

The 3rd grade team will work with students and their families to support success and achievement in all academic areas.

- Provide students with journal and daily writing activities in all content areas using the Houghton Mifflin Harcourt writing program showcasing student writing.
- Utilize research-based programs such as Study Island, IXL and Reflex Math. Links to these websites are on the South Hart home-page.
- Provide families with math activities, which allow students to use the math skills and concepts (e.g., adding and subtracting three and four digit numbers with regrouping, multiplication) being taught in the classroom.
- Offer three parent and family engagement opportunities with a concentration in all subject areas.

- Ask your child to share his/her writings with you after completing the writing units and classroom celebrations.
- Provide opportunities for your child to practice skills on research-based websites (e.g., Study Island, IXL, Reflex Math). Links to these websites are on the South Hart home-page.
- Work with your child on activities that strengthen their math skills (e.g., adding and subtracting three and four digit numbers with regrouping, multiplication).
- Attend three parent and family engagement opportunities throughout the school year.

South Hart 3rd Grade Students

The following ideas make connections between learning at home and school:

- Complete Accelerated Reader Assessments with at least 80% or higher accuracy (while reading 45-60 minutes weekly).
- Share my completed writing assignments with my parents after completing units.
- Regularly participating in skills assigned on research-based websites (e.g., Study Island, IXL, Reflex Math).
- Complete math assignments that require addition and subtraction with three and four digits numbers, and multiplication.
- Bring home notices about parent and family engagement opportunities.
