General Information

Founded in 1682, Radnor Township is located 13 miles west of Philadelphia, PA and has a population of approximately 32,000 as of 2018. Radnor Township School District is Radnor Township's only **public school system**, covering nearly 14 square miles, and has been recognized as one of the finest school districts in the state and nation. RTSD is home to Radnor High School, Radnor Middle School, and three elementary schools (Ithan, Radnor, and Wayne).

RHS operates on a modified block schedule. This allows for classes to meet for 40 minutes three days per week and 80 minutes once per week. Beginning in the 2019-20 school year, RHS was the first school in the county to institute a delayed school start time to support adolescent sleep and health. The new school day runs from 8:30 AM to 3:10 PM.

Class of 2025 Post-Secondary Plans

The class of 2025 is attending 126 different post-secondary institutions in 30 states and three countries. Approximately 91% of the class is attending a 4 - year school; 4% is attending community college or a trade school; and 5% is enrolling in the military, seeking employment or participating in a gap year. In May 2025, 501 RHS students took 1,178 AP exams. Over 90% of Radnor students scored a 3 or higher.

Students are able to take AP courses beginning in tenth grade. Enrolling in an AP course requires a teacher recommendation. RHS does not cap the number of AP courses a student can take in any given school year.

RHS policy states that all students enrolled in an AP course must pay for the AP exam in October and take the AP exam in May. If the exam is not taken, the AP designation is removed from the student's transcript and the course is renamed as an Honors course.

RHS uses a weighted GPA system. Courses designated as **Seminar, AP, Integrated, and Honors** receive **weighted (W) quality points**. **Advanced** and **College Prep (CP)** classes receive **unweighted (UW) quality points**. The GPA is cumulative, including all courses taken at RHS, and is updated at the culmination of classes annually. Both Weighted and Unweighted GPAs are reported on transcripts. The Unweighted GPA does not account for instructional levels. RHS does not include courses taken at other institutions in the cumulative GPA.

Academic Programming

- **Annual Scheduling & Graduation Requirements** Students are required to carry a minimum of 6.5 credits each school year. Our schedule allows for a maximum of 8 credits each year. Students must meet a minimum of 22.5 credits to graduate in designated content areas. **RHS does not have a World Language graduation requirement.**
- **World Language** classes are offered at both the Advanced levels (1 - 5) and Honors level (2 - 5). The Honors sequence culminates in either AP Spanish, AP French, AP Latin or AP German.
- **Consolidation of Academic Levels** The goal of consolidating the College Prep and Advanced level began in 2021-2022. This process started with the consolidation of our English and Social Studies courses in 9th grade in Fall 2021 followed by Math and Science for 9th grade in Fall 2022.
- **Integrated Curriculum** These interdisciplinary courses are co-taught by both an English and Social Studies teacher, and are considered to be among the highest level courses in these disciplines. In these seminar-style classes, students engage in high-level critical thinking, hone their writing skills and participate in robust class discussions.
- **Independent Study (IS)** Students in 11th and 12th grade taking at least 6.5 credits may work with a faculty member to participate in an Independent Study. Independent Studies are denoted with an "IS" on the transcript and can be one semester (0.5 credit) or full year (1 credit).
- **Dual Enrollment** Radnor currently offers the following dual enrollment classes/programs: Linear Algebra H (University of Pittsburgh) and Teacher Education Program (Delaware County Community College).
- **FlexMod (FM)/FlexCyber** Classes denoted as "FM" on a transcript are structured with both in-person and asynchronous classes, as designed by each teacher. FlexCyber courses offer even more flexibility in modality.
- **Technical School** Radnor students interested in technical programs can attend classes at either Delaware County Technical School (DCTS) or Technical College High School (TCHS) beginning in 10th grade. Participating students earn 3 credits, noted as "VoTech" on their transcript.
- **Medical Careers** High achieving twelfth graders interested in medical professions have the opportunity to participate in Medical Careers through DCTS, spending their mornings at a local hospital. Interested students go through a rigorous application process, competing with applicants across the county. Students earn two honors level credits.
- **Project Lead the Way (PLTW)** exposes students to STEM fields through project-based learning. RHS currently offers PLTW courses in Engineering, Computer Science and Biomedical Science. Students completing PLTW Engineering courses are also eligible for college credit through Rochester Institute of Technology.
- **Radnor Cyber Academy (RCA)** RTSD partners with Brandywine Virtual Academy (BVA) and Edmentum (beginning in the 2025-26 school year) to provide online courses. Students can take some or all of their classes online. Online courses are denoted on the transcript with "RCA."
