- Create National History Day projects in preparation for the Competition at ECU in the Spring







- Club Cap: 21




Spanish Club: ???




Mock Trial - Mr. Perdue

- Club Cap is 20




Digital Photography Club-Mrs. Hobbs

Strategy & Tactics - Mr. Perdue


- Through role-playing, students will work on critical thinking and problem solving skills while also flexing their creativity and tactical prowess.
