Course Description

World Geography is the study of where people, places, and things are located and how they relate to each other. This course is designed to prepare students for future social studies courses. It will introduce the student to the scope of geography and serves as a foundation for all social studies courses at the high school level. Elements include the study and analysis of the earth's physical and human characteristics with topics that range from basic map skills to types of governments and economic systems. Special emphasis is placed on the study of the world's countries including their landforms and topography, resources, cultures, ethnic groupings, demographic patterns, and historical backgrounds.

Course Goals

- Students will not only investigate where something is but also what it is, why it is there, and how it got there.
- Students will be using problem solving skills to gain a geographic perspective of their world and the issues and concerns that affect their lives.
- Students will use practical applications of geography that pertain to everyday life.
- Knowledge of geography will enable students to make better sense of the world and become more responsible citizens.
- Students will become geographically literate, as it is essential to ensure the future quality of the earth's environment as well as for diverse peoples to be able to share our planet.

Course Overview (Instructional Plan)

This semester, your child will study the following topics in World Geography based on Texas state standards (TEKS):

Unit 1: Foundations of Physical Patterns and Processes

- Learning objectives: Describing physicality of landforms and environments, explaining relationships between the weather and climate in their specific regions, and identifying the different regions and biomes.
- Summatives: One-Pagers, group projects, and Test.

Unit 2: Foundations of Human Geographic Systems

- Learning objectives: Comparing and contrasting different political, economic, and cultural elements and how they impact and shape the areas around them.
- Summatives: Test, class debate, and project.

Unit 3: The United States and Canada

- Learning objectives: Analyzing migration and other settlement patterns and their changes over time. Evaluating the development and contributions of diverse cultural groups.
- o Summatives: One-pager, Group Project, Test

• Unit 4: Latin America

- Learning objectives: Examining physical and human geographic factors that characterize Latin
 America, and its connections to other regions and the rest of the world.
- Summatives: Test, Project, One-Pager

Additional Skills

- Developing critical thinking, note-taking, and group work.
- Example: preparing for a class debate, test, or project.
