




ALL bus riders MUST have a badge with a picture or they will NOT be allowed to ride the bus

Do not open an exterior door, even if it is a student or teacher



#### Badges

All students must wear their badge with the school issued lanyard around their neck at all times

#### Temporary Badges

- Students must get a temporary when entering the building
- All students must get a temporary prior to 3<sup>rd</sup> period if lost
- Teachers will request a badge and it will be delivered to you
- NO BADGE = NO BUS

# Clear Backpacks

- All students must bring a clear backpack to school
- All athletic bags/instruments must be put away before school
- No Mesh or Frosted Bags
- Students are allowed (1) nonclear bag that is 9x6x5

# Bullying is...



- Bullying is a single act or pattern of acts by one or more students
- Bullying behavior displays an imbalance of power that is written, verbal, electronic or physical
- Bullying is threatening or abusive to the educational environment and possibly causes fear, physical harm and/or property damage

# Bullying is not...



- You and another student calling each other names (No imbalance of power)
- Another student not wanting to be your friend anymore
- Someone not liking your clothes or haircut
- Being in an argument with others
- Exchanging roasts roasting
- Some actions and works are just mean The are still wrong even though they are not bullying.

# How to Report Bullying / Cyber-Bullying



- Tell a trusted adult Teacher, Counselor, Assistant Principal, Coach, etc.
- Come write an incident report in the AP or Counselor office
- Use the CFISD Tipline
  - Anonymous can be done from a computer or phone

# Study Hall




- 4:05 to 5:05

- Must have a ride home before the event ends







#### What if I Miss School?


- Bring a note from home signed by an adult for why you missed a day of school
- Excessive Absences (Miss more than 10%)
  - Law states you must attend school
  - If you miss too many days of school your will need to make up time to regain credit (Tutorials or DHall)
- An Administrator or member of the attendance committee may visit your home if you fail to attend.

  - Consequences will be assigned starting Monday, August 25th.






# Technology





## Chromebooks

- Technology is for instructional purposes only on campus
- Bring you <u>charged</u> laptop everyday
- NO technology should be used in the hallways, bathrooms, locker rooms or cafeteria – it should be closed and put away
- If you damage / break your device you will be charged (LTE Central)



## TAKING CARE OF YOUR CHROMEBOOK

#### General

- You are responsible for the care of the Chromebooks.
- Chromebooks should never be taken to an outside computer service for repairs.
- Keep food and drinks away.
  - Insert cords, cables, and removable storage devices carefully.
  - Avoid exposing Chromebooks to extreme temperatures, such as leaving them in a car.
  - Keep Chromebooks free of writing, drawings, or stickers.


#### Carrying/Screen Care

- Always hold Chromebooks with care and never lift Chromebooks by the screen.
- Never carry Chromebooks with the screen open.
- Do not apply/add pressure to the top of a closed Chromebook.
- Before closing the lid, ensure nothing is on the keyboard(e.g., pens, pencils, notebooks, etc).
- Clean the screen only with a soft, dry microfiber or anti-static cloth.

#### Battery/Updates



- Charge your Chromebook regularly to ensure it is ready for use when needed.
- Avoid letting the battery drain completely.
- Unplug your Chromebook after it has reached 100%.
- Keep your Chromebook's software up to date by regularly bringing your device to school.
- Report any software issues by creating an LTEC ticket.
- Do not try to install unauthorized software or applications on the Chromebook.



## TAKING CARE OF YOUR CHROMEBOOK

Security

- Never share your Chromebook password or login information with others.
- Report any suspicious activity or security concerns to the school immediately.

Additional Information



- The Chromebook is CFISD property and issued to students for educational purposes.
- The Chromebook is for temporary use until graduation or withdrawal.
- If students leave the school they attend or CFISD, the device must be returned to the campus immediately or a fee will be assessed in School Cash.



### Chromebooks

**DIGI SAFE**- monitors students computers and sends the information to CFISD

Students who search for things that could cause harm to themselves or others will be investigated.



# Electronic Devices

- All Electronic Devices must be <u>POWERED</u>
   OFF and put <u>in the Students backpack</u>
- Put away from the time your ENTER the building until the time you EXIT the building
- If it is seen, or out, it will be confiscated and consequences assigned
- Refusal to comply with confiscation will have additional consequences



All <u>Personal</u> electronic devices must remain **powered off** & **in the students backpack** from the time they enter the building, until exiting the building at dismissal





# Level III Wio-lations



- Repeated Level I & II violations
- Fighting

- Disrespect of school personnel or visitors (teacher, secretary, cafeteria worker, substitute, parent, etc.)

- Giving False information during an investigation
- Physical contact resulting in injury
- Failure to immediately report a harmful situation of object
- Participation or membership in an illegal organization; such as a click, gang cult, or any criminal group

- Horseplay
- "Play" fighting
- Slap-boxing
- Dunking
- Pushing/Shoving
- Slapping


WILL RESULT in a Behavior referral

A **FIGHT** is defined as physical conflict between two or more students

- A fight occurs when the student strikes back and actively engages in the altercation
- Fighting in the cafeteria will result in an additional consequence of removal from the cafeteria for at least <u>one</u> week.
- \*\* A summons may be issued for you & your parents to appear in court\*\*

## Conflict Resolution

- If you are upset Don't try to solve it yourself
- Talk to a trusted adult
- Avoid the situation and come to an administrative office
- Get help with Mediation



## Level III Violations



- Interfering with programs/operations, school authorities, or instruction
- Misusing over the counter medications
- Possessing objects or substances that could cause harm to others
- Any acts that are harmful to the health and safety, inhibit rights or are detrimental to school

- Stealing or possession of stolen property
- Using or making profane, obscene, indecent language or gestures
- Using or making racially/ethnically offensive remarks or gestures
- Possession/Use of nicotine vape or e-cigarettes
- Forgery/Gambling/Blackmail

# Level III Violations



- Threat to a student, employee or volunteer
- Using a recording device that invades the privacy of others without consent
- Vandalism or defacing district or personal property (including district devices)
- Harassment physical, verbal, written, digital or sexual

- Creating or possessing a hit list
- Bullying / Cyber-Bullying
- Misuses of district technology
- Failure to report
- Dating violence
- False Tip Line information

## Level IV Violations



- Violating tobacco/smoking policy (including but not limited to Vapes, E-Cigarettes, cartridges, matches, lighters, etc.)
  - Any student in possession, using, selling, giving or delivering a THC e-cigarette / vape on school premises or at any school event WILL be assigned a consequence at the district DAEP - ALC West
  - Any student in selling, giving or delivering an e-cigarette / vape on school premises or at any school event WILL be assigned a consequence at the district DAEP - ALC West
