Movement is integrated into the recorder and vocal songs
