3319.326 requires the below:

(G) Not later than the first day of August of each school year, each school district shall provide parents and students **direct and timely notice, by mail, electronic mail, or other direct form of communication**, of any curriculum, testing, or assessment technology provider contract affecting a student's education records. The notice shall do all of the following:

- (1) Identify each curriculum, testing, or assessment technology provider with access to education records;
- (2) Identify the education records affected by the curriculum, testing, or assessment technology provider contract;
- (3) Include information about the contract inspection and provide contact information for a school department to which a parent or student may direct questions or concerns regarding any program or activity that allows a curriculum, testing, or assessment technology provider access to a student's education records.

So, the question is: *what is a "direct form of communication"*? I think the safest bet is something that can be sent to parents and students, like mail or email. However, some clients are saying that they are just putting a notice on their website. I think that's a little risky but it's hard to say because this is the first year that this requirement is in place.
