A seven-member Board of Education establishes and oversees the policies of the Hewlett-Woodmere Public Schools. Its primary responsibilities include formulating policy, adopting an annual budget to be submitted to the voters, monitoring expenditures, approving the selection of District personnel and programs, maintaining school property, and providing transportation for students in accordance with provisions of state law and regulations.

The Board is elected by the voters of the District and serves without salary.

All residents are welcome to attend the monthly Board meetings on the dates indicated on this calendar. Regular meetings of the Board of Education begin at 7:30 PM. Check the calendar for location of monthly regular business meetings. Work meetings begin at 7:00 PM.

EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSING PROCEDURES

If an emergency condition requires closing schools, an automated phone call, email, and text message will be made to faculty and students. In addition, a closing announcement will be aired on the following television stations: News 12 Long Island, WNBC, WABC, News Radio 88, and WINS 1010. If the District is not mentioned, school will be open. Please refer to the District website (www.hewlett-woodmere.net) and Facebook page for closing information. If more than three (3) days are lost, the sequence of make-up days are 2/20/26, 2/19/26, 2/18/26.

The School District will not disclose personally identifiable information from a student's education records, except to the extent that it is authorized to do so upon written consent of a parent or eligible student, or where it is otherwise required by law to do so. However, the Board of Education has designated the following types of personally identifiable student information maintained in student records as "directory information": the student's name, photograph and video participation in officially recognized activities and sports, dates of attendance and awards received by the student. The School District may disclose directory information about current or former students. A parent of a current student or eligible current student has the right to refuse to let the School District designate any or all of these types of information about the student as directory information, provided that the parent or eligible student notifies that student's building principal in writing, not later than 10 days after the first school day of the year or 10 school days after the student's enrollment in the School District, whichever shall be later, that he or she does not want any or all of these types of information about the student designated as directory information.

School Budget and Voter Registration

Each year, the voters of the District are presented with a budget to cover the operating costs of the schools. The budget is prepared by the Superintendent and approved by the Board of Education. Discussions are held with community groups, and a public hearing is scheduled before the budget is submitted for a vote. Funds for the annual budget come from two major sources: State and Federal aid, and a tax on the real property of the District. The amount of State aid received is based upon the application of a State-mandated formula. The amount of State and Federal aid is deducted from the total budget and the balance is obtained from a tax on real property in the District. The vote takes place in May on a date set by State law. Copies of the qualifications and procedures for voting are available in each school office. Permanent personal registration is maintained to vote for the school budget if you are registered to vote in a general election and have been a District resident for 30 days, or if you are registered with the District Clerk. Residents may register to vote in the District elections between the hours of 9:00 AM and 2:00 PM daily in the office of the District Clerk at the Woodmere Education Center. 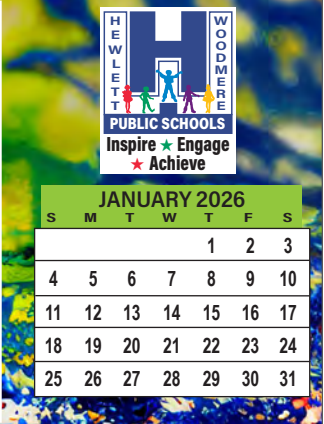

Equal Opportunity and Non Discrimination Policy (Policy #0100)

As required by law, Hewlett-Woodmere Public Schools hereby advises students, parents, employees and the general public that it offers employment and educational opportunities, including vocational education opportunities, without regard to sex, race, color, sexual orientation, national origin or handicap, religion, age, marital status, military status, domestic violence victim status, disability, predisposing genetic characteristics or **any other characteristic protected by applicable law**. Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (Policy #5500)

In accordance with State and Federal law, the Board of Education has adopted policy #5500, "Student Records." Copies of this policy are available in the District Office. Notice is hereby provided that a parent or guardian (or the student him/herself if over 18) has a right to inspect and review the student's education records, request amendment thereof in certain circumstances, consent to disclosure of personally identifiable information except as otherwise permitted by law and file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning FERPA compliance. Requests to review or inspect a student's education records should be addressed to the building principal.

Video Camera Policy (Policy #8414.4)

The Board of Education recognizes its responsibility to maintain and improve discipline and to ensure the safety, security and welfare of its staff, students and visitors in school buildings, on school grounds and while riding on school transportation vehicles. The Board supports the use of video surveillance systems as part of our comprehensive safety plan. The Board of Education has adopted Policy #8414.4, "Video Cameras on School Buses."

