What does SAC do?

Colorado Law requires that each school have a SAC. The SAC represents the point of view of the school community and works with the school principal on budget priorities, preparing school-wide goals, monitoring student progress, and increasing parent engagement with their children's education.

Who can be part of SAC?

Parents, guardians, teachers, and community members can all be part of the SAC.



Why does SAC matter?
