SCHOOL OVERVIEW

Located in the scenic village of Hastings-on-Hudson, just ten miles north of New York City in Westchester County, Hastings High School is a four-year public secondary school serving approximately 525 students grades 9-12. The school combines a rigorous academic environment with a close-knit, supportive community. With an average class size of 20, students benefit from individualized attention while enjoying access to a broad and challenging curriculum.

Recognized nationally as a *Secondary School of Excellence* and previously a *Blue Ribbon School* by the U.S. Department of Education, Hastings High School is accredited by both the New York State Board of Regents and the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

The school offers a comprehensive academic program featuring Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors (H) courses, along with college-level opportunities through partnerships with the University at Albany (SUNY Albany), Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT), and Syracuse University (SUPA). These programs allow students to earn college credits while completing coursework during high school.

More than 75% of students participate in extracurricular activities, including athletics, music, visual arts, and clubs. Many students are recognized as All-County musicians and athletes and regularly receive accolades for their artistic achievements. Hastings High School is proud to be a school that is “large enough to offer a rich and varied curriculum, and small enough to know and care about each student.”

PROGRAMS AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR DISTINCTION

- 17 Advanced Placement courses and 8 Honors courses.
- 9 dual enrollment/college-level classes: University at Albany, Rochester Institute of Technology, and Syracuse University Project Advance (SUPA).
- College-accredited, 3-year Science Research Program (classes of 2026 & 2027 participate in a 2-year sequence of science research).
- 5-year sequential programs in Spanish and French, and a 4-year sequential program in Latin.
- Comprehensive music program, including band, orchestra, chorus, Madrigals (select choir), and jazz band.
- Award-winning drama and musical theater programs.
- Peer Leadership – A full-year, highly selective course for senior students who display strong character, integrity, and leadership qualities. Peer Leaders attend class sessions to acquire leadership skills and lead small-group lessons for freshmen. The program supports all freshmen in transitioning successfully to high school.
- National Honor Society, National Art Honor Society, National Music Honor Society, and National Language Honor Society.
- Voluntary Community Service Program – ½ credit for 60 hours, 1 credit for 120 hours.
- Broad-based athletics program.
- Extensive array of teacher- and student-led clubs.

Hastings High School teachers have been awarded the Siemens Science Award; Woodrow Wilson Fellowships; and Fullbright, National Endowment for the Humanities, and National Science Foundation Grants.

GRADING INFORMATION

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate from Hastings High School, students must complete a minimum of 22 credits and meet the New York State Regents diploma requirements. These include specific course distribution mandates across core academic areas. Students must successfully complete all required New York State Regents assessments. Most Hastings students go beyond the minimum requirements in both credits earned and course rigor.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE and RANKING

Hastings High School calculates grade point averages on a 100-point numerical scale. To reflect course rigor, an additional two points are awarded for all Advanced Placement (AP), Syracuse University Project Advance (SUPA), Honors (H), Science Research, and Project Lead the Way (PLTW) courses. These weighted values are incorporated into each student's overall cumulative GPA. Courses completed in middle school that appear on the high school transcript are included in the GPA calculation, with applicable weighting applied. Hastings High School does not report class rank. In response to the global COVID-19 pandemic, and in accordance with New York State Education Department guidance, Regents examinations that were waived appear as exemptions, denoted with an "E" on student transcripts. The school acknowledges that the pandemic may have impacted academic performance during this period.

HASTINGS ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL PROGRAM (HASP)

The Hastings Alternative School Program (HASP) is a voluntary alternative "school within a school" at Hastings High School. It seeks to provide an enriched education for every student in a family atmosphere with an emphasis on learning and success. HASP offers English and Social Studies classes across all four grade levels in addition to one Science and one Math class. Fundamental to the program are its cornerstones, which include the student court, field trips, an accountability point system, a mentoring program, small class sizes (fewer than 10 students per class), and bi-monthly community meetings.

COURSE ENROLLMENT

Hastings High School follows an open enrollment policy, allowing all students to choose honors and Advanced Placement (AP) courses without restrictions on the number they may take in a given year. In accordance with the district’s curriculum progression, students typically do not enroll in Advanced Placement (AP) courses before their junior year. This approach reflects our commitment to fostering deep, foundational learning in the early high school years, and to support student well-being by helping to manage academic stress.
