GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Students are required to take 7 classes per semester.
- 28 credits are taken over 4 years.
- All science classes are designed and taught as laboratory classes.
- The academic year consists of two semesters (18 weeks each).
- All classes are college preparatory.
- Transcripts will only reflect classes completed at Charlotte Catholic. Transfer transcripts will not be added to the Charlotte Catholic transcript.

CURRICULUM AND RIGOR

Students may take a maximum of 1 honors class in 9th grade and 5 honors classes in 10th grade. 9th grade students may take a maximum of 3 advanced classes. Placement in all Charlotte Catholic core courses is determined by previous coursework and grades, standardized testing results, and teacher feedback.

Students are afforded the opportunity to enroll in AP classes starting in their junior year. Two (2) AP classes in the junior year and four (4) AP classes in the senior year is considered a most demanding course load.

*Students may enroll in additional AP classes above the 2 in junior year and 4 in senior year. Admission to AP courses is competitive and students must submit an application for each course. Placement in all AP courses is determined by previous coursework and grades, standardized testing results (PSAT), and teacher feedback.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS

- 2024-2025, 345 CCHS students in 11th-12th grade took 1064 AP exams in **23 subjects**
- 94%** of AP scores were **3** or above, and **72%** scored a **4** or **5**
- AP examinations are mandatory in each AP course

COLLEGE MATRICULATION CLASSES OF 2023-2025

In the past three years, CCHS graduates have matriculated to 169 different colleges and universities. In the Class of 2025, 95% of graduates planned to immediately pursue post secondary education. Of those, 81% of graduates enrolled in public universities, 19% of graduates enrolled in private universities, 38% elected to remain in North Carolina, and 2% will be attending 2-year institutions.

ATHLETICS

Since 2000, Charlotte Catholic has won 74 state championships and has been state runner-up 65 times. During that same time, Charlotte Catholic was named the recipient of 8 Wachovia/Wells Fargo Cups, recognizing the top athletic program, by division, in North Carolina. Charlotte Catholic is one of four parochial schools competing in the North Carolina High School Athletic Association. We currently participate in the Division 6A Southern Carolina Split 6A/7A Conference. 1000+ of our student-athletes have continued on to participate in the NCAA/NAIA/Junior College levels. Charlotte Catholic has received numerous awards for sportsmanship, academic achievement, and 100% community service participation, reflecting its holistic approach to student-athlete development.

FINE ARTS

All of our visual and performing arts classes have numerous opportunities to attend competitions, showcases, festivals, concerts and performances throughout the school year. The Fine Arts Department consistently excels and achieves awards and accolades in their respective disciplines by fostering the God given talents of our students. Our theatre, band, choral, and dance programs all produce multiple performances each year in our state-of-the-art Fine Arts Center, dedicated in 2022. The band and choral programs are active performers nationally, having performed in New York and Chicago. The Charlotte Catholic band performs quadrennially in the St. Patrick's Day Parade in Dublin, Ireland.

ST. AUGUSTINE SCHOLAR PROGRAM

The St. Augustine Scholars Program (SASP) is a new program starting in the 2025-2026 school year, with a 9th-grade cohort. The program is focused on faith, great books, beauty, and holiness. SASP is an academically rigorous, four-year pathway that will further immerse students in the Catholic intellectual and spiritual tradition through a classical course of study that is enhanced by the Catholic liberal arts. The program offers an immersive experience that combines academics with formative experiences outside of the classroom. Students will explore philosophy, logic, and Latin, primary classical texts, participate in Socratic seminars and dive deeper into our Catholic intellectual tradition.
