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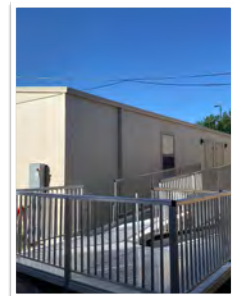
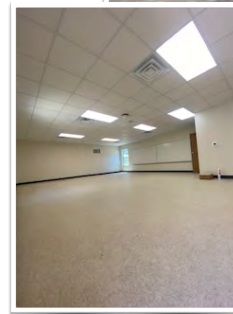

BOND & CONSTRUCTION

BARTON CREEK ELEMENTARY:

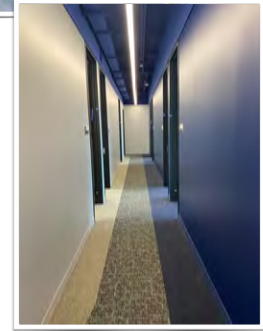
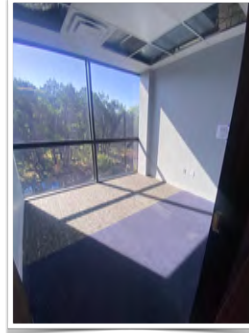
- Staff restrooms added to the 100 & 300 hallways
- Placed two learning studios for expanded enrollment
- Modified front office to accommodate staff needs
- Expanded cafeteria serving lines
- Added three learning studios to house Child Development Center (CDC)
- Modified and updated Blue Jay Hollow to accommodate CDC needs
- Installed plumbing, technology and electrical



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CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION (401 CAMP CRAFT):

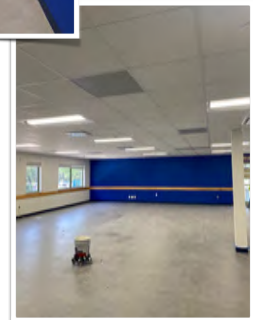
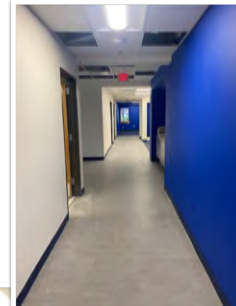
- Renovated facility to accommodate CA staff
- Installed new HVAC, electrical and technology
- Includes new board room, office and meeting spaces
- Updated to meet ADA compliance standards (parking, elevator & sidewalks)
- Staff overflow parking at WHS stadium with connecting sidewalks to front entrance



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THE LEARNING CENTER (TLC) (601 CAMP CRAFT):

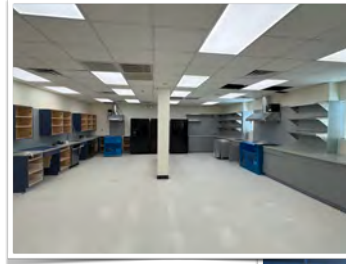
- Remodeled to accommodate TLC staff and students
- Subject-specific rooms (science and art lab) were added to improve the student experience
- Expanded the number of classrooms from five to eight
- Addition of a common area, conference rooms and collaboration spaces
- The square footage has increased from approximately 4,000 square feet to 13,000 square feet
- Added 70 spaces to WHS parking inventory



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ADULT TRANSITION SERVICES CENTER (ATS):

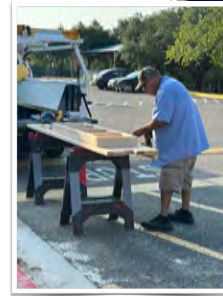
- Partial facility renovation
- Remodel includes mock apartment for instructional purposes
- Kitchen expanded to include multiple appliances allowing students to have a variety of culinary opportunities
- Modified restrooms to better meet the needs of the students
- Addition of entryway lockers in welcome area



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Funded through Bond 2023, the district successfully completed the following summer projects:

- Updated security cameras, access control & prop alarms at four campuses
- Replaced turf on practice field 3 at WHS
- Replaced chillers in Ninth Grade Center
- Resurfaced playgrounds at EE & BPE
- Updated elevators at stadium and WHS
- Replaced basketball goals at HCMS & WRMS
- Repaired parking lot at HCMS
- Updated lightning prediction systems on all campuses



TECHNOLOGY SERVICES

DEVICES & HARDWARE:

Funded through Bond 2023, the district successfully completed the following summer projects:

- Replaced 850 staff laptops
- Updated middle school computer labs
- Installing new computers in front office of each campus
- Prepared 600 iPads for incoming Kindergarten and new students
- Replaced 80+ copy machines districtwide
- Programmed 1000+ desk phones to comply with federal requirements



TECHNOLOGY SERVICES

INFRASTRUCTURE:

- Setup initial instance of Canvas (learning management system) for customizations, requirements and integrations
- Migrating the district's phone system to cloud instance
- Completed installation of redundant critical systems at a the district's disaster recovery site
- Completed security updates and testing on critical systems and notification applications
- Partnered with Facilities and Operations team on all construction projects



TECHNOLOGY SERVICES

PROJECTS & IMPLEMENTATIONS: STUDENT BADGES

- Students in grades 6-12 will be assigned an ID badge
- Guidelines were created and published
- Vendor is printing first set of badges
- Hardware has been installed at each campus
- Campus staff have received training on the systems
- Distribution process and dates on each campus have been identified
- Communications to students and guardians sent Aug. 1