Use of Pesticides/Chemicals Policy (Policy #8115)

It is inappropriate for anyone to bring any cleaning products into schools. The control and monitoring of insects and pests within our school buildings and grounds is an ongoing task. Safeguarding the children and adults who utilize our school buildings and grounds is the District's primary objective. On January 12, 1995, the Hewlett-Woodmere Board of Education adopted policy #8115 establishing an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Program. The policy restricts the use of insecticide applications and requires that only authorized, trained and licensed individuals dispense pesticides on school property. All pesticide applications will adhere to IPM methods where the least amount of product is used. Written authorization by the Director of School Facilities/Operations & Safety is required prior to any action taken. Posting of the affected area and notification to the building occupants is required. **Under no circumstances is a District employee, school volunteer or person/organization utilizing District facilities authorized to possess and/or dispense on school grounds or within a school building any type of insecticide/pesticide product.** If you have questions or concerns regarding IPM activities, please contact the Facilities Office at 792-4805.

Any student, parent or staff member may register to receive written notification 48 hours prior to a regulated pesticide application. Individuals may request that their name be added to the school registry at any time during the school year. All interested parties should contact the District's Pesticide Representative at 792-4805, Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM-4:00 PM.

Asbestos Compliance

The District's regular maintenance of the schools includes asbestos inspection in all facilities. In compliance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), we undertake the following: reinspect all buildings and spaces every three years for all asbestos-containing building materials; sample previously untested building materials suspected of containing asbestos; update our asbestos management plan. Several members of the District's custodial and maintenance staff are trained and certified in the handling and removal of asbestos-containing materials. Their training is updated on a regular basis. The reinspection and updated management plans are available for review in the Main Office of each building and at the District Office.

Students and Personal Electronic Devices (Policy #5695)

Effective July 23, 2025, the Board of Education adopted Policy #5695, which prohibits the use of smartphones and internet-enabled devices during the entire school day for students in grades K-12, in accordance with Governor Hochul's mandate. The policy is designed to support a focused, distraction-free learning environment and safeguard student mental health and well-being. All devices must be turned off and stored properly: in backpacks for elementary students, in lockers for middle school students, and in backpacks or lockers for high school students—who may take devices off-campus during lunch but must store them immediately upon reentry. To maintain communication, parents and guardians may contact students by calling the school office (all levels), or by student email at the high school level. Exceptions to the policy are permitted only with written approval for documented medical needs or as part of an IEP or 504 Plan. Noncompliance may result in disciplinary action consistent with the District's Code of Conduct. Full policy details, including enforcement and reporting measures, are available on the District website.

Information for Parents

Student attendance is essential for successful learning. There are at least 180 days of instruction required for pupils each year.

The State recognizes legal absences or lateness to include the following:

- sickness
- death or serious illness in the immediate family
- required attendance at organized clinics
- meeting a religious obligation
- unsafe travel conditions
- school-approved music lessons
- required appearance in court
- required health treatment
- quarantine

Students must make up the work they miss during absences. Upon returning to school, the child must bring a note from the parent explaining the cause of the absence. Should the absence be lengthy, home instruction will be provided upon application by the parent to the Office of the Assistant Superintendent for Special Education and Student Support Services. Homework assignments should be requested from the school by parents after two consecutive days of absence. Parents are requested not to withdraw students from school for family trips or extended vacations, as the absence is unexcused and the students will not be permitted to seek assignments from their teachers in advance of their absence. Illegal absences are reported on assessment cards.

Parents are also requested to schedule dental, medical or other personal appointments for children after regular school hours whenever possible. Signing students out of school earlier than the dismissal time should be discouraged since it interferes with the instructional program.

Reporting to Parents

The schools will send parents a calendar listing the dates of reporting periods. The reports are designed to keep parents informed of student progress and to assist the school, home, and child in working together toward continued improvement. Parents may discuss grades with the teacher and/or guidance counselor whenever necessary. Parents who wish to review their child's progress or school records are invited to telephone the school for a personal appointment. Staff will be available on the day that final reports are issued to discuss any questions or concerns about final grades or final examination grade. School conference dates are listed on the calendar.

