Senior Checklist



1) COMPLETE THE FAFSA (Application Opens in December)

- Begin FSAID now. studentaid.gov/fsa-id
- You CANNOT get TOPS without completing the FAFSA.
- See the back page of this newsletter!

2) APPLY TO COLLEGE

- Check out bigfuture.collegeboard.org for a great way to search for colleges!
- Turn in any scholarship/transcript requests to your counselor located in the counselor's office or via email.

3) Apply for scholarships through your choice colleges

- Find out the scholarship deadlines for all your colleges and add them to your calendar.
- A good goal is to submit all of your college academic scholarship applications by January 1st. Make sure to check with your colleges- some have earlier application deadlines!

4) Begin applying for other scholarships

- Find most scholarships online
- Set aside time to fill out scholarship applications. Many will require essays.
 * Turn in any scholarship/transcript requests to your counselor- Located in the counselor's office.

5) Retake the ACT and/or SAT to improve your score

- Remember you need a 20 for TOPS and even higher for many 4-year colleges.
- *Some colleges require a writing score, so check out your prospective college's requirements.

Note: All local scholarships (ex. Meraux Foundation Scholarship, BPW Scholarship, Kiwanis etc.) will go out around January 2026. Listen to morning announcements and read future scholarship newsletters for more information on these scholarships.

More Scholarships



Deadlines are quickly approaching. Do not miss out on the opportunity for free money!!

- ScholarshipOWIL No Essay Scholarship: Students 16 years or older and must be a resident of any of the 50 United States. Students must complete their profile to 100% to be entered in the scholarship. Award: \$1,000.
 - Deadline: August 29, 2025

- QuestBridge National College Match: Match Scholarship Recipients are granted early admission to one of QuestBridge's college partners with a full four-year scholarship, worth over \$200,000. Applicants must be high school graduates planning to enroll in college in the fall of the year the scholarship is awarded and come from households earning less than \$65,000/year for a family of four.
 - DEADLINE: September 30, 2025

- The "No Sweat" Scholarship: The Cirkled In "No Sweat" Scholarship is a \$2500 CASH scholarship you can use for any educational purpose, from books to summer camp. In just two steps, you're in! Apply by signing-up for a Cirkled In account and then complete your portfolio.
 - DEADLINE: September 30, 2025

- <u>AES Scholarship:</u> High school seniors and all students attending a postsecondary educational facility. Submit an essay of 500 -1000 words on When you look back on your life in 30 years, what would it take for you to consider your life successful? What relationships or accomplishments will be important on this journey? Award: \$500

- <u>Hispanic Heritage Foundation:</u> Latino high school seniors who have an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher who excel in accomplishments in the classroom, community, and various educational categories.
 - Deadline: November 2, 2025

- The Cooke College Scholarship Program: High-achieving high school seniors with financial need who seek to attend and graduate from the nation's top four-year colleges and universities. GPA: unweighted 3.75. There is no minimum test score requirement, but you must submit ACT, SAT, or AP scores. Demonstrate Unmet Financial Need- will consider applicants with family AGI up to \$95,000/year.
 - Deadline: November 12, 2025

- <u>Elks Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarship:</u> To qualify for one of the 500 four-year scholarships to cover any unmet cost of college, students must be U.S. citizens with leadership experience.
 - DEADLINE: November 12, 2025

- <u>College Jumpstart Scholarship:</u> Students who characterize themselves as "hardworking" may apply for this \$1,000 scholarship. Financial need and test scores are <u>not</u> required for this scholarship!
 - o DEADLINE: December 31, 2025

- <u>Hispanic Scholarship Fund:</u> Many Scholarships available to students of Hispanic descent. Scholarships available for documented and undocumented high school students. Check out the website for details on specific opportunities!
 - DEADLINE: Varies: Opens January 2026

- **JFK Profile of Courage Scholarship:** Write a 700-100 word essay describing and analyzing an act of political courage by a U.S. elected official who served during or after 1917.
 - DEADLINE: January 15, 2026
 - Go to https://www.jfklibrary.org/Education/Profile-in-Courage-Essay-Contest
- <u>United States JCI Senate Foundation Scholarship</u>: \$1,000 grants will be awarded to graduating high school seniors in the United States, who plan to continue their education at accredited post-secondary colleges, universities or vocational schools.
 - DEADLINE: Must be postmarked by January 15, 2026
 - Go to www.usjcisenate.org/index.php/scholarship-program
- GE-Reagan Foundation Scholarship*: Seniors who demonstrate exemplary leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship should apply to receive \$10,000 per year for four years
 - DEADLINE: application opens mid October 2025. January 2026 deadline date hasn't been released yet.

Directions for Completing the Application!

Make sure to complete the 2026-2027 application!

What do I need to complete the FAFSA?

- 1. Parent Social Security Number
- 2. Your Social Security Number
 - If not a US citizen, alien registration number or permanent residence card
- 3. Parent email address/password
- 4. Your email address/password
- 5. 2024 parental tax forms
 - If your parents are not married, use the parent who you live with the most.
- 6. Untaxed income: worker's comp, child support, veterans benefits

Steps to complete the FAFSA:

- studentaid.gov/fsa-id: Create Username/Password for yourself
- studentaid.gov/fsa-id: Create Username/Password for a parent
- 3. Get your parental tax information from 2024
- 4. **fafsa.gov**: Complete FAFSA!