Working Papers

Children between the ages of 14 and 17 are required to have working papers for after school or summer employment. Working paper applications may be obtained from the Nurse's Office (792-4110) in the George W. Hewlett High School, as well as in the Woodmere Middle School office (792-4310) during any school day.

Title I School Information

Parents of children attending Title I schools are entitled to know that their children are being taught by a highly qualified teacher or teacher assistant with New York State certification. Any parents with questions regarding teacher certification should contact the Office of the Assistant Superintendent for Business.

Health Services

Our School District is staffed by Professional Registered Nurses who hold current CPR/AED certification for the professional rescuer. They promote and maintain a healthy environment for all of our students and staff. The School Nurse handles all medical emergencies in their assigned building and grounds. The nurses perform mandated yearly screenings, maintain immunization and health records, and are in complete compliance with the New York State Department of Education health laws and procedures. In the event a student or staff member needs emergency services, the School Nurse will coordinate and initiate the EMS procedures and protocols.

Emergency Contact Information – Parents/Guardians are expected to complete and update the Emergency Information Form and promptly return it to their child’s school. This information will remain confidential and will only be used if an emergency occurs involving their child. In the event that a child has an accident or becomes ill while at school, the parent or parental designee listed on the form will be contacted. The parent or parental designee should be available to take the child home, if necessary. Forms can be obtained from school main offices.

Medication Dispensing and Delivery Procedures – the School Nurse is only permitted by law to administer medications according to certain procedures. These include prescription medications, herbal supplements, and all over the counter medications. All medications must be delivered to the nurse by the parent/guardian and picked up at the end of the school year in the same manner. Forms can be obtained from your School Nurse.

- The School Nurse must have on file a written request form from the prescribing physician indicating the frequency, dosage and route of prescribed medication.
- The nurse must have on file a written request from the parent/guardian to administer the medication as ordered by the prescribing physician.
- The medication must be delivered directly to the School Nurse by the parent/guardian.
- All medication must be in its original pharmacy container with the prescription label intact.
- A 2nd labeled bottle (empty) is now required to be sent in. This enables your child to receive his or her dose of medication on a field trip.

Mandated Health and Immunization Procedures – New York State Law requires a complete physical examination with updated immunizations. The mandated physical examination must be within the current school year for the grades indicated below, and presented within the first 30 days of your child’s first day of school. It must be signed and completed by a licensed physician, physician assistant or nurse-practitioner who is authorized to practice in the State of New York. A dental health certificate is requested but not mandated at this time. This applies to the following: New District Entrants/Re-entering students, All Pre-K, Kindergarten, First grade, Third grade, Fifth grade, Seventh grade, Ninth grade and Eleventh grade.

Please refer to Education Law Section 903 regarding health certificates.

Hewlett-Woodmere Crisis Intervention Team

The District Crisis Intervention Team is comprised of professionals from all of our buildings and representatives from the community who would be called upon to tend to the psychological and emotional needs of our students in the event of a District-wide crisis. They are prepared to meet and render aid at a single building, or at all of the buildings of our District, if necessary. If you are in receipt of information that might qualify as a building-wide or District-wide crisis, you are encouraged to call the Team’s Coordinator at 792-4804.

Emergency Drills

At least once every school year, a test will be conducted in each building of its Emergency Plan in cooperation with Local Emergency Management Officials when possible. Transportation and communication procedures will be included in the test. Parents or guardians will be notified in writing at least one week prior to such a drill. **All students and staff receive written information about the school’s procedures each school year.**

Assessment and Evaluation of Student Performance

The District employs various standardized tests to evaluate students’ cognitive abilities and academic achievements. These assessments allow educators to compare a student’s performance with peers of similar age and grade, both locally and nationally.

In the Hewlett-Woodmere School District, multiple standardized tests are administered throughout the academic year. These include both achievement tests and cognitive assessments. Parents will be notified of their child’s results for all administered tests. Each school will provide a schedule of standardized test dates for the 2025-2026 academic year.

Committee on Special Education/Committee on Preschool Special Education

The Committee on Special Education (CSE) and the Committee on Preschool Special Education (CPSE) are responsible for making recommendations to the Board of Education as to how to best meet the educational needs of students with disabilities. All members of the CSE and CPSE are appointed by the Board of Education. Any parent who believes his or her child is in need of special educational services because of a disability may request an evaluation by the Committee on Special Education (CSE) or the Committee on Preschool Special Education (CPSE). If you have any questions about Special Education or CPSE, please contact the psychologist at your child’s school building or the Assistant Superintendent for Special Education and Student Support Services at 792-4804.

Homebound Instruction

Homebound Instruction is provided for public and non-public school resident students who are out of school for more than 10 days due to illness, accident, or because of physical or emotional handicaps with physician verification of the child’s condition. Parents can obtain an application form from the Office of the Assistant Superintendent for Special Education & Student Support Services or the Counseling Office (middle and high school) or the building principal’s office (elementary) and file it with the public school their child attends, or would attend if enrolled in the public schools. The application will be reviewed by the building principal and Assistant Superintendent for Special Education & Student Support Services for approval. Upon approval, instruction will commence as soon as possible. Homebound instruction is also provided to students unable to attend school due to suspension. For questions about homebound instruction, call the Office of the Assistant Superintendent for Special Education & Student Support Services at 792-4804.

Committees on 504

The Committees on 504 are responsible for providing accommodation plans for students who qualify for support under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. Contact the building assistant principal in your child’s school or call the Office of the Assistant Superintendent for Special Education & Student Support Services at 792-4804.

Transportation Services

Questions related to transportation should be directed to the Transportation Office at 792-4814. Under a Board of Education policy specifically approved by Hewlett-Woodmere voters, transportation is provided on a more liberal basis than that required by State law which sets a two-mile limit for elementary school children and a three-mile limit for secondary school children. In our District, children receive transportation according to the following:

Grade Level Minimum Distance From School

Grades K-3.....1/2 mile Grades 4-5.....3/4 mile Grades 6-8.....1 mile Grades 9-12.....1 1/2 miles

For resident students attending private or parochial schools, transportation will be furnished to approved schools in accordance with the minimum distance noted above and up to a distance not exceeding 15 miles. Classified handicapped children may apply for transportation up to a 50-mile radius from home to school.

The Hewlett-Woodmere School District requests that residents report any problems concerning school buses to the Transportation Office at 792-4814. Needed information includes:

1. **Bus Number**
2. **Bus Company**
3. **Time**
4. **Location**

Transportation will not be provided to public or non-public schools on the following days:

Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Friday after Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Presidents Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Juneteenth, and Saturdays or Sundays. No transportation will be provided for the above listed holidays on the Federally observed day.

Non-public school transportation requests are due by April 1, 2026

In keeping with Education Law 3635, all requests for transportation to private and parochial schools must be in by April 1, 2026, for the 2026-2027 school year. Families moving into the District after April 1, 2026, are given 30 days after moving into the District to submit such a request. Transportation will not be provided for children who are less than five years of age by December 1 for the school year in which they will be enrolled. All requests for transportation should be addressed to the Transportation Office, One Johnson Place, Woodmere, New York 11598.

Cafeteria Services

Each of the schools within the District has a cafeteria that now offers nutritious breakfasts and lunches at no cost. This implementation is a result of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) expanding access to the federal Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). Students who bring their own lunch may purchase milk, juice, fruit, vegetables and a variety of nutritious snacks and beverages. Subject to agreed upon conditions, high school students have the option of eating in or out of school. Middle school students are required to eat lunch in school. Any questions about the school lunch or breakfast programs, please call Michelle Rosenthal, School Food Service Director, at 792-4018.

Hewlett-Woodmere Early Childhood Programs

The Franklin Early Childhood Center offers a variety of programs and services to Pre-Kindergarten, kindergarten, and first grade children.

Free Pre-Kindergarten is available to all District children who will be four on or before December 1st. The District participates in the NYS funded Pre-Kindergarten program.

Full-day Kindergarten classes are provided for all District children who will be five on or before December 1st. They provide learning experiences in all areas of the curriculum to promote each child's physical, social/emotional, and intellectual development. 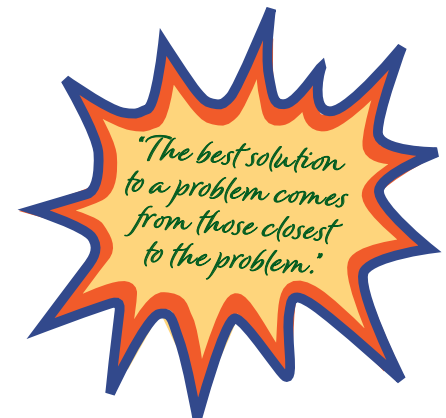
